

Mix the colours up!


Do you know how to make new colours?

Use other sides of the block for different colours.






















Funny feet!

Blob paint onto your paper. Carefully slide the paper into the bag.


Dip your feet in paint and make messy feet footprint art!

Use a pencil to turn the footprints into pictures.












Now take out the piece of paper and look at your masterpiece.

Masking tape



Non-toxic


paint



Canvas (or thick paper)

Fill more balloons with other colours.




Tie the balloon, then stick it onto your canvas or paper with tape.








Paper craft

Paper cutting




You can make some great paper effects with just a few snips here and there!



SNIP to make a FRINGE

Make little snips along one edge of some paper. Don't cut all the way to the other side.



Draw a spiral to help you cut it out.



CUT to make a SPIRAL

Draw eyes on the middle of your spiral to make it into a curly snake! Cut into the edge of a circle and keep cutting round and round working towards the middle.





Paper sculpture



Use your folding and cutting techniques to create a colourful paper sculpture.










Fan-tastic!

Tools needed:



onto black paper and cut it out.






Stained glass elephant

Felt-tip pen


Use the stencil from the front cover of the book to make your elephant.

Water spray bottle




Crepe paper cut into shapes



Sleepy cat




Draw a curved bean shape.

Singing bird




Draw a balloon shape.









Corrugated cardboard
