


#### Beccafumi Series

This is early series of ten woodcuts by Domenico Beccafumi, also known as Meracino or Mecuccio. He was working in the early decades of the 16th century in Siena, and these woodcuts are thought to date to the period 1525-1540. They show a process in which the philosopher-alchemist and the laboratory worker-alchemist, begin by finding the seven metals, personified as Greek Gods lurking in the mountains, gathering these and leading them through a transformation process in the laboratory. These are amongst the earliest printed depictions of alchemical imagery.


# Donum Dei illustrations from Abraham Eleazar
























## Golden and Rosy Cross alchemical emblems



















## Freher Series


This series which D. A. Freher designed at the beginning of the 18th century, to illustrate the deep pirnciples of Jacob Boehme's philosophy, was included as full page engravings in the William Law edition of Boehme's works, published in 1764-81. These illustrations particularly deal with cosmology, and especially the emanation of the spirit and its encounter with matter initially through Adam and then through the intervention of Jesus Christ in spiritual evolution. I have tried to reflect this spiritual philosophy in the colouring scheme I have adopted.


