It would seem that a bridgehamber would be about the last place to look for children, and yet Jesus speaks familiarly of them as Heing there, and the other strange implication is that the bridegroom is there feeding them since they must fast when he goes away. This text ret vests our bridgeroom in much the same light as he was shown stymologically, viz., as a waiter or

feeder of children. Jesus is known to have had an especial foud. ness for little children, for he said, "Buffer them to come unto me for of such is the kingdom of heaven." Whose injured one of these little ones, "it were better that a millstone were hanged about his neck."

These little children are, indeed, the "heirs to the kingdom." Whoever finds the brideohamber, and discovers the bride and groom will not fail size to perceive these children.

FOURTH VIEW: "Then shall the kingdom of heaven be likened unto ten virgins which took their lamps and went forth to meet the bride-

I will not quote the entire parable. It is groom." found in Matthew, 25th chapter. Read it carefully, noting the following singular features in connection therewith:

1. That ten virgins should go to meet one

2. That a lamp filled with oil should be a bridegroom. mecessary preparation.

8. That all these virgins alept while he terried.

4. That he came at midnight unexpectedly. 5. That only the well filled and illuminated virgins were permitted to pass in.

This oil which produces light and becomes the passport to the feast is very significant.

It is the same kind of oil that Mary Magdalens brought to annoint the Sacior. It is the easns oil which "ran down upon Aaron's beard and went down to the skirts of his garment."

Apollonius discovered the nature of this oil and shows how it may be practically employed. He says: "Fire comforts every living creature, and if some priest, himself a pure man, purioin and use it, if he blend it with holy oil, connecrate it, and then annount some aching limb with it, the malady will be cared."

All kings were thus annointed. The Catho. line perpetuate the symbol in the Extreme Unc-

This "annointing" refers directly to a certain "haptism by fire" by which gold is purged of

Observe in the parable just cited that the wise virgins only filled and trimmed their lamps roady for lighting. It is presumed that the bridegroom furnished the fire by which they were ignited, else why all this preparation.

Figure view: After Jesus' first miracle; the changing of water to wine at the marriage in Camp, the governor of the feast called the bridegroom and said unto him, "Every man of the beginning doth set forth good wine; and when men have well drank, then that which is worse: but thou hast kept the good wine until now!

What does this mean? It means that this particular bridegroom at this feast held the scoret of elernal life. That it was concealed in wine which by alchemical processes was converted out of water. All men have such wine and set it out at the beginning, but they become drunken and then-bring out the bad wine, that fatal fluid which is physical death.

The moral is: Keep the wine good to the very last mament of the feast.

There is no mistaking the setual meaning of this symbol especially if we locate the "land of Cana."

John, it must be remembered, was the be loved disciple who leaned upon Christ's bosom.

He it is that announces the coming of the bridegroom. He baptizes with confer, but his follower baptizes with the Holy Ghost and with Fire. John is a water gate or passage. In He. brew the name is Yohanna allied to Sanscrit Your, and to Greek On. In the passage in Revelations (which is literally translated in the head text under ADIHAMLED), the word He is ON, "the mighty one."

Yet "the least in the kingdom is greater than be" because John is a physical embodiment outside of "the kingdom." All must pass through his haptism onto the kingdom, but he at last decreases, is thrown into prison and be, headed. Do not forget, however, if you can re-

The Catholics preserve the symbol but without the slightest knowledge of its meaning.

This is the "living bread which came down from heaven," and is the contribution of the bridegroom at every marriage feast. The reason it is not living bread is because men do not understand how to make it or to "gather it."

Moses said unto the children of Israel, "This is the bread which the Lord hath given you to eat. This is the thing which the Lord bath commanded, "Gather of it every man according to his eating * * * Let no man leave of it still the morning. Notwithstanding, they hearkened not unto Moses; but some of them left of it until the morning and it bred worms and stank: And Moses was wroth with them."

And well he might be. But this is precisely what people are doing today. This is the great transgression—the eating of leavened bread.

It may seem to my readers quite a digression to go from bridegroom to bread, but it is not, for the two are intimately connected.

The bridegroom is he who feeds "bread" to the starving children. The bride is she who gives birth to these children, and nurses, clothes and cares for them until they reach a mature de-

TONE VIBRATION.

In order to realize the greatest benefit possible from the study of breathing, it is necessary to use the breath as a means of tone supports.

Vibrations, when properly collected and few flected produce tone, while irregular vibrations; produce noise. To bring about this correct result, the breath used in voice production, were be supported and controlled by the diphragua A tone not thus supported, is dead, lacking in all power of expression. Only when the disphragua is under control and all action centered there, is it possible to gain reinforcement by sharing buoyant, volitional vibration.

No study is equal to this for acquiring that desired condition of "going in the Bilence," as it is a continual study of concentration and introspection. Everything here is on the mental plane. The product of the effort—voice—many be termed a spiritual emanation, for it is bast the expression of immaterial thought.

Here it is that the Mental Scientist many sconest learn the art of learning: To desire, to will, to think the thought, to pronounce this word, thus bringing desire into objective manifestation—creating an image of which the senses take cognisance.

Everyone is more or less out of harmony. It is the duty of Mental Science to bring all into harmony. A fact not generally, known is, that each person has a key tone, a fundamental with which he or she vibrates naturally and sympa-

he be thetically. This individual key tone is usually the monotone of the ordinary speaking roles. It is exactly the center of the natural vocal range, It is the Mese, or middle tone, of the Greeks which modern musicians recognize as the Dominant or ruling tone. Around this central tone all others play.

Count from 10 to 15 on this escaping teeth tone, and repeat on every tone of the

Ex 8. RHYTHMICAL. Stand erect. Step right foot forward as far as possible, and throw all the weight on this forward foot, balancing the body by lightly touching the floor with the toe of the backward extended left foot. You will notice that this throws the body well forward from the hips. Now extend both arms straight out in front, palms upward, just as far as you can. When you have assumed the correct position you will feel all stretched out from the hips and shoulders. Keep your position stendily, round the mouth as if to whistle and then inhale in four little puffs whispering "oo" on each one. Imagine here that you are drinking in four whispered or silent "oos" which you are then going to throw out in tone in the same manner. After inhaling the four, "oos" stop a moment, and then throw them out in four explosive "oo" tones, Thus, Inhale silently oc-oc-oc-oc, and sing out as hoc-hoc-hoc-hoc. Repeat on every tone of the voice.

Ex 4. FLEXIBILITY. The exercise in our last was for the knee, this one is for the hip. To know the part of the body most affected by an exercise, helps us in locating the central point of sensation.

Stand erect, hands on hips, weight on left foot with heel of right foot pointing toward instep of left. Throw the right foot out directly sidewise, vigorously and as far as possible, pointing the toe to the right and toward the floor; that is, when the limb is extended the toe should not be sticking up, but pointing down in a line with the limb. Keep both limbs perfeetly straight, swinging the limb from the hip. Then bring the foot back into position. Now take this exercise on 8 counts, one on each outward movement and one as the foot returns to position. This will make four complete movements. Then reverse to other foot. After taking each side separately, go through the 8 counts, swinging each foot alternately.
