

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## WHAT IS THE TAROT?





#### The Origin of the Tarot

he tarot is a card oracle that has existed in its current form since the 16th century. The deck consists of 78 cards, which are subdivided into two main groups: the major arcana, which consists of 22 consecutively numbered cards depicting individual motifs, such as the Fool, the Magus, the Sun and Moon, as well as Death and the Devil. The remaining 56 cards, the minor arcana, are arranged into a series of four suits. Each suit displays a common symbol (Wand, Sword, Disk, or Cup).

There are many differing opinions as to where this oracle came from and how it originally reached Europe. The earliest traces are lost in the 14th century. It is presumed that this is the time when the minor arcana came to the West from the Islamic world. On the other hand, the origin of the considerably more significant cards of the major arcana is uncertain. They only appeared around the end of the 16th century. It is not known whether the connection with the minor arcana first occurred at that time or whether all 78 cards had always belonged together.

Many people believe that these cards are nothing less than the ancient Egyptian priest caste's Book of Wisdom, which had blossomed in the dark for several thousands of years until they reached the light of public life about 400 years ago. However, others assume that the cards were created in the 14th century, which is undoubtedly the more plausible assumption.

As mysterious as the origin of the major arcana may be, its "disappearance" is also quite curious. Even though almost everyone is familiar with the minor arcana, because our current playing cards are based on it, only The Fool of the major arcana has "survived." He became the Joker. The other 21 cards disappeared from the card games that are commonly played today. Yet the four suits of the minor arcana, including their structure, are still found in our playing cards. The symbols—Wands, Swords, Cups, and Coins—which are widespread in card games from Roman-influenced countries even today, have now become Clubs, Spades, Hearts, and Diamonds.

#### Two Approaches to the Tarot

There are basically two different ways to approach the tarot. If we study the symbolism, the organization, and the structure of the cards, the images of the major arcana become a Book of Wisdom. They describe the human being's path of life and also permit meaningful insight into the reality behind reality. This deeply esoteric approach to the tarot is limited to the 22 cards of the major arcana, which

form the actual philosophical background and contain the tarot's wisdom about life. Above all, important keys to this profound level are found in mythology,<sup>2</sup> alchemy, and mystical numerology. In comparison, we do not know whether the cards of the minor arcana have ever been used for any other purpose than card-laying, which is the second, much more familiar way of approaching the tarot. And it is also the topic of this book. On this level, the differences between the major and minor arcana fade since they are treated almost the same when it comes to using the cards in a reading.

#### Coincidence and the Random Oracle

The relationship between an oracle and a game is not a phenomenon limited to the tarot cards. Other games we play, such as throwing dice, drawing lots, or Mikado, have also descended from ancient oracles. They are all based on the conviction that coincidence is something meaningful. Although the statement, "There are no coincidences," that we often hear today may mean the same thing, a closer look reveals its fallacy. We should actually say that there are no meaningless coincidences. That would correspond more closely with the original meaning of this word in the Middle Ages, which is based on the idea of "coinciding" or two things occurring at the same time. The philosophers of the European "Enlightenment" in the 18th century liked the approach that coincidences were purely arbitrary, depicting an absurd fate or the blind workings of life. This helped them through the embarrassing predicament of having to find explanations for inexplicable phenomena. However, our present-day willingness to presume a significant activity behind a coincidence or synchronicity has increased considerably. What does this mean?

When we translate our philosophy about our path to salvation (as described in a great variety of humanity's spiritual teachings) into the language of psychology, then our goal in life is to achieve wholeness. The force that urges each of us to strive for this goal is the "Self." C. G. Jung used this term to describe the greater whole that encompasses both conscious and unconscious aspects of a human being. Since our ego, as the center of consciousness, is only a part of the Self—and with great probability just a very small portion—it naturally cannot develop an extensive view of the greater whole. Neither can it speak with certainty about the nature of the Self.

However, we can pay attention to the messages it sends us via dream and inspiration. We can also observe its activity in the many coincidental phenomena of our lives. Similar to the situation of subtle quantum physics, the observer is nat-

urally a part of the experiment as well. If we think that dreams are just nonsense, our dreams will hardly have anything meaningful to say to us. But if we pay friendly attention to the inspiration coming from the unconscious mind, as well as to coincidental occurrences, we will notice some unusual and memorable experiences.

From this perspective, we know that oracles make significant statements, especially because of their random patterns, even if making such an assumption is blatantly contrary to the scientific way of looking at things. And here is where we repeatedly hear judgments in relation to reading the tarot: "If the cards are laid out five times in a row, an answer is given through different cards each time." This is both true and false. Actually, in such a situation, different cards would actually turn up, but this doesn't prove anything. Only the rational presentation of evidence is based on the repeatability of an experiment. To do this, it is necessary to exclude coincidences with a vengeance, to carry out a planned test series without any disturbances in an appropriate room, a shielded laboratory, for instance. If the experiment succeeds as many times as desired, proof has been provided. However, random oracles, just like dreams, belong to the irrational world, and therefore cannot be measured with such rational means.

A dream doesn't first become meaningful when we have dreamed it five times. In the same way, a random oracle does not live from its repeatability. While coincidence is considered an unknown quantity and an undesired troublemaker that can confuse any experiment in the rational world, it proves to be the most important and expressive factor in the irrational world. This is why the pattern of an initial and single laying of the cards is meaningful. The fact that it cannot be repeated does not prove anything.

If we consider Jungian psychology and assume that forces found in the unconscious mind guide us, then the tarot can also symbolize a dialog between the conscious and the unconscious mind. Just like the other occurrences and experiences that are brought about by the unconscious mind so we can grow and mature, advice from the tarot also comes into our lives with messages from the unconscious mind. This background allows the oracle to appear in a completely different light and become a unique source of self-perception. So that it would be understood in this way, the philosopher Thales of Miletus had the famous inscription of "Know thyself," written on the Temple at Delphi at the beginning of the sixth century B.C. to explain the actual meaning of all oracles. People who comprehend these messages, and who allow themselves to be guided by them, will take their very own path, one that corresponds with their individuality, and they will find themselves as a result. On the other hand, those who consider the unconscious mind to be nothing more than an enchanted wonderland with magical powers that the ego may shamelessly exploit in order to satisfy its boundless craving for recognition and naive expectations of happiness, will at best be disappointed. People who want to learn their numbers to play the lottery, or who consider the tarot as spiritual

insurance against the inconveniences of life, may not be very successful. "Every approach to the unconscious, or just wanting to make use of it," warns the Jungian Marie-Louise von Franz, "has destructive effects." And she compares this process to the ruthless exploitation of the forests, the ruinous exhaustion of natural resources, and the greedy plundering of our mineral resources—all of which only leads to a disturbance of the biological equilibrium. Moreover, missing the point is the original meaning of the word "sin." Perhaps it is this danger that, time and again, has discredited the tarot cards as the prayerbook of the Devil.

## VARIOUS VERSIONS OF THE TAROT





#### The Traditional Cards

here are many variations of the tarot common today, but the Marseilles Tarot is considered to be the most classic version because it is most closely related to the card motifs of past centuries. Yet, we still cannot say that this is the original depiction, since the cards have always proved to have a great degree of variation between them, and no original tarot is known. A typical characteristic of older cards is that only the major arcana, the court cards (King, Queen, Knight, and Page) and sometimes also the four Aces have picture motifs. Apart from ornamental flourishes and garlands, the illustrations on the remaining cards are essentially limited to the numerical rendition of their symbol, similar to present-day playing cards. For example, the Five of Coins shows 5 coins, just like the Five of Diamonds shows 5 diamonds. It is understandably much more difficult to interpret these cards. We must either learn all their meanings by heart, or use another system to find the message of each card.

One way to increase our knowledge is to classify the four suits of the minor arcana according to the four elements: Wands = fire, Swords = air, Coins = earth, and Cups = water. If we also consider the knowledge of the meaning of the numbers 1 to 10, passed down by mystical numerology, the meaning of a card can be derived from these two components. Since, among other things, the number 3 represents healthy stability and living growth, and Cups are equivalent to the water element and the world of feelings, the following meaning results from the Three of Cups: feeling healthy and full of life. Without a doubt, such an approach to the cards is more difficult and less inspiring for most people than working with an expressive picture.

#### The Waite Tarot

At the beginning of the 20th century, Arthur Edward Waite (1857–1942) and Pamela Coleman Smith (1875–1951) created new cards. These were published in 1910 as the Waite Tarot, or the Rider-Waite Tarot, <sup>1</sup> and became the best-known tarot cards in the world, and have the broadest distribution. Both creators of these cards were members of the Order of the Golden Dawn, an esoteric society that was London's most famous at the turn of the 19th century. This circle, which included many illustrious personalities as its members, was extremely interested in the Western tradition and tarot in particular. A. E. Waite, who was also the head of the order

at times, was considered the "walking library" of the house. On the basis of his deep and extensive knowledge, he created the concept for the new cards. The artist Pamela Coleman Smith turned this concept into the pictures on the cards. While the depiction of the major arcana usually reflected the classical patterns, the minor arcana was given a completely new design. Each minor arcana card was illustrated, making it possible to derive the meaning of all 78 cards from the motifs. This change contained such an enormous enrichment for the cards that it has been the main reason for their great popularity.

#### The Crowley Tarot

Second today in terms of popularity—at least in English- and German-speaking areas—is a tarot deck created by the highly controversial Aleister Crowley (1875–1947), who many people denounce as a magician who practiced black magic, while others—including some very clever minds—see him as one of the great initiates. Crowley, who in his childhood suffered from the sectarian narrowness of his parental home and was not allowed to experience Christianity as a message of love, had passionately proclaimed the end of this world religion and claimed that he was the Anti-Christ, ultimately even the prophet of a new age. Since he fanned all the Christian fears that had been slumbering since the Middle Ages in the people of the Western world, and because he also rarely missed an opportunity to make himself unpopular, Crowley was not only stamped an arch villain but also fell lastingly into disrepute, far beyond his own age, so that even today some fainthearted souls flinch at the sound of his name. More than a few people fear that becoming interested in his work is a certain ticket to Hell. That is not true.

Crowley was neither a criminal nor did he propagandize evil. He was concerned with defeating a belief that, in his eyes, was outdated and hypocritical. However, for this purpose he had the audacity of besmirching the holy values of the Western world. He has never been forgiven for this insolence. Since his attempt to establish a new world religion has remained rather unsuccessful, and his magic only interests a relatively small circle of ardent insiders, the name Crowley would have long been forgotten except for one fact: toward the end of his life he developed a new tarot. This tarot was first published in 1944 as *The Book of Thoth*, named after the ancient Egyptian god of wisdom and magic spells. He let all his magical knowledge flow into these cards, which were painted by the artist Lady Frieda Harris (1887–1962). And since he was a highly educated, widely traveled man, and extraordinarily well-versed authority of esoteric tradition, it is no wonder that this tarot deck not only fascinates us but has also remained unsurpassed to this day in its symbolic content and complexity.

In contrast to the Waite Tarot, these exceedingly profound images present a problem. Although the pictures are fascinating, they are not simple and pleasing. Particularly because of the depth and abundance of their symbolism, it is not

always easy to gain access to their meaning. A further factor is that in the design of the minor arcana, Crowley places himself between the simple but shallow depiction of the old cards and the easily understandable motifs of the Waite Tarot. We could say that he abstracted the respective idea in his cards. As a result, their meaning is expressed quite well, but only for those who are capable of reading the symbols. As if to balance out this complication a bit, each card of the Crowley Tarot has a name. For some, this may be a helpful bridge to interpretation. However, some people simply read the name without exploring the picture, which is known to say more than a thousand words. As a result, they only get a vague idea (or none at all) of what the card would truly like to express.

The Crowley Tarot is different in structure from the Waite deck. This difference has caused confusion for Crowley changed the names of the Court cards, which overlap with the old names in the following, easily misunderstood manner:

Traditional names of the Court cards	Corresponding Court cards in the Crowley Tarot

Furthermore, some of the cards in the major arcana of the Crowley Tarot received new names. Justice became Adjustment (VIII); while the Wheel of Fortune was shortened to Fortune (X); Strength became Lust (XI); Temperance was transformed into Art (XIV); The World is called The Universe (XXI). But the most fundamental change occurred in the 20th card. It has been called Judgement and showed the wonder of resurrection on the Day of Judgment. According to Crowley's understanding, this theme belonged to the closing age of Osiris, the age of the sacrificed and self-sacrificing gods. But his newly designed card, The Aeon, is devoted to the approaching age of Horus, 2 upon which Horus can be seen as the ruler of this new eon. This approach naturally also transforms the meaning of this card. It no longer represents redemption and the wonder of transformation, as in the older tarots, but the birth of the new and the vision of a broad future.

Some people who have copies of the newer small Crowley deck will note that there are two extra copies of the Magus. When the deck was rephotographed in the 1980s, the photographer discovered two other versions of the card and

arranged to have them printed with the deck. However, these are not cards meant to be in the deck; they were reprinted in error and should not be included. They were not "special cards" to be used in readings, but were actually paintings that were rejected by Crowley. The card manufacturer has now stopped including them in the deck as they should never have been included in the first place. No one, for example, publishes the card designs that "didn't make it" in the Waite deck!

#### Other Tarot Variations

What some people experience as a qualitative enrichment appears to others to be one of the many inflations of our age as it thirsts for quantity: the constantly increasing and hardly surveyable number of new tarot cards. The spectrum ranges from countless variations of the Waite deck and classical tarots, to peculiar curiosities and supposed exotics, to beautiful new editions of old decks and to many decks with romantic titles, which their creators like to name after sunken cultures or mysterious figures. A closer look usually reveals that even the "Far Eastern," "Traditional," and "Ancient Egyptian" tarots have only been created during recent decades in Europe or the USA.

#### Are There Right and Wrong Tarot Cards?

In view of this development, we can question whether or not and to what degree it can be right for an increasing number of new tarot decks to be created, today more than ever before. At the same time, rumors circulate as to the existence of cards that are especially good and reliable, whereby other cards—like the works of the Devil—harm the users and lead them astray. But whether a tarot deck is right or wrong depends on what we do with the cards. If we study them as a Book of Wisdom (see page 3), we can quickly determine whether the symbolism of the major arcana has been understood by those who gave them the new design and perhaps even enriched them with a few subtle nuances. They will reveal whether the core message has been retained or falsified. On the other hand, if we lay the cards to ask them questions as an oracle, then there is no right or wrong. The decisive factor is not which tarot is used, or whether an answer is obtained from reading the runes, the I Ching, or coffee grounds. What matters is how well-versed the reader is in the language of the respective oracle, or how well the asker understands the message that has been laid by coincidence in the corresponding arrangement. There are oracle systems that have matured during the course of the centuries and can therefore give a more highly differentiated answer than simpler methods, such as throwing a coin. And when someone designs a tarot deck that only has a choice of dark themes, the answer will inevitably be one-sided; the same applies to a tarot deck that consists solely of harmlessly sweet motifs.

#### Frequently Asked Questions and Answers

#### What can you ask the cards?

- About the current status of a matter or development
- About future tendencies and perspectives
- For advice on how to solve a problem or achieve a goal
- About the causes and reasons for a specific development
- About the best decision or smartest course of action
- About issues regarding self-awareness or self-realization

#### What can't we learn from the cards?

Cards can only pictorially depict a theme; they cannot present us with names or places. They obviously won't give us telephone numbers, dates, and times. They are also not capable of medical diagnosis. But, above all, they cannot answer with "yes" or "no." If you are seeking this type of advice, it is better to try throwing coins. However, the cards can help in making such decisions by showing the consequences without making the decision for the person asking the question.

#### How can the cards give us meaningful answers?

This phenomenon certainly cannot be adequately explained. However, there are two interesting considerations beyond the information in the chapter on "Coincidence and the Random Oracle."

- 1. The unconscious mind has a different relationship to time and space than the conscious mind. It looks beyond the horizons of the present, as everyone has experienced in dreaming about the future and knowing what is about to happen. Just as the language of consciousness is words, the unconscious mind speaks in images. The tarot cards can be understood as the alphabet of the metaphorical language of our soul. With them, our unconscious mind can express how it sees the matter in question. The only thing that our conscious mind must do is learn the metaphorical language of the unconscious to understand what it is saying.
- 2. The second consideration underlies the concept of synchronicity, as C. G. Jung has termed this phenomenon. We are used to measuring time in terms of quantity. There is, however, also a quality of time that our language remembers when it speaks of the "right" moment. And from this perspective, every moment has its special quality and characteristics that reveal themselves on a great variety of levels in the same way: macrocosmic in the planetary constellations, microcosmic in the movements of the atoms, and on many other different levels in between. These other levels include the tarot, as well as the I Ching and other oracle methods. Since, from the holistic perspective, the question and its answer form a unity, the

moment in which we ask the question already contains the answer. If we succeed in recognizing the quality of this moment, we can read the answer from it. The question of which oracle to use or which tarot cards are better is less significant. Above all, it is important that the interpreter understands the language of the oracle.

#### Is there a secret, but really true, final, and objective meaning for the cards?

No. There are only subjective interpretations. This is why there are very different, sometimes even highly contradictory statements in the books and interpretations of various, quite competent experts. One reason for this is that the tarot is not a secret language thought up by a sage or a group of initiates at some point in time, the code of which we now must crack. Instead, these are archetypal symbols—particularly in the cards of the major arcana—that correspond to and originate in the picture language of the soul. Consequently, the key is to be found much less in the mysterymongering of some occult circles than in the depth psychology of C. G. Jung. In keeping with its nature, a symbol can never be understood to mean just one thing or comprehended in all its depth. In this respect, even very different interpretations can be correct, since each of them respectively illuminates another aspect of the whole.

How can it be that the asker draws the "right" cards without knowing what they mean or which card-laying system the interpreter will use?

The basic rule is: "The asker always plays the game of the interpreter." On the unconscious level, we are much more connected with each other than our external impression would have us believe. This means that something like a state of unity occurs between two participants, thanks to which the asker draws the right card for the respective interpreter. In this regard, it also makes no sense to have the interpretation "appraised" by another person with knowledge of the cards, since the asker would possibly have drawn other cards for this person's insight. Yet, the cards would have still led to the same message.

#### What differences in quality are there when people interpret the cards?

The quality of the interpretation is naturally dependent upon the interpreter's inner horizon. Those who live with a limited worldview will only be able to translate the cards within the confines of their imagination. On the other hand, the asker's level of understanding is always dependent upon his or her degree of maturity. If we only want to know when we will finally get lucky, whether something will turn out well, or when something unpleasant will finally be over, without being interested in the deeper reasons, we will perhaps be particularly disappointed by a truly sound and competent consultation because it doesn't give us a simple answer.

Should you concentrate on the question while shuffling, picking, drawing, or laying the cards?

No, definitely not. Let yourself be guided by the concept that your unconscious mind already knows what you want to ask. Your conscious mind just needs to know what the question is. In this respect, asking the question is nothing other than becoming aware of it and should also be seen in this light. So be clear about what you would like to know. While you shuffle, draw, or lay the cards, it may be that you have almost forgotten what the question was (which is why it is better to write it down so you can again focus on it during the interpretation).

#### What should you keep in mind when shuffling the cards?

This depends upon how you want to proceed. If you follow the advice of this book and draw each card individually from the cards of the tarot deck that have been turned face down and spread like a fan, then shuffling is insignificant. You don't need to give it any further thought. On the other hand, if you simply lay the cards that are at the top of the mixed pile, you should actually observe the mixing ritual described by some books so that you mix (or shuffle) the "right" cards to be in that place.

If you also read the "reversed" cards (see page 27), it is advisable to mix the cards with both hands on the large surface, such as a table or desk so that these have the opportunity to turn in one direction or the other.

How do you know which of the many meanings of a card are correct in each individual case?

From your intuition. You should not be surprised if you—as the interpreter—suddenly emphasize a previously neglected aspect or discover a whole new aspect of a card. Instead, be rather skeptical if you continually recite the same set interpretation. However, if it happens that you are stuck at some point without a clue, the cards themselves can also help you get further. Ask about the special meaning of a card by laying The Cross (see page 51).

If you lay the cards on the same topic several times in a row, will the same cards appear again?

Probably not. Whether or not laying the cards a number of times actually expresses a message depends upon the reason for laying them again. If someone just wants to use this to prove the supposed nonsense of laying cards at all, then laying them repeatedly is meaningless (also see the chapter on "Coincidence and the Random Oracle"). The same also applies to the case when the asker is dissatisfied with the first laying and therefore immediately draws the cards again. However, if this is a matter of clarifying one or more subsequent questions regarding the interpretation

at hand, experience has shown that further card-laying consistently builds upon the previous one without getting "tangled up" in contradictions.

For which period of time are the cards reliable?
For which time periods can you ask questions of the cards?

This depends completely on the time factor associated with the question. Generally, the cards provide an outlook for the next three to six months. However, if you ask about a change of residence or a different direction in your work, the cards can illuminate a much longer period of time. On the other hand, if you ask about a two-week vacation period, they will be limited to this time frame.

In addition, some cards have a time aspect of their own: the Eight of Wands and sometimes The Chariot (VII) show a shortening of the required time aspect. By way of contrast, the Eight of Disks and, above all, the Four of Swords and The Hanged Man (XII) sometimes reflect considerable delays in the development of the matter in question.

#### How reliable is the card oracle?

As reliable as the advice of the wise old man or woman. Therefore, take the message of the cards seriously and take their recommendations to heart. But since absolute truth cannot be found in this world, it naturally does not exist in the tarot either.

The cards—like all other oracles—point out experiences that we will have. In this respect, their statements are very reliable. But how we react to these experiences and what events are related to them cannot be predicted with certainty beforehand. This applies in particular to people who live in a very conscious manner and who don't switch to a comfortable hypocritical solution when faced with difficult challenges. They shape their freedom of development within such a broad scope that the "hits" of prognosis are far below the level of those for people who live unconsciously for the most part. The latter tend to give themselves over to their fate and take the path of least resistance. Consequently, they react in a much more predictable manner.

In any case, you should assume that no one session of card-laying is binding, but instead shows a tendency that will occur if the asker continues in the same way as before. However, even if someone just takes a different approach on the basis of the perspectives shown by the tarot, the tendency that the cards have predicted is naturally no longer applicable.

Is there a limit to the possible messages and therefore things that a card-reader cannot or should not predict?

Yes. In contradiction to the common conceptions, a card-reader is not a fortuneteller but a translator who speaks the language of the images. This makes the cardreader like an interpreter of dreams. The meaning of the message can be found in conveying a deeper understanding for the larger context of a current or future development. From worthless to questionable are messages that go beyond that and announce a seemingly inescapable event.

#### Is it possible to become addicted to the tarot?

There are certainly people who will not take a step before asking the cards for permission. But they have not become dependent because of the tarot—they presumably have an addictive personality structure that could have just as easily latched onto something else. Fortunately, tarot addiction is one of the few addictions that can cure itself. While other addictions constantly call for more and increase their intensity as a result, this addiction fades with time because the more wildly the cards are laid, the more their expressive power is watered down to the point of meaninglessness.

Could it be that the cards or other oracles manipulate the asker? Does he or she perhaps have a negative experience only because its occurrence was predicted?

This occurrence naturally cannot be excluded with certainty, which is why it is important each time before laying the cards to ask whether you are truly willing to hear *any* answer. If you let other people give you advice, be sure that they are people who you experience as likable and trustworthy; avoid any dark, threatening advice that sheds no light on your life.

#### How should you deal with predictions of disaster?

Time and again people have seen fortune-tellers who apparently set no limits on the messages they give, who supposedly have prophesied unavoidable misfortune (death of close relatives, financial ruin followed by suicide, etc.). A discussion on how such statements are arbitrary and untenable then has little effect. It is only when the asker understands that he or she "needs" this prophecy, possibly to take a new look at his or her partner, that the emotional pressure is eased. (This is the issue at hand since the prophesied apocalypse doesn't occur at any rate.) This is in no way meant to justify the fact that irresponsible fortune-tellers make unfounded and terrible statements that are also worthless.<sup>3</sup> Yet, it is important to understand that the asker, as in any other consultation or therapy, receives exactly the message or experience that he or she probably "needs" for the respective situation.

What is the meaning of the oracle?

Its significance is found in the search for self-awareness and not in the prediction

of profane everyday events. What makes the tarot (as well as astrology and the I Ching) so valuable is the deep understanding of our tasks in life and the nature of our being, to which each of these oracles would like to lead us and can do so.

#### What is the relationship between tarot and astrology or the I Ching?

While the strength of the tarot is in clearly showing developments in close proximity, astrology is an excellent key to our nature as human beings, our tasks in life, and our larger cycles of experience. Above all, the I Ching may give valuable insights to those who desire to penetrate into a deeper level of meaning in relation to an experience.

Each of these oracles speaks its own language, but the Western traditions of tarot and astrology are closely related to each other. Their relationship is something like English and German: they can easily be translated from one to the other. Yet, there are still expressions in both languages that can only be described in the other. On the other hand, the distance to the I Ching is as great as the difference between English and Chinese. A deep intuitive understanding of the other culture is required in order to understand its language.

#### Should the cards even be asked questions about everyday life?

Yes, of course. Any question that an individual seriously asks can also be asked of the tarot.

#### Can you lay the cards for someone who is not present?

Yes, you can, as long as you have this person's permission and/or have a justifiable interest. The latter case occurs, for example, if you have a relationship with a person and lay the cards in order to ask something about the status of this relationship. However, if someone attempts to snoop in the private life of another person because of curiosity or sensation-seeking, without the other person's permission, the statements made by the cards are usually worthless.

#### Why are the cards drawn with the left hand?

Because, in pictorial terms, it comes from the heart and the left half of the body has always been considered the intuitive side. This knowledge has been confirmed by the latest brain research. Left-handers should also draw their cards with the left hand.

#### Should you let your cards be drawn by someone else?

Yes, you should, if you have a great deal of inner tension or expectations that are too fixed in connection with the question. Then it is definitely better to have the cards drawn, laid, and interpreted by someone you like.

# FROM ASKING THE QUESTION TO INTERPRETING THE ANSWER





#### Quick Access for People in a Hurry

f you are too impatient to read long instructions and prefer to start immediately, or simply want to try out how to lay the cards, then proceed as follows:

1. Ask a question about a topic that interests you. If this happens to be a decision question, don't formulate the question so that it can only be answered with "yes" or "no." Instead, ask what will happen if you do something and what will happen if you don't do it.

- 2. Look for the appropriate card-laying system in Table 1 on page 22. If you find this too confusing, then use one of the three following methods for laying the cards:
  - a) The Relationship Game (page 40) for questions about a relationship
  - b) The Decision Game (page 44) for all questions regarding decisions
  - c) The Celtic Cross (page 48) for all other questions.
- 3. Shuffle all 78 tarot cards and spread them out facedown like a fan in front of you.
- 4. Look at the description to see how many cards you will need for the card-laying system that you have selected.
- 5. Place the cards in front of you in a fan shape. Draw each card, one at a time, using you left hand. Don't concentrate or think of anything in particular. Place the cards facedown on top of each other.
- 6. Now turn over one card after the other in the order you drew it (meaning the bottom one first). Lay them out according to the numerical order given in the description of the card-laying method.
- 7. Read the keywords for each card on the respective level of your question in the interpretation section and meaningfully connect these with the significance of the place that the card occupies.
- 8. Connect the individual statements with each other into an overall message.
- 9. In conclusion, find the Quintessence (see page 28).

#### How Should the Question Be Asked?

#### In Terms of Its Form:

You can ask the question aloud or quietly, repeat it several times, or even write it down. Do this in whatever way appeals to you most. No method is better than the other. The important thing is that you know precisely what you have asked and that you no longer concentrate on the question after you have asked it. Instead, calmly and serenely draw the cards, turn them over, and interpret them.

#### In Terms of Its Content:

Consider your question as it comes to mind; the important thing is not a perfect formulation, but that you are clear about what you want to know. So you can simply ask: "What is the situation for this or that?" or, "How will things continue?" You can also check the "Typical Questions" at the beginning of each layout to help you find the best method for your question.

Don't ask questions that can only be answered with "yes" or "no." It's quite possible that the cards will help you in decision-making situations, but they cannot make any decisions for you. Instead, ask: "What will happen if I do this, and what will happen if I don't do this?" The Decision Game will show you the respective consequences, which will help you make your decision.

Don't ask about a number of alternatives at the same time, such as: "Should I move to New York or to Paris?" Instead, divide your query into two sets of questions: "What will happen if I go to New York," and "What will happen if I don't go to New York?" Actually, with Decision Game layout, you can combine these two questions in one reading. After you have asked these questions, you can ask: "What will happen if I move to Paris?" and "What will happen if I don't move to Paris?" If the prospects are bleak in both cases, but the cards show a more favorable alternative, this may perhaps be Los Angeles. But in the original formulation of the question, you would have not even been aware of this alternative. It would only have shown you that your plans were problematic either way.

Various groups of themes should not be mixed into one question, such as: "How will my vacation trip be and will I fall in love along the way?" Instead, ask how the vacation will be by using the card-laying system "The Celtic Cross" and try "The Path" to see what you can do to fall in love again.

#### Shuffling, Drawing, and Laying the Cards

After you have asked the question and decided which card-laying system to use, proceed as follows:

#### Keywords for the Crowley Tarot

- 1. Shuffle the cards. You don't need to pay attention to any special rules. Mix them as long as you like and however you like.
- 2. Spread the cards in front of you like a big fan.
- 3. With your left hand, draw as many cards from the fan as you need for the selected card-laying method. Lay them on top of each other, facedown, and one at a time.
- 4. Set aside the rest of the cards.
- 5. Now turn over your cards in the order you drew them (which means the bottom one first) and lay them out according to the pattern shown in the illustration of the respective card-laying system you have chosen to use.

#### THE INTERPRETATION





# The Individual Cards

hen interpreting the cards, it's important to connect the special meaning of each card with the meaning of the field in which it is located. You will find the meaning of the field in the description of the respective card-laying system. You can then look up the various levels of meaning of the card in the Interpretation Section. Look for the key word that corresponds with your question and combine it into a meaningful message together with the meaning of the field where the card is located.

When you first start reading the cards, it is quite common at the start for the individual messages to be clumsy, or not particularly expressive or understandable. Don't let yourself be disappointed by this. Simply move on to the next card. At the conclusion, the meaning of the less understandable cards usually becomes more clear.

In some card-laying systems, it is helpful to interpret the cards in an order different from how they were picked from the deck. You will find corresponding suggestions under the heading of "How to Interpret the Cards," for each different spread.

# Summarizing the Message

A summary of the message should be done at the end of each reading. To do this, connect the individual statements into an overall message. However, this doesn't mean that all the contradictions must be rigorously cleared away. Our lives—and therefore also the cards—are frequently quite contradictory. The interpretation should not be just bits and pieces, but summarized into a concluding message. So let the individual elements become a complete story.

# Reversed Cards

Some experts see a different meaning in the cards when they are reversed (upside down). Others simply turn the cards back to the right position. Both approaches are correct and simply depend, like so many things in tarot, on the "rules of the game" that the interpreter uses. Try this variation and see what your experiences are with it. But always decide before you draw the first card whether or not you want to use reversed meanings. If you do, be sure to mix the cards on a large surface (such as a table) so that they actually have the opportunity to get really mixed up. Since Brigitte and I always turn reversed cards to the proper position, we have not included interpretative text for reversed cards in this book. However, you may find that reversed cards have a problematic, exaggerated, or complicated variation of their original meanings. Other books list specific meanings for reversed cards, and you may want to explore that as well.

# The Quintessence

After the cards have been laid and interpreted, the tarot can give an additional indication of how the asker should deal with the cards' advice and what should be taken into special consideration in future actions. You can calculate the quintessence by adding the numerical value of the cards that have been turned over. In this process, the Court cards (Princess, Prince, Queen, and Knight) have a value of zero, the aces are ones, and the remaining cards are added according to their numerical value.

If this results in a single-digit number, then look for the card of the major arcana that corresponds with this number. It will show you the proper course of action. However, if the result is a two-digit or three-digit number, then add the cross sum¹ until you have a single-digit number. Should the sum or the cross sum first result in a double-digit number between 10 and 22, the corresponding card of the major arcana will give you additional information. It may even be a precondition for coming to the actual theme that is always found in the single-digit cards. You can find the meaning of the quintessence in the overview provided in Table 2 on pages 28–30.

# Methods of Laying Out the Cards

# Simple Card Layouts

The simplest way to lay cards is to draw a card for a topic. However, in view of the wide spectrum of possible interpretations, its message may sometimes be unsatisfactory in terms of clarity and meaning. If we draw two cards, one of which illustrates the positive possibilities and the other the problematic aspects, we can often get a much more precise picture by comparing them. We offer helpful card-interpreting texts for this purpose.

#### Pro and Con

If you are looking for a quick message from the cards, simply draw two cards. The first will show the related possibilities and opportunities, while the second will warn against the associated risks and dangers. To interpret them, use the section called "Encourages" for the first and the section called "Warns Against" for the second. By comparing them, you can see how good the chances are and how high the related risks are, and whether there is more that speaks in favor of or against a plan.

# Card for the Day

Drawing a card each morning is a pleasant way to become more familiar with the cards and experience their meaning through everyday occurrences. Their meaning may lie in an apparent experience described in the section "Card for the Day." Or it may also be something small, a subtle phenomenon that we would otherwise easily overlook. When the Card for the Day draws attention to such "trivial matters," then they are significant from the perspective of the unconscious mind. It can be highly enriching to pay more attention to these details and perhaps even experience how they begin to intertwine with each other and grow into something meaningful. Even if it is understandable that the card-interpreting suggestions in this book cannot describe the more subtle levels of the Card for the Day, they may stimulate new insights for discovering such concealed meanings.

# Card for the Year

In addition to their interpretation as Cards for the Day, the 22 major arcana are also interpreted on another level—as Cards for the Year. There are various possibilities for determining these cards. They can be calculated by using the cross sum from a person's date of birth, month of birth, and the current year. For example, if you are born on February 1st, the sum for the year 2002 would be 2 + 1 + 2 + 0 + 0 + 2 = 7. (If you were born on December 15, 2002, your number would be 12 + 15 + 2 + 0 + 0 + 2 = 31. Since this result is larger than 22, we once again add

the cross sum and get 3 + 1 = 4.) Card 7 of the major arcana, The Chariot, is the Card for the Year from February 1, 2002 to January 31, 2003 for everyone who has a birthday on February 1st. And Card 4, The Emperor, would be the card for the year for the person looking at December 15, 2002.


However, since the tarot is a coincidental oracle, it would actually be more in keeping with its nature to simply draw the Card for the Year instead of calculating it. This can be done on New Year's Eve for the coming calendar year, or on your birthday for the next personal year. In any case, always draw this card from the 22 cards of the major arcana. Do this by sorting them out of the pile of cards since only these 22 cards have the depth of meaning that does justice to the yearly theme.

# COMPREHENSIVE LAYOUTS









Statement	Causes, background, and prospects.
Degree of difficulty	4
Cards to draw	9
Typical question	What is the reason for my crisis (illness, problem, etc.) and what prospects do I have?
Special characteristics	The best card-laying method for exploring the background of a situation.

This system of card-laying is based on an ancient Egyptian symbol, the ankh, which is also called the tau cross. It consists of a circle and a cross. In accordance with the meaning of the circle, the cards laid in this area give an answer regarding the emotional background and the deeper-rooted causes, while the cards on the level of the cross show how the problem is expressed on the level of reality, what concrete steps can be taken, and with what prospects we can reckon.

#### THE MEANING OF THE VARIOUS CARD POSITIONS

- 1 + 2 = Represent two current impulses, energies, or attitudes that block each other. You are being crucified between them.<sup>1</sup>
  - 3 = Early causes
  - 4 = Triggering causes
  - 5 = Higher perception
  - 6 = Necessary conclusions

Under the assumption that the perception (5) has taken place and the conclusions (6) have been drawn, the following shows the further progression:


- 7 = The next step
- 8 = Surprising experiences
- 9 =The result

#### HOW TO READ THE SPREAD

First find the nature of the conflict or contradiction that exists between Cards 1 and 2. This is the greatest difficulty in this particular spread. Above all, when both cards depict themes that tend to be pleasant, it isn't easy to see where the problem lies. However, without this perception, the entire reading will be unsatisfactory. Then interpret Positions 3 and 4, of which the former can often only be comprehended in a vague manner. The emphasis of the reading should be on Cards 5 and 6 because only the steps related to them involve a possible solution. Use the key words in the section "Consciousness" for Position 5 and the text under "Encourages" for Position 6. Then look at the future-oriented cards in Positions 7 to 9.

# THE ASTROLOGICAL TAROT READING



Statement	Extensive description of the present and outlook on future tendencies.
Degree of difficulty	4
Cards to draw	12
Typical questions	Where am I in my life right now? What will my essential experiences be or what will occur during the next month or in the year X? (Without time limitations, the cards reflect the present and immediate future.)
Special characteristics	The card-laying method that includes all areas of life.

Unlike most other card-laying systems, the Astrological Tarot Reading uses the 12-house concept of astrology and makes it possible to ask extensive questions of the tarot. It gives us insight into the 12 areas of life (or astrological houses). In this respect, this card-laying system is a good start for an extensive consultation. The areas emphasized by the important cards can subsequently be explored more deeply by laying the cards again.

#### THE MEANING OF THE INDIVIDUAL POSITIONS

- 1 = Basic mood: Significant for the way in which experiences of all the other fields are regarded.
- 2 = Finances: Security. Dealing with money. Income and expenditures.
- 3 = Everyday experiences: Themes that affect the area that takes up the most time in our lives.
- 4 = The home: The area in which we feel protected, in which we know we are rooted. The sense of security that we long for when the outside world becomes too threatening.
- 5 = Everything that is fun: Games and pleasures of all kinds. Games with children, games with money. The game of love (only becomes serious in Position 7), hobbies.
- 6 = Work: The current task, the type of work, working methods, the everyday work life.
- 7 = Partnership: The relationship, marriage, lasting love relationships.
- 8 = The hidden aspects: All taboos and their transgressions. Particularly sexuality, as well as esoteric experiences. If this interpretation is too inaccessible or intimate for you, you can also call the meaning of this field "Crises and Overcoming Them."
- 9 = Higher perceptions: Expansion of our own horizons through inner and outer journeys. Convictions, perceptions, and firmly held beliefs, as well as the resulting principles and "good resolutions."
- 10 = Public recognition: Especially professional success and the future of an occupation.
- 11 = Friends: Friendships, ideals of friendship, group experiences, and hospitality.
- 12 = Secret hopes and fears: Longings and misgivings that are related to one or more of the other fields of the circle.

#### HOW TO READ THE SPREAD

In order to attain an overall message, first interpret the individual cards in their respective positions. During this first attempt, some statements will often be very vague and hazy. Then explore the following positions to see if there are possible connections, which will then result in a more meaningful interpretation:

# THE MAIN AXES

Position 1 and 7 = The I/you themes

Position 4 and 10 = From where and to where

# The house elements (also called triads)

Positions 1, 5, and 9 = The fire triad, which frequently says

something about temperament and self-development.

Positions 2, 6, and 10 = The earth triad, which corresponds to the

world of money and work.

Positions 3, 7, and 11 = The air triad, which reflects the level of thoughts, ideas, contacts, and conversations.

Position 4, 8, and 12 = The water triad, which represents feelings

and intuitive understanding, yearnings, and


moods.

The first look at all the cards doesn't necessarily have to lead to a common overall statement. It may well be that no comprehensible correlation can be found between the individual cards. If this is so, go on to the next step:

# OTHER CONNECTIONS

In terms of the theme, a connection can frequently be recognized between Positions 5 (flirts, affairs, and casual relationships), 7 (relationships, marriage), and 8 (sexuality). The hopes and fears in Position 12 can often be explained through the basic mood in Position 1.

In conclusion, connect all the individual statements into an overall picture and then determine the quintessence.



# THE RELATIONSHIP GAME

Statement	Status of relationship between two people.
Degree of difficulty	2
Cards to draw	7
Typical questions	What is the nature of my relationship to X?
Special characteristics	The best card-laying method for finding out how two people relate to each other.

This card-laying method is usually used for asking about the status of a love relationship. However, it can also be used for any professional, family, or other relationship. The left column (7,6,5) represents the asker, the right column (2,3,4) stands for the partner or partners.

# THE MEANING OF THE VARIOUS CARD POSITIONS

- The significator shows the situation that the relationship is in; the theme that rules the relationship.
- 7 + 2 = These two cards show the conscious level upon which the partners encounter each other. It shows what each person thinks and how they each consciously assess the relationship.

- 6 + 3 = The middle two cards represent the emotional realm of the relationship and show what each of them holds, feels, senses, longs for, or fears.
- 5 + 4 = The lower cards signify appearance and behavior, the attitude shown to the outside world. This is possibly a facade that is displayed, independent of the thoughts (upper level) and feelings (middle level) behind it.


#### HOW TO READ THE SPREAD

From Position 1, first read the theme that currently rules the relationship. Then interpret the individual columns, meaning how both people relate to each other on the respective levels. In conclusion, try to evaluate the dynamic of the relationship: do both people reach out to each other? Or does only one do so? Are both waiting for the other to take the first step?

#### SPECIAL CHARACTERISTICS

Since the Court cards can depict individuals, these cards naturally take on a special role in The Relationship Game. A card personifying a person of the same sex usually embodies the self-image of the respective person in the area where the card appears. On the other hand, when a Queen or Princess appears on the man's side, or a Knight or Prince on the woman's side, these cards of the opposite sex can have two different meanings. They either show that the respective individual is thinking of such a person (Cards 7 or 2), holds this person in his or her heart (Cards 6 or 3), and/or is involved in a relationship with this person (Cards 5 or 4), or it illustrates an ideal image that this person holds.

# THE BLIND SPOT



Statement	Self-knowledge.
Degree of difficulty	3
Cards to draw	4
Typical questions	Where am I in my life? Who am I?
Special characteristics	The simplest among the generally difficult card- laying methods related to self-knowledge.

This card-laying method has been derived from the model known as the Johari Window<sup>2</sup> in psychology. It shows four aspects of the personality and gives information about how we perceive ourselves in contrast to the way others see us.

# THE MEANING OF THE VARIOUS CARD POSITIONS

- 1 = Clear-cut identity: In the thematic area of this card we perceive ourselves in the same manner as others see us.
- 2 = The great unknown: Unconscious processes and unconscious driving forces that are very powerful, although we ourselves and others are not aware of them.

- 3 = The shadow, what is concealed: Aspects of our being that are known to us, yet we hide—for whatever reasons—from the eyes of others.
- 4 = The blind spot: Manners of behavior that others perceive in us, but of which—at least to this degree—we ourselves are not aware.


#### HOW TO READ THIS SPREAD

Begin with the card in Position 1, which is the easiest to understand. Then try to find out the nature of the "unknown," which is illustrated by the card in Position 2. Perceiving this aspect is usually the most valuable part of this card-laying system, since unconscious forces are highly active. However, we usually experience them just passively or from the perspective of suffering as long as we are unaware of them. If this is a difficult theme, becoming conscious of it is an advantage, since it makes it possible for us to deal with this predisposition in a more thoughtful, sensible, and perhaps even a more positive way. If this is a valuable characteristic, then becoming conscious of it is naturally an enriching experience.

The two remaining cards have an additional secondary meaning: Position 3 also reflects self-appraisal and Position 4 shows how others see us. If these two statements deviate greatly from each other, if our self-appraisal is considerably different from how others see us, this should be understood as a warning. If others appraise us totally differently than we do ourselves, it could very well be that we have a false image of ourselves.

When the cards are laid for the purpose of self-knowledge, they often are not understood at first glance. This is why it is advisable to leave the drawn cards in their positions for a while and look at them repeatedly. Particularly when we don't give them our undivided attention or stare at them, the pictures can awaken associations within us that suddenly make us aware of their message.

# THE DECISION GAME



Statement	Two possible tendencies, help in decision-making.
Degree of difficulty	2
Cards to draw	7
Typical questions	How should I decide? What will happen if I do X, and what will happen if I don't do X?
Special characteristics	This card-laying method makes it clear that the asker always has a number of possibilities and is not bound to one exclusive tendency.

Tarot cannot take any decisions out of our hands. It can only illuminate the range of themes associated with the question. In this respect, The Decision Game presented here is not suitable for questions that can be answered with either "yes" or "no." Instead, it shows two possible paths and leaves it up to the asker to choose between the two. More than the others, this card-laying method lets us clearly perceive that the tarot doesn't bind us to one tendency. On the contrary, the asker designs his or her own future by choosing which path to take.

# THE MEANING OF THE VARIOUS CARD POSITIONS

- 7 = The significator. It presents a vivid portrayal of the question's background, the problem, or how the asker sees the decision.
- 3, 1, 5 = In this order, these cards show chronologically what will happen if you do X.
- 4, 2, 6 = In this order, these cards show chronologically what will happen if you do not do X.

# HOW TO READ THE SPREAD


Don't let yourself be irritated by the peculiar order in which the cards are turned over. The reason for this lies in the creation of this card-laying method, but it has no influence on the way in which the cards are read. Begin with Position 7, which can show you what the question is about, what has led to the question, what should be taken into consideration in the decision, or how the decision should be made. Then interpret each of the upper cards from left to right (3, 1, and 5), followed by the lower cards (4, 2, and 6). In conclusion, carefully consider which of the two paths is more advantageous. Remember that each first card (3 and 4) respectively shows how the development begins, the next card (1 and 2) shows how it continues, and the last card (5 and 6) shows where the development is headed. This is why Cards 5 and 6 are the most important: They represent the long-term prospects.

# SPECIAL CHARACTERISTICS

In this card-laying method, there are so-called signal cards that show which alternative the tarot favors. If one of the following cards is found on one of the two paths, this means a clear recommendation for taking this direction. If these cards appear on both paths, then consider whether both paths can be taken at the same time or at least one after the other. These cards have no special meaning in Position 7.

- 1. The Lovers (VI) means that the decision has probably already been made in favor of the path on which this card appears.
- 2. The Fortune (X) card shows that the asker is not free to choose but, at least at the beginning, must take the path on which this card appears.
- 3. The Star (XVII) shows the path of the future.
- 4. Aeon (XX) also shows the path of the future.
- 5. The Universe (XXI) stands for the proper, true place where the asker belongs.

# THE SECRET OF THE HIGH PRIESTESS





Statement	Course of a matter and its concealed background.
Degree of difficulty	3
Cards to draw	9
Typical questions	How will my plans develop? How will things continue (in my work, etc.)?
Special characteristics	A possible answer that reveals the meaning of the situation.

This card-laying method has been "borrowed" from the Waite Tarot. It has been created on the basis of The High Priestess, as shown in that deck. The fascinating thing about this method is that it not only indicates the trend to be expected, but also possibly reveals a secret: The answer to the enigmatic question of "why?" The three-times threefold Moon Goddess speaks through the nine cards. They are laid out in keeping with the main symbols that surround her:

### THE MEANING OF THE VARIOUS CARD POSITIONS

1 + 2 = The cross on her chest shows the topic in question in the form of two main impulses that can strengthen or hinder each other.

Cards 4, 3, and 5 correspond to the three Moon phases of her crown and show the influential forces effecting the theme:

- 3 = The Full Moon represents the current main influence.
- 4 = The Waxing Moon is the power that is gaining influence.
- 5 = The Waning Moon shows the power that is losing influence.

# The two columns at her side represent:

- 6 = What is in the dark. This means what is there but cannot (yet) be consciously perceived, although it may already be sensed or feared. An unconscious driving force.
- 7 = What is in the light. This means what is clearly recognized and usually also valued.

# The Moon barque at her feet shows:


8 = Where the journey leads, what will come next.

The ninth card, the book of secret knowledge on her lap, is initially concealed as it is laid. Only when all of the other cards have been read may this card be examined. If it is one of the major arcana, the High Priestess has revealed her secret and the card is turned faceup. She has then told us something about the deeper motivations behind the theme in question, the reason and purpose of the development. If it is one of the cards of the minor arcana, it remains concealed. In this case, the High Priestess has kept the secret for herself. The ninth card then has no significance and is not included when calculating the quintessence.

#### HOW TO READ THE SPREAD

Start with the two main impulses in Positions 1 and 2. Then evaluate the extent to which these complement, strengthen, hinder, or block each other. In this process, Position 1 always shows the first impulse while the additional theme results from Position 2. Then interpret the influences chronologically in the order of 5, 3, and 4. Afterward, evaluate the conscious attitude or expectation (7) before you interpret the unconscious aspect (6). Remember that this concerns an inner driving force that often has a much stronger effect than the conscious attitude (7). Then interpret the prospect card (8) and summarize the future perspectives that result from Cards 4 (future influences), 6 (still unconscious, later possibly becoming conscious), and 8 (further prospects). Only now should you turn over the ninth card and try to comprehend its deeper meaning if it is one of the major arcana.

# THE CELTIC CROSS



Statement	All-purpose card-laying method, especially for trend developments.
Degree of difficulty	2
Cards to draw	10
Typical questions	How will my plans develop?
Special characteristics	How will things progress? What is happening in my professional life?

This card-laying system is suited for any question. The Celtic Cross is the best-known spread and has been passed down from earlier ages. It is an all-purpose system of laying the cards, which can be used for all forms of questions, but especially for trend development, for illuminating the background of something, as fore-sight, or for researching the cause. If you are not sure which spread is best suited for asking a certain question, you can always use the Celtic Cross.

# Here is an old card-laying saying for it:

- 1 =This is it.
- 2 = This crosses it.
- 3 = This crowns it.
- 4 = It rests upon this.
- 5 = This was before.
- 6 = This comes afterward.
- 7 = This is the asker.
- 8 = This is where it takes place.
- 9 = These are the hopes and fears.
- 10 = This is where it leads.

# Here is the less magical approach:

- 1 = This is what is deals with.
- 2 = This is added to it.
- 3 = This is recognized.
- 4 = This is sensed.
- 5 = This has led there.
- 6 = This is how it continues.
- 7 = This is how the asker sees it.
- 8 = This is how the others see it, or where it takes place.
- 9 = This is what the asker expects or fears.
- 10 = This is where it leads.

# THE MEANING OF THE VARIOUS CARD POSITIONS

- 1 = The initial situation.
- 2 = The additional impulse, which can be beneficial or hindering.

In these two cards we have the basic answer as to what is. The next two cards give us background information:

- 3 = The conscious level. That which is clear to the asker in dealing with the topic, what is recognized, what is seen, and possibly also what is consciously aimed at.
- 4 = The realm of the unconscious. "It rests upon this" is the magical formula. It thereby expresses that a matter is well anchored on this level and carried by a deep inner certainty with the sturdiest of roots and little tendency toward becoming unsettled.

There is a certain interpretive latitude for the meaning of these cards. Ultimately, however, they reflect what the head (3) and the heart (4) have to say.

- 5 = The card leading back in time. It shows the most recent past and thereby frequently also gives an indication about the causes of the current situation.
- 6 = The first card indicating the future gives us a glimpse into the near future and what is to come next.
- 7 = This card shows the asker<sup>3</sup> his or her attitude toward the topic (Cards 1 and 2) or how the asker feels in relation to it.
- 8 = The surrounding environment. This can be the location of the event, as well as the influence of other people upon the topic represented. If the question refers to a relationship between two people, this card will basically represent the partner.
- 9 = Hopes and fears. The significance of this card is frequently underestimated because it has no prognostic character. Yet, it can give us valuable information, especially when we read the cards for someone else. It shows how the asker evaluates the situation, including the related hopes and fears.
- 10 = The second card indicating the future gives the long-term outlook and the culmination of the development.

The prognostic cards are found exclusively in Positions 6 and 10. All other cards give important additional and explanatory information about the surrounding environment and the background of the topic in question.


# HOW TO READ THE SPREAD

Start with Position 5 (past, history) and then read Position 9 (hopes and fears). This will help you have a better idea because you now know the background of the occurrences (Position 5) for the question asked and what the asker expects (Position 9). Next, interpret Cards 1 and 2 as the current main impulse, whereby Card 1 is always the first impulse and Card 2 shows the additional theme that complements, hinders, or promotes it.

Observe what is consciously seen (Position 3) in the process and how it is anchored in the unconscious (Position 4). This position is particularly important. Whatever is rooted here will also weather the worst storms. But if there is a difficult card with problematic roots here, this will have an adverse effect, even if the rest of the cards have a favorable message. Then examine the attitude of the asker toward the topic (Position 7), the external influences or the surrounding environment (Position 8) before you conclude with the prognostic cards in Positions 6 and 10.

# THE CROSS



Statement	Evaluating a situation, suggestion and trend development.
Degree of difficulty	1
Cards to draw	4
Typical questions	What is the status of my work, my relationship, or my plans? How should I behave?
Special characteristics	The simplest way of letting the cards evaluate something.

The Cross is one of the most simple, yet interesting of all the card-laying systems. It gives a short, succinct statement that frequently indicates a valuable direction. At the same time, it can be used in very versatile ways. If you are still largely unfamiliar with the 78 tarot cards and their number is confusing to you, you can use this spread by limiting yourself to just the 22 cards of the major arcana. The cards are laid as follows:

# THE MEANING OF THE VARIOUS CARD POSITIONS

- 1 = It deals with this.
- 2 = You should not do this.
- 3 = You should do this.
- 4 = This is where it leads, this is what it is good for.

### HOW TO READ THE SPREAD


Start with Card 1, which sometimes triggers a true "aha" experience, but just gives insignificant information to others. Next, it is especially important to work out the difference between Cards 2 and 3 because they express the actual advice of the cards. For similar cards, it is precisely the subtle difference that can contain the essential points of the message. In conclusion, read the card in Position 4 to find out where the development is heading (in the near future).

#### VARIATIONS

You can use the same card-laying system if you do not understand a card you have read. You should then mix all the cards again and lay them according to this method with the question: What is the meaning of card X as it was laid last time? In this case, the positions have the following meaning:

- 1 = It deals with this.
- 2 = The card does not mean this.
- 3 =It means this.
- 4 = It serves this purpose, this is what it is good for.

# THE NEXT STEP



Statement	Suggestion as to what should be done next.
Degree of difficulty	1
Cards to draw	4
Typical questions	What is my next step?
Special characteristics	The card-laying method for frequently asking questions of the cards. Ideal for letting the tarot lead you to a goal you have set.

Whenever you would like to let the tarot guide you to a goal or if you are looking for a guide to lead you around tricky corners, choose this card-laying method. It doesn't show where the path ultimately leads, but what you should do next. Since the message of the cards is always related to a brief period of time, usually no more than 14 days, this approach is most suited for themes where you want to lay the cards more frequently to get new ideas time and again. In addition, the tarot may also tell you when you should lay the cards again.

# THE MEANING OF THE VARIOUS CARD POSITIONS

- 1 = The initial situation; where the asker stands right now.
- 2 = This isn't important yet. This doesn't need to be feared or hoped for at the moment.
- 3 = Only this is important.
- 4 = This is where the next step leads. As soon as this experience occurs, it is time to lay the cards again.

# HOW TO READ THE SPREAD

Cards 1 and 4 show the beginning and end of the next step. However, excessive importance should not be given to Card 4. It primarily tells you when the cards should be laid the next time, meaning when the step described here has been completed. This is the moment in which the experience shown by Position 4 has been had, even if it just lasts for a few minutes. The most important card is found in Position 3. It shows what should be observed during the entire time frame—what will truly help you progress. In a certain sense, Card 2 is a warning, since any energy flowing in this direction is wasted. The experience shown here is quite certain not to occur during *this* step.

# THE FOOL'S GAME

In a simple progression of cards, The Fool's Game reflects the chronological course of a matter. At the same time, it shows where the asker currently stands within this development, what the asker has already experienced, and what still lies ahead. This is why this spread is more suitable than any other for the observation of farreaching developments. Because the individual positions have no given interpretation of their own, and every card builds solely upon the previous one, it is in some cases difficult to read these cards. A further complicating factor is that each card indicates a different time frame than another card. It illustrates the order of the experiences, but not the time required for the individual steps. The main difficulty in interpretation, however, lies in the frequently encountered obsession that the development of our lives must somehow take a logical course. In contrast, The Fool's Game frequently shows our contradictions, regressions, new beginnings, and all our false paths and detours.

# Lay the cards as follows:

First take The Fool out of the deck. Then shuffle and spread the remaining 77 cards like a fan. The asker then draws 12 of the cards, and mixes The Fool in with them. After the asker has decided whether to uncover the cards "from above" or "from below," <sup>5</sup> all 13 cards are spread out next to each other.

# THE MEANING OF THE VARIOUS CARD POSITIONS

The Fool characterizes the respective point of the present. All the cards that lie behind him (to the left) show past developments, and the cards ahead of him indicate the future. If The Fool comes up as the first card, this means that the asker is still at the beginning of a development or is making a new start. As the last card, The Fool shows that the asker is at the end of this development or at least at the end of an important period of experience.

#### HOW TO READ THE SPREAD

First look at the cards to the left of The Fool, for these are the past experiences. Then read the cards about the future. Don't let yourself be irritated by relapses or apparent contradictions. Also, don't make the mistake of wanting to attribute the same period of time to each card. Instead, take into consideration that cards following each other may also belong together and may be experienced at the same time.

Special characteristics	In this way of laying the cards, the cards are drawn by both partners at the same time.		

In addition to its often surprising expressive value, this card-laying method often has the effect of sparking a helpful discussion between partners. Since this spread can be done with just the 22 cards of the major arcana, it is well suited for tarot beginners.

Each of the two partners simultaneously draws three cards in a row and presents them to the other person. When turning over the individual cards, the respective partner says:

- 1A = This is how I see you.
- 1B = This is how I see you.
- 2A = This is how I see me.
- 2B = This is how I see me.
- 3A = This is how I see our relationship.
- 3B = This is how I see our relationship.

# HOW TO READ THE SPREAD

One special feature of this card-laying method is determining the quintessence on all three levels. Calculate it once from all the cards as the exhortation to both of the partners; then add it up as advice for each of them individually from the three cards that they have drawn themselves.

# THE PLAN GAME



Statement	Suggestions for attaining a goal.			
Degree of difficulty	2			
Cards to draw	5			
Typical questions	How can I attain my goal? How can I achieve more order/satisfaction/money, etc.? How can I win him/her for myself?			
Special characteristics	For the two most important positions of this card-laying method, you will find preformulated interpretive text in the card section.			

With The Plan Game, a certain plan is illuminated by the cards for they show whether or not (and how) a desired wish can become reality. Draw 5 cards for this purpose.


# THE MEANING OF THE VARIOUS CARD POSITIONS

- 1 = The significator. A characteristic statement or important thought about this plan.
- 2 = The asker's (unconscious) driving force.
- 3 = External objections or encouragement.
- 4 = This is how it won't succeed.
- 5 = This is how it will succeed.

#### HOW TO READ THE SPREAD

Start with Position 1 in order to recognize the general state of the matter or what information the tarot will give the asker in advance. Position 2 then shows you what motivates the asker; Position 3 is the echo, the support, or the resistance that comes from the outside. You can use the card descriptions found in the interpretive text to read the outcome. Use the "Warns Against" section for Position 4 and "Encourages" for Position 5. Positions 4 and 5 are very decisive positions in this spread.

# THE DOOR



Statement	Pictorial description of a threshold that lies before us.			
Degree of difficulty	4			
Cards to draw	11			
Typical questions	What should I expect to find behind the next door, threshold, challenge, etc.? Should I risk a certain step? What is waiting for me?			
Special characteristics	This card-laying method provides a very pictorial answer and is therefore especially well suited for an intuitive interpretation.			

This system of laying the cards is particularly good for intuitive card-readers who don't like to be bound by narrow statements of meaning. However, precisely because of the wealth of images involved in this method, it requires a certain amount of practice. This makes it less suitable for beginners.

# THE MEANING OF THE VARIOUS CARD POSITIONS

- 1 = The name of the door; this is what it is about.
- 2 = The keyhole; a first idea of what is behind the door.
- 3 = The lock; this has held the door closed up until now.
- 4 = The knob; you need it to open the door.
- 5 = This leads to the door.
- 6 = Hopes and fears; the asker's expectations regarding what could be behind the door.
- 7 = The asker's attitude toward the door.
- 8 = What is actually behind the door.
- 9 = Where the door can be found.
- 10 = What happens when the door is opened.
- 11 = The key to the door, which should fit into the lock (3).

Note: We don't have to go through every door. The cards can also warn us about a trapdoor. Then you should keep the key in a safe place.

# HOW TO READ THE SPREAD

The name of the door is just the outer view of it and corresponds with the head-lines above a newspaper article. The keyhole (2) provides the details. However, the most important card for what is to come lies in Position 8. It shows where the path through this door will lead in the long run. On the other hand, Position 10 shows more of a short-term feeling or experience in crossing this threshold. First read these positions so you can decide whether it is good to open this door. Positions 6 and 7 reflect the asker's purely subjective expectations. Examine whether these will be justified or disappointed. Compare Position 6 with Position 8 (long-term perspectives) and Position 7 with Position 10 (short-term experiences). Important preconditions for reaching the door are found in Positions 4, 5, and 9—and, last but not least, in Position 11. This opens the lock (Position 3) that has kept the door closed up until now.

# THE PATH



Statement	The best way to achieve a goal.		
Degree of difficulty	3		
Cards to draw	7		
Typical questions	What can I do to achieve X, Y, or Z? How can I find living quarters, a partner for life, a good job, etc.?		
Special characteristics	The card-laying method that shows opportunities and perspectives, as well as how to attain them.		

The Path shows the possibilities for achieving a desired goal, how the asker has behaved up to this point, and what he or she should do (instead) in the future.

# THE MEANING OF THE VARIOUS CARD POSITIONS

1 = This is what it's about. This can be achieved.

The left column shows the previous behavior on the following levels:

2 = Conscious attitude and rational behavior. What the asker has thought, what has been assumed up until now.

- 3 = Unconscious attitude, emotional behavior, wishes, desires, hopes, and fears. What the asker feels or has felt up to now.
- 4 = Outer stance. The effect the asker has on others and the impression made on others. Also possibly his or her facade.

The right column shows suggestions for future behavior, through which this goal can be achieved. The meanings correspond with Positions 2, 3, and 4:

- 7 = Conscious attitude. Suggest a new way of looking at things.
- 6 = Emotional stance. Suggest feelings the asker should open up to.
- 5 = Outer stance. This is how the asker should act, what he or she should do and make known to others.

### HOW TO READ THE SPREAD

First, evaluate the prospects shown by the card in Position 1. Does the plan seem promising? Would this path be worth taking? If not, then the desired goal either cannot be attained or perhaps this isn't the right time for this plan. Then the question should be asked again at another time. However, if the goal is worth striving for, consider the individual levels in order to learn where changes are necessary and advisable, as well as to what degree they should be made. For this purpose, compare Cards 2 and 7, 3 and 6, as well as 4 and 5. Special emphasis should be given to the card in Position 6 because it shows in concrete terms what the asker should do.



## KEYWORDS FOR INTERPRETATION





### Introduction

f the meaning of each individual tarot card could be reduced to one single concept, the pictures would be superfluous and the cards could just bear one word, such as "Happiness," "Bad Luck," "Fear," "Courage," "Gain," or "Loss." But since a picture is known to say more than a thousand words, the message of each card is more diverse than can be comprehended through its name or a catchword. The key to its meaning is found in the rich symbolism of the card. Since Aleister Crowley studied the esoteric or secret teachings from the East, as well as the esoteric traditions of the West, and was very knowledgeable about a great variety of spiritual schools, it is no wonder that a highly complex symbolism flowed into these cards. Consequently, this deck has a special intensity. In order to make the complex messages understandable, all the card interpretations begin by explaining the symbols.

Yet, it is the nature of symbols to be ambiguous. A circle can symbolize both "zero"—nothing—or something that includes everything. But this doesn't mean that symbols can be interpreted in whatever way we desire. The tarot deck created by Aleister Crowley and Lady Frieda Harris only serves to demonstrate how consistently the message of the cards can be expressed on a great many levels.

Only by translating the symbolism can we understand why the meaning of the Crowley cards clearly deviates from other tarot decks, and why both interpretations can still be correct. When, for example, the number 2 stands for polarity, its spectrum of interpretation ranges from attraction to uniformity to friction, rivalry and enmity. We could also say it ranges from twosomeness to twins to doubt, discord, and dissension. If we combine these two themes with the fire element, which is represented by the Wands in the tarot, various interpretation possibilities are easier to understand. If two burning logs are placed on top of each other, they burn more intensely. If, on the other hand, they are pulled apart, their firepower is weakened, perhaps even extinguished. This is the reason for the contrary messages of the Two of Wands, which are crossed in the Crowley cards and mean "an eagerness to fight," or "strength of will." By way of contrast, they stand parallel to each other in the Waite Tarot and symbolize neutrality, half-heartedness, and indifference.

Since the minor arcana can also be understood using the combined interpretation of number and element, we have added this section to all the number cards in the interpretive section that follows. However, the extensive symbolism of a number, as expressed in the major arcana, should not be sought here. In the minor arcana, the numbers' meaning is lessened; it is an individual aspect from the number spectrum. Table 3 on pages 68–69 shows how numbers are expressed through the minor arcana.

The astrological classifications of the Crowley cards appear peculiar at times. They are based on the traditions of the Order of the Golden Dawn, to which both Aleister Crowley and Arthur Edward Waite belonged. We have translated the astrological symbols in such a way that the meaning of the card always is visible, even if the same symbols would often be understood in a different way today without the relationship to the respective card. We have accepted Crowley's interpretation of the Hebrew letters associated with the major arcana without any comments.

The interpretation of color also causes some confusion. As enriching as it may be in many cases, there is also a contradictory basis for it, since opposing classifications are found in different cultures. Even within the same tradition, there is a broad range of interpretative possibility. In the West, for example, blue (as the color of the Virgin Mary) represents mercy, humility, chastity, and faithfulness; but it can also represent the intellect, wisdom, and truth. Sometimes it is the depth of the sea, sometimes the cool heights of the heavens. But the dark blue of the sea cannot simply be ascribed to Mary alone because her name means "from the sea," while sky-blue is equated with intellectual flights of fancy. As the Queen of Heaven, heavenly blue can naturally be classified just as easily with the Virgin Mary. Despite this sometimes-confusing complexity of meaning, the color symbolism naturally also opens excellent access to the meaning of the cards.




### Example 1



n the basis of The Plan Game layout, the following example shows how the interpretive texts in this book can be used to read the cards.

The asker had been in a deep emotional crisis for a long time. She wanted to use the cards to find out what she should do to find joy in life. She drew the following cards:



#### THE INTERPRETATION:

1st card = Significator = Seven of Disks (Failure)

The significator provides important information for the question. In view of the theme, we should look under the heading of "Consciousness" to learn the meaning of the Seven of Disks. There we find: "Insight into transient and threatening aspects of life."

2nd card = The force driving the asker = Two of Wands (Dominion)

In addition to the encouraging statement, "Eagerness to fight, courage, and willingness to take risks" as the general meaning of the card, the heading "Consciousness" is also important. Here it says: "Recognizing destructive processes as the precondition for creative phases."

3rd card = Outer objections or encouragement = Four of Disks (Power)

The asker experiences stability and structure, as well as perhaps control, from the outside world.

4th card = This is how it will not succeed = Prince of Wands

The Prince of Wands shows what the asker shouldn't do, the approach that won't allow her to succeed in overcoming her depression. This card's meaning can be read under the heading "Warns Against": "Spontaneous satisfaction of desires at expense of long-term goals."

5th card = This is how it will succeed = Five of Wands (Strife)

On the other hand, she will master her crisis by following the suggestion made by the Five of Wands. Its meaning can be read under the heading "Encourages": "Risking something new and facing the competition."

#### OVERVIEW OF THE READING:


The chances seem good. The initial card (Failure) shows the source of this crisis very clearly. Fortunately, the driving force (Dominion) is strong. The support from outside (Power) is positive and stabilizing, and the warning (Prince of Wands) that short-term pleasure gains will not bring a solution, is extremely illuminating. The guiding advice (Strife) immediately makes sense to the asker; this challenge to be willing to risk something new additionally receives valuable support through the 2nd card (Dominion), which shows that the asker inwardly feels pushed in exactly that direction.

#### Quintessence

The sum of all the cards is 18 and therefore leads to The Moon (XVIII) and The Hermit (IX) as the quintessence. This means that the concluding advice of the tarot is: "Take the path of fear in a cautious but decisive manner. Look for the silver lining (Moon). While doing so, don't let yourself be influenced or irritated by anyone, but stay true to yourself (Hermit)."

### Example 2

The next example shows how unambiguous the tarot can be when asked decision questions. The asker, who had already commuted for years between Vienna and Munich, laid The Decision Game spread in order to learn whether he should move in with his girlfriend in Munich at some point during the next twelve months. The cards responded as follows:



#### THE INTERPRETATION:

7th card = Significator = The Fool

"New beginning" and "starting off into the unknown" are among the key words for this card. This isn't surprising in view of the question. In terms of one's profession, The Fool can mean "starting at zero," but on the level of partnership it can represent "feelings of spring." The asker could easily connect all of these themes with a possible move.

The 3rd, 1st, and 5th cards show what will happen if he moves to Munich.

3rd card = Two of Wands (Dominion)

Courage and a willingness to take risks are at the beginning of this path. As a professional consequence of the move, this card means facing new challenges. On the personal level, in addition to a highly charged atmosphere, it may also mean some friction and struggling for position.

1st card = The Magus

He shows mastery on all levels and therefore reveals that the beginning challenges will soon be handled in a skillful way.

5th card = The Universe

The meaning of "being at the right place" and the fact that The Universe is also a signal card<sup>1</sup> makes it clear that the long-term prospects are also extremely good. These cards clearly point to Munich in an unmistakable manner. It could hardly be more clear. (Incidentally, in order to counter the possible skepticism of some doubters, these cards were authentically laid in this manner. This is not an imaginary example!)

The 4th, 2nd, and 6th cards show what will happen if he stays in Vienna.

4th card = Ten of Swords (Ruin)

The end or break that this card signifies can have a number of meanings. A typical meaning for the Ten of Swords in this position is that the failure of the upper path will be experienced as an arbitrary, if not even brutal, step. However, it can also mean that the lower path cannot be taken without difficulty but begins with a sudden clash. This would correspond to an unexpected or involuntary event in Vienna. Moreover, the card could also warn that the decision against Munich would result in the failure of the relationship. But the next card makes this interpretation seem unlikely.

2nd card = Six of Disks (Success)

"Harmonious interplay of the forces," means that welcome developments will occur in Vienna after an initial hardship. However—in view of the following cards—these will not last long.

6th card = Five of Cups (Disappointment)

The lower path means nothing good in the long run. It is headed for disappointed expectations, disappearing hopes, and painful perceptions.

#### SUMMARY AND QUINTESSENCE:

In addition to the clear recommendation of taking the more promising path and moving to Munich, the cards also give an indication of how this decision should be made. As a quintessence, their sum (45) leads to The Hermit, whose advice is: "Go within yourself to find out what you really want. Don't let yourself be influenced by anyone. Collect your forces before you risk the step into something new."



### Glossary

**Arcana:** Plural of the Latin word *Arcanum* = secret. Name for all the tarot cards, which are subdivided into the major and minor arcana.

Ace: The first card of each suit, which corresponds to the number 1.

**Color Suits:** The four suits of the minor arcana, consisting respectively of 14 cards with the same symbols (Wands, Cups, Swords, or Disks).

**Court Cards:** Princess, Prince, Queen, and Knight. The cards of the Minor Arcana named according to the court of the King.

Cup: The tarot symbol corresponding to the water element.

Deck: A complete tarot set with 78 cards.

**Disk:** The tarot symbol corresponding to the earth element. Also called Coins or Pentacles in other tarot decks.

**Major Arcana:** The 22 cards, also called trumps, that show individual motifs and bear a name (The Fool, The Magus, The High Priestess, etc.) These are numbered from 0 to XXI.

**Minor Arcana:** The 56 cards that include the four color suits (Wands, Cups, Swords, and Disks) of 14 cards each.

**Number Cards:** The ten cards of each color suit, numbered from 1 to 10, whereby the Ace corresponds with the 1.

**Quintessence:** The concluding advice when the cards are laid. Result of adding all the cards that have been turned over. (See page 28)

**Reversed Cards:** Cards that are uncovered upside-down while laying the cards. Some card-readers attribute a different meaning to them than when the cards turned over in the proper direction. (See page 27)

**Significator:** The card at the center in "The Relationship Game" or "The Decision Game," for example. It shows the current status of the relationship or question being asked. In addition, some card-readers use this as a symbol of the asker's selected card, which is laid next to the cards or beneath the first card, at the start of laying the cards.

Suits: See Color Suits.

Keywords for the Crowley Tarot

**Sword:** The tarot symbol corresponding to the air element.

Trump Cards: See Major Arcana.

Upside-Down Cards: See Reversed Cards.

Wand: The tarot symbol corresponding to the fire element.

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
