Transcript I

The following previously unpubished transcripts and commentary demonstrates Milton H. Erickson's combination of hypnotic and psychotherapeutic techniques. The transcripts illustrate Erickson's exquisite and systematic use of language patterns as well as the refined way these lower level patterns are grouped in order to effectively access and utilize the client's own resources in trance induction and utilization. These technical skills make his work powerful, effective, and subtle. It is useful to remember that Erickson is acutely sensitive to non-verbal communication, and is adroit in his use of such communication.

Monde is 32 years old, married and the mother of three children. She has had three therapy sessions with Erickson during the six months preceding, and proved to be an excellent hypnotic subject, demonstrating her ability to carry out deep trance phenomena. Her major concern was her insecurity about herself as

a person, wife, and mother.

Nick is 20 years old and single, he has had no previous experience with hypnosis or psychotherapy. His only experience with Erickson occurred the day before the session presented here, in a social setting. Nick volunteered as a demonstration subject. Erickson's work with Nick is as systematic as his work with Monde.

The following transcripts contain three levels of patterning:

1. Verbal patterns outlined in Volume I of Patterns of Hypnotic Techniques of Milton H. Erickson, M.D., by Richard Bandler and John Grinder.

2. Second level patterns of accessing and utilizing the client's own past experiences, the 4-tuples which contain the resources each of the clients needs to make the changes he desires. Essentially, this level of patterning is the grouping of the first level patterns into natural classes for the purposes of trance induction and utilization. For example, the first level patterns of deletion, causeeffect linguistic causal modeling, nominalization, conversational postulate, missing referential index...combine to form instructions for the client to employ the higher level patterns of transderivational search as an integral part of the hypnotic session.

3. Third level patterns of the sequences of the 4-tuples. One delightful result of applying the 4-tuple model to reach a deeper understanding of Erickson's work is that the two transcripts which appear and sound so different have a parallel (isomorphic) structure at this third level of patterning. This very powerful level of patterning therefore provides the hypnotist with an explicit overall formal strategy for organizing their hypnotic communication. This level of patterning will be discussed separately at the conclusion of the transcript and commentary on the first two level patterns.

The following is a discussion of the third level of patterning used by Erickson and describes the systematic way in which Erickson works to access and anchor the client's past 4-tuples, making available the resources needed. This discussion in no way exhausts what is present in Erickson's work, but is to be used to further aid the hypnotist/communicator in both understanding Erickson's work and organizing his or her own experience in hypnosis.

As was earlier stated, one of the single most important patterns for the agent of change (psychotherapeutic practitioner of hypnosis) is the understanding that each of us as human beings has past learnings and understandings that when organized in a directed fashion, provides the resources that a client needs to make the changes he desires.

It is Erickson's use and sequencing of these past 4-tuples that allows him to effect change in such a profound way. As the client makes meaning out of the hypnotist's communication, the client will, in the present, experience the learnings which provide those resources out of the sum total of the client's past 4-tuples. These experiences, (4-tuples) present and past, are then re-arranged in an effective way for the present and future. The understanding of the 4-tuple of primary experience, the transderivation search phenomena, anchoring and effective pacing (meeting the client at his model of the world) will increase the hypnotist's choices greatly in the context of altered states of communication. As Erickson himself states:

...in the therapeutic use of hypnosis, one primarily meets the patient's needs on the terms he himself proposes; and then one fixates the patient's attention, through adequate respect for and utilization of his method of presenting his problem, to his own inner processes of mental functioning. This is accomplished by casual but obviously earnest and sincere remarks, seemingly explanatory but intended solely to stimulate a wealth of the patient's own patterns of psychological functioning so that he meets his problems by use of his learnings already acquired or that he will develop as he continues his progress.

The preceding transcripts offer a unique opportunity for understanding not only the elegance of Milton Erickson's use of altered states, but they also constitute a complete tracking model

for trance induction and change.

At first the transcripts appear to be very different, Erickson's work with Monde is more specific. As in her case he has more verbal and analogical feedback to utilize and assist her in deep trance. Nick offers less in the way of verbal and analogic feedback, and correspondingly, Erickson's work is less specific. With Nick, Erickson utilizes more extensively the general verbal patterns of nominalization, unspecified verbs, missing referential index and deletion in his work.

- accessing (L operator) and anchoring of 4-tuples
- polarity pacing (temperature)
- visual kinesthetic disassociation
- metaphor/meta-instructions
- construction of new 4-tuple creation of a reference experience
- testing effectiveness of work

In both cases E begins by accessing (L-operator) a past trance 4-tuple,

as both Nick and Monde begin to access (L-operator) and represent (R-operator) those past 4-tuples, responding to Erickson's communication, they begin to re-experience (both R-operator and \sim R) portions of the past trance 4-tuyples (through transderivational search L-operator) phenomena. In other words, portions of the past trance 4-tuples are accessed (L-operator) and re-experienced (R-operator).

Erickson then instructs both clients to attend (R-operator) to the kinesthetic variable of the trance 4-tuple.

The second meta-pattern is polarity pacing. When pacing a client's ongoing experience, the hypnotist is often presented with inconsistent messages from the client (i.e. the C-operator is no) regarding the trance experience.

It is possible that Erickson was sensitive to mixed messages about the hypnotic experience on Nick's part. One way of effectively pacing in this situation is to pace both parts being presented. In this case the temperature polarity pace can effectively pace the part that desires the trance experience as well as the part that presents a message of resistance. The temperature polarity pace works through metaphor much the way that tagquestions ("you are comfortable, are you not?") pace more directly both messages being presented by the client.

Here we wish to remind the reader that Erickson's work is both subtle and complex. That is just to say that E is utilizing "cool comfort in a hot room" as a very sophisticated polarity pace overlooks other possible understandings. This attention to the kinesthetic variable, namely the 4-tuple = 'comfort' sets a precedent for the client, that he/she may extract the overall formal pattern of, "even though it's hot you can still be comfortable" = "when you are uncomfortable, you can have a choice of being comfortable." This particular pace of comfort-cool, uncomfortable-hot, is parallel in these transcripts with the problems which both clients present; that is, it has a direct application to the problem. Perhaps most importantly it utilizes a piece of the client's ongoing experiences as a continuous pace.

The third pattern to be extracted is that of disassociation and utilization of the disassociated states. This involves the hypnotist's ability to recognize that the variable of experience that the client normally uses for (client's R-Operator) conscious representation to find a point of overlap with the other variables of the 4-tuples which are represented outside of conscious (\backsim R). For example, Erickson instructs Monde to visualize (L-operator) her husband's experience with arm levitation, and then instructs her to generalize what those feelings would be like in her experience (representational system overlap); thereby eliciting arm levitation.

(27-28) In Monde's case Erickson uses the visual variable as lead to re-experiencing other portions of a 4-tuple. In each instance of re-vivication of a pleasant experience, Erickson has Monde, first visualize it, and then add the kinesthetic portion of the 4-tuple, the feelings attached to the pleasant 4-tuple. (81-89,

89-92). Erickson then suggests that Monde recall an unpleasant 4-tuple, again using a visual lead, however, he suggests that she maintain the kinesthetic variable of comfort. (97-101).

With Nick, however, Erickson utilizes Nick's R-system which is kinesthetic and leads him to a point of overlap, whereby he adds the visual portion of the 4-tuple. (43-48) When Erickson works with Nick, he is more general in his hypnotic communication; that is, he does not explicitly ask Nick to recall any particular 4-tuple, but suggests that he maintain the kinesthetic variable (comfort), and visualize any experiences he wishes while holding the K variable constant, maintain K (40-46) (49-50) (53-59).

Metaphor and meta-instruction are the fourth area to be considered. In both transcripts Erickson suggests, to the clients, a new understanding, a new way to experience the world. He does this by offering suggestions directly through metaphor, and through meta-instructions, or a way in which the client may utilize the trance learnings and past 4-tuples with more understanding. This precedent is established early with both clients

to ensure that the meta-instructions are accepted by the client and also to prove to the client that they do have a choice. It is important to demonstrate to the clients that they have the resources to create the choice they want — thus the need to establish a reference experience. The following is an example of the creation of a new reference experience.

Erickson consistently has Monde visualize a past pleasant 4-tuple and then add the kinesthetic variable. Then he instructs her to visualize an unpleasant 4-tuple and hold the kinesthetic variable (of the 1st 4-tuple) constant. Erickson then proves to Monde that she can have control by having her recall an unpleasant 4-tuple using a visual lead, adding the appropriate unpleasant 4-tuple, then to replace the unpleasant kinesthetic sensations with pleasant kinesthetic sensations which have previously been anchored to a piece of Monde's behavior (eye blink). This serves as a reference experience which Monde can utilize at another time.

When Erickson works directly with Nick, he uses a piece of Nick's behavior (breathing) as an illustration and reference experience of how Nick can exercise control over his behavior. As Erickson states, this is something that Nick could notice (namely the absence of loud breathing on Nick's part). Thus the establishing of a reference 4-tuple allows the client a 4-tuple from which they may generalize, and it gives the hypnotist a way in which he/she may check the effectiveness of their work with the client. That is to say that by giving the client a reference 4-tuple which utilizes portions of their own behavior, (eye blink, loud breathing) the hypnotist can literally anchor the client control (consciously or unconsciously) over the new choice. In both cases Erickson does just this. Erickson suggests that Monde practice the self-anchor ("blinking her eyes") to banish discomfort.

The self-anchor of eye blinking, on one level ties the process to a portion of the client's (Monde) ongoing experience, on another level the opening and closing of her eyes to exercise a new choice of comfort may be a metaphor for beginning to really look at her problems.

With Nick, however, Erickson points out his ability to control his breathing as a reference structure rather early in the transcript, and suggests that he maintain his comfort while visualizing different 4-tuples. Finally, he asks Nick directly if he will utilize the new learnings and elicits a direct response from Nick. It is important to note here that Erickson offers suggestions for amnesia throughout both transcripts, thus it is important to understand the means by which only important and useful portions of the trance experience are brought into the conscious state; bridging the gap of experience. This can be understood by having the client exercise the new choice both in the altered state and the waking state. It is in this way that Erickson may check the effectiveness of his work, without forcing the new learnings into the consciousness of the client. Erickson does this by suggesting to Monde that she will experience discomfort (immobile hand, warmth) when she awakens from trance, then Erickson, by use of

a behavioral presupposition ("which hand has the longer life line?") allows her to exercise the new choice in controlling the discomfort.

In the preceding section we presented three levels of patterns, the linguistic patterns that constitute the basic foundations of Milton Erickson's use of language in hypnosis, the second level patterns which Erickson uses to achieve a desired level of trance and the desired outcome of suggested phenomenon, and third the level of patterning which illustrates the sequencing and manipulation of past experience (4-tuples), and the incorporation and utilization of the client's ongoing experience to build a reference structure to assist the client in attaining a new choice.
