Denver Klavern Is On Mountain Peak Mountain Peak

Denver Klan, Realm of Colorado, a few days ago formally opened its splendid new Klavern building which is one of the most unique in the Invisible Empire.

Denver's Klavern is situated on the very top of Castle Mountain, a six thousand-foot peak which is owned by Denver Klan. It is located in grounds comprising three hundred acres which with the building are valued at over \$75,000.

At the dedication ceremonial six thousand Klansmen were present and took part in the naturalization of fifteen hundred aliens, one of the largest classes in the history of Colorado Klankraft. The Grand Dragon of Colorado officiated at the ceremonies at which a fiery cross 110 feet high was illuminated at the top of the peak, being visible for miles in all directions.

The Klans in Colorado are growing rapidly under the guidance of the Grand Dragon of that Realm. In Pueblo a few weeks ago two hundred aliens were naturalized into by the Klan that the resolution was the local Klan which is considered passed.

Mrs. Abbott Fighting To Secure Justice

Determined to see that justice shall be done to those she believes responsible for the murder of her husband, Klansman Thomas R. Abbott, Mrs. Emma Abbott of Atlasburg, Pennsylvania, has filed complaint alleging murder against Patrick McDermott, the Irish undertaker who was seen to fire his pistol at Klansmen as they were parading at Carnegie, Pa., on August 25, last.

Mrs. Abbott has bravely taken up the cause of the Klan and through particular case. McDermott, who had been free at his first hearing, was re-arrested, but, though the offense of murder in Pennsylvania is generally regarded as being non-bailable, he has been released by Judge Cohen on \$25,000 bond.

'In his commentaries on American law, Chancellor James Kent says: States or bodies politic are to be considered as moral persons, having a public will, capable and free to do right and wrong, inasmuch as they are collections of individuals, each of whom carries with him into the service of the community the same binding law of morality and religion which ought to control his conduct in private life.

Schools To Save The Country

"There are crises in the lives of nations as well as in the lives of individuals. Civilization is now passing through one of its greatest dynamic periods since its birth. Government by the people is being tested as never before. It is being clearly demonstrated that representative govern-ment protects the rights and liberties of its people only in proportion to their common understanding of its principles. The Citizenship Committee of the American Bar Association in its report for 1922, said that the common schools of the country will save the country. The significant fact in this statement is the implication that the country is already lost: lost as to adherence to the political ideals upon which it was founded.

"When we realize how far we have drifted from the political traditions and civic virtues of the founders of our Republic, and how little of their altruistic vision remains, we appreciate the danger in which we are involved. Trouble Fomented

'Many extremists-advocates of anarchy, apostles of absurdity, champions of chaos, devotees of debauchery, disciples of destruction, propagandists of plunder, purveyors of perfidy, worshipers of wassail-have sought shelter and asylum here for the sole purpose of fomenting trouble and revolutionizing the established order of things with no thought of harmonizing their actions and their ideals with ours. They vilify our ideals, condemn our customs, belittle our institutions, deride our history, revile our heroes, ridicule our noblest efforts, sneer at our culture, impugn our motives, scoff at our officials, denounce our system of government, defy our laws, fill our charitable institutions with their derelicts, and clog our courts with their multitude of delinquents.

'The most dangerous aliens are given absolute freedom of our country, to carry on, unimpeded, their propaganda - movements which strike at the very foundation of our government and aim to disintegrate regardless of race, color, or creed, the social fabric of the nation. Brothers, Presi- mism, but it must be conceded that aliens, representing approximately soo different organizations, societies and groups, are active in spreading their propaganda of discontent and defiance of law and order in the United States. Most of this propaganda is hostile to our government. our traditions, our ideals, our customs, our political philosophy, and our religion. There are over 600 radical publications in the United States, and tons of literature in the forms of circulars, hand bills, pamphlets, etc., are distributed, largely among the foreign element of our population. Leaders among them claim the support of more than 5,-000,000 of the 20,000,000 wage earners employed in about 15,000 industrial plants in the United States. As a result, many aliens are educated to oppose our government before they know anything whatever about its form or purposes. A few trial trips of the Leviathan, loaded on its outgoing voyage with those apostles and disciples of malcontent, might be utilized to great advantage. Our constitutional provision guaranteeing freedom of speech and freedom of press is not intended to protect aliens who seek only to destroy the government and supplant our social, industrial, and political institutions. They must be taught that they speak and write at their peril.

American Citizenship Cheapened

'Naturalization does not mean Americanization. We have cheapened American citizenship until it has become worthless. We have forced it upon the alien in our midst, almost without his consent and before he has any appreciation of its significance or responsibilities. We have placed our limitless natural resources and developed opportunities at the feet of all the peoples of the earth and have begged them to come and accord them the constitutional right take them. Such a situation does not prevail in any other civilized country. Continuing, Mr. Brothers said: "The continued assaults on our constitution and laws by agitators and

demagogues are the direct consequence of the introduction among us during the last generation of multitudes of aliens who know nothing of its origin, nothing of the sacrifices by which it was attained, nothing of the underlying philosophy of selfgovernment and less of the political philosophy which that constitution represents and exemplifies."

As an answer to all, or a great many of our problems and national decadence he concludes with a clear cut program that is to the point and remarkable for its scope and fearless pronouncement.

Schools Should Be Provided

"All persons, firms and corporations employing persons not educated in or who do not speak English should be required to provide approved schools for teaching the English language, the rudiments of an education therein and the history of our common country, including the origin and development of our constitution and our political liberty. No alien, not in the service of his government. should be allowed asylum in this country for a greater period than five years or less. Every immigrant 16 years of age and over should be required to pledge himself to take the nationality of his residence, either stitutional limitations and prosteps at the earliest opportunity to become an American citizen and to tax should be levied on all estate or make all preliminary preparation requisite to that high station. No party or witness who has been in this country for five years or more should be permitted to testify in any court in any language other than English, except by special permission of the court after satisfactory cause is shown and with the consent of all parties to the suit.

'Every candidate for naturalization should be required to take six months' training in citizenship in schools to be provided by the proper authorities and pass examination before being permitted to assume the final oath of allegiance, and the admission to citizenship should be attended with a form of a patriotic celebration akin to the commencement exercises of our colleges and universities.

possess, and not to use. He does not feel satisfied to be passively good. By becoming an active benefactor he presents his body a living sacrifice, believing it to be acceptable to God because it is his reasonable service to his fellow-men.

It is said of Him Who walked among us lowly mortals as the Son of God: He came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give His life a ransom for the many. He, therefore, Who is the Klansman's Exemplar, sets the example to all Klansmen. To minister, and not to be ministered unto, is the only worthy excuse for existence. We are the heirs of the ages. All that has gone before is ours, being poured into our laps from the cornucopia of the bounteous past. The years gone before are ours. The worthy men of these by-gone years, are ours. Their great and valient deeds are ours. Their principles and their ideals are ours. Such heritages, more valuable than crowns of gold, are handed down to us who are the sons of such worthy fathers. The memory of these great and noble men, these defenders of the faith, can best be kept green by our safeguarding the ideals and the principles which these forefathers bequeathed us. And how can this be done?

Too long, be it admitted, has the attention of the average American been diverted to material gain, to the over-looking of the spiritual. Thoughts, ideals, principles, these belong to the realm of the spiritual. They are not as wood or stone; as gold or silver. They cannot be weighed on the scales nor measured by tangible device. Wynn Tully, who was candidate for mayor of Paducah, Kentucky, and who took an active part in attempting to stop a speaker for the Ku Klux Klan, was badly beaten in his race for mayor although the rest of his ticket won out by handsome majorities. His opponent was the only candidate on the opposing ticket to be elected.

Johnsville Klan, Realm of Ken-tucky, naturalized a large class of candidates last week. Since the formation of the Klan in that place it has enjoyed a steady growth which has been materially helped by the acts of the organized opposition which the residents have resented.

The Klansmen won a most notable victory in the election at Michigan City, Indiana, last week when the ticket sponsored by them polled two-thirds of the entire vote for the four different tickets in the field. The victory was won in the face of a most bitter fight put up by the organized opposition which is fighting the Klan in every way possible in that city.

An all-day program for Thanksgiving Day has been arranged by the Portland Klan, Realm of Indiana, one of the features of which will be a naturalization of a great class of aliens. The meeting will be held at the county fair grounds. The Portland Klan is a very strong organization and has a very large membership.

A Fiery Cross, the burning of which was witnessed by at least ten thousand persons, was lighted at eight o'clock in the evening in a small park space immediately in front of the city hall in Detroit. How the cross was set up and lighted with none of the large theatre crowds seeing the persons, still remains a mystery. Detroit is forging ahead in Klandom at a rapid rate. Mt. Carmel, Ill., Klan **Growing Fast**

Following an address on Americanism and the principles of the Ku Klux Klan in Mt. Carmel, Ill, recently, hundreds are seeking admittance to the organization. The best citizens are becoming members and many ministers are among those who have become identified with the American organization.

Officials of the local organization have been hard put to take care of all the applicants and the sudden increased growth of the Klan is attributed to the knowledge of the true principles of the Klan which have been received by the residents of that community recently.

The increase in membership is really amazing, but it is only in keeping with that which is taking place throughout the entire state.

At Danville, Indiana, an entire list of candidates was elected who, it is understood, are favorable to the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The men elected were not on the same political ticket, the voters scratching in order to get men from each ticket who were strong in their opinion of America for Americans.

The ticket sponsored by Klansmen in Kalamazoo, Michigan, went to a sweeping victory at the election last week. One of the chief contributing causes of the sweeping victory of the Klan, it is believed, is the refusal of the use of the armory there a few weeks ago, when a Klan speaker was denied the use of the building.

On Tuesday night, October twentythird, Douglas, Arizona Provisional Klan invited Bisbee Klan No. 15 to Twin Buttes (two peaks between Douglas and Bisbee) where was held a joint naturalization and barbecue, a large class of aliens were naturalized by the Bisbee drill team. As the naturalization ceremonies were, being put on, a large Fiery Cross was lighted on one of the Buttes, after which came the barbecue of venison killed in the mountains near Douglas by a Douglas Klansman.

Taxes may be lower when the voters pay more attention to whom they hire, according to the Muncie Press. And these same voters might profitably hearken to the counsels of the Klan.

Gigantic Parade At Youngstown, Ohio

Youngstown, Ohio, saw one of the largest Klan parades ever held when Klansmen from Ohio, Pennsylvania and West Virginia gathered in that city on November tenth in a mammoth Klonklave. The crowd was estimated as between eighty and one hundred thousand. The parade was given after every attempt was made by the city officials to stop it. A court order, however, gave the Klan the right to parade and despite the fact that the chief of police is said to have given orders to shoot to kill should a parade be attempted, there was no disorder.

In addition to the parade there were speeches, a gorgeous display of fireworks and a ceremonial at which two thousand were naturalized.

Mayor W. G. Reece, who used every way possible to stop the parade, and whose attempts started prior to the election of a few days before, was hopelessly beaten in his attempt for re-election.

Fiery Cross Burned At Pocomoke, Md.

The Klansmen of the Maryland, Delaware and Virginia shore staged a great ceremony Thursday night, November fifteenth, at Pocomoke City.

Pocomoke Klan had raised a Fiery Cross on the fair grounds, thirty-five feet in height and at eight o'clock in the evening the parade of several hundred Klansmen led by a large band started and paraded the city, after the parade the cross was lighted and by its light Dr. Burke of Ocean City Klan, Realm of Maryland, delivered a very forceful address on the principles and purposes of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan to several thousand people who received it with great enthusiasm. He was applauded to the echo.

Klansman Frank Staugh, who was injured in boiler explosion at Zanesville, Ohio, was buried by Zanesville Klan in Greenwood cemetery, Saturday afternoon, October twentyfourth. Klansmen in full regalia rendered Klan ceremony.
