Although, as is known, a few transcripts were made at the time to be given as presents to crowned heads, only one other complete copy is known, that in the National Library of Paris not being merely incomplete but also in a bad state, and that in the Imperial Library at the Hermitage in Russia, although preserved as a gem, likewise imperfect. The Poem in French at the commencement contains in twenty pages the HISTORY OF THE DUTCHY OF BRITANNY.


