## *The Incredible (but true) Saga of The Pratum Book Company, continued...*

When we last left our story I was in the process of founding an alternative elementary school that mixed some of the homeless kids I work with, with “regular” kids, and then give them full control over their educational pursuits and interests, much like a “free school” of the 1960’s but with a firm grounding in radical pedagogical theory, (mainly Steiner, Neill, Reich, Jung, Holt, Gatto, Illich, and the Nature Study Movement). Well, the Pratum School & Library came very close to getting off the ground, and though I haven’t given up on it by any means, I did have to give up on the space it was housed in. And that space, a cavernous warehouse with shelving 17’ tall, also housed my book business, my library, and most of my 40,000 volumes of stock. Since then my stock has been in a storage, thus preventing me from issuing catalogs. So during the last year, I’ve focused on my work with homeless kids; bringing them free books (\$400,000 worth so far), and free libraries (16 and counting); doing “book shows” that feature my “Traveling Library and Book Museum” (“step right up kids!”); and creating a literacy program for the Oakland School District who I hope will carry on my work. Recently, (about the time I realized I would never be able to find a space large enough and cheap enough to house my book stock), an agreement was made with Fields Book Store of San Francisco where I will consign my most of my stock, including all my rare books. A fair portion, including all the books in this catalog are already there.

Fields Book Store is one of the oldest independent bookstores in the west, and one of the oldest esoteric books stores in the world, having been located in the same tall narrow storefront on Polk Street for 75 years. It is also one of the last independent book stores of any kind that provides full personal service, meaning they will order any book for you, (old or new, here and abroad), they will keep track of your ‘wants’, and be able over time to offer you new titles in your areas of interest. David Wiegleb, the new owner since 2001, is committed to continuing the old fashioned service that Fields has always been known for. Never in my life would I have trusted anybody to take care of and watch-over my stock, but David’s integrity, and his commitment to the ideals of the book business, ideals that we both hold in common, and his emphasis not on new age, but on “old age” books easily convinced me that there could be no better place for my books. In addition Fields will do all my order fulfillment for my catalogs. This enables me to have more time to buy and do the actual cataloging. And now with David’s stock available to me I can offer my customers not just mine but also Fields’ which is heavy on new scholarly books on ancient and medieval traditions, along with the best new esoteric & spiritual studies and a growing selection of old & rare books. Currently the Hermetic Library that I have been building is partly shelved here in my Oakland apartment (about 10,000 volumes), and the rest still in storage waiting for adjudication by the gods. Old customers are welcome to visit the library and me here in Oakland. Thanks to everybody for your orders large and small.

### *Pratum Literacy Services*

I recently read a passage in the *Rigveda* about beggars, how the beauty of giving to a beggar is not that you are helping the beggar out (you may not be) but that the beggar gives you, you personally a chance to give and to be generous. I’m not begging but I am still taking donations for the homeless kids I work with, either in the form of books or gift cards, or checks if you prefer. So instead of buying a bunch of barely-considered and soon-to-be-forgotten Christmas knick-knacks, or some expensive bauble or digital gizmo, *why not buy books for homeless kids*. Most have none, (many have never owned a book), and we all know what a gift books are! I work with most of the big shelters but especially two, the Henry Robinson Multi-Services Center in downtown Oakland where there are about a hundred kids on an average night, (babies to teens but mostly under 12); and DreamCatcher, a homeless teen drop-in center and emergency shelter. If you want to mail me books I’ll take any and all that you have, on any subject, or I can pick them out for you if you buy a gift card or send a check. Specific title requests are welcome, and in that way you can share your favorite titles with them. You can send me gift cards from one of the chains or Amazon but better than that you can purchase gift cards from Fields and I will use them for children’s books. And Fields will discount their profit on every kid purchase. Thank you one-and-all! By December I will have a web site up with photos of the kids and libraries I have built in the shelters and group homes over the last four years. Donations fully tax-deductible. For example by holding somebody's small possession in hand a 'psychometrist' could tell you some things about the health and character of that person. It was Buchanan who coined the term psychometry. This led him to so many new ideas about reality and physiology that he quit his job as president of the Eclectic Medical Institute to research and write full time. Buchanan's discovery of psychometry began with a conversation he had with General Polk (Episcopal Bishop Leonidas), who described his curious sensitivity to metals. When he touched for example brass in the dark he instantly knew it was brass because he could taste it in his mouth, a scientific impossibility. Mukherji’s work is an excellent compliment to White’s as White is concerned with the historical, scholarly aspects while Mukherji’s book is a practical one, and of great detail. Therefore *The Wealth of Indian Alchemy* will be of special value for herbalists, laboratory alchemists and those interested in archaic (but still living) plant and mineral traditions and ayurveda. Hermetic science was born in India. The later developments in Egypt and Greece and China all owe their seed to India, and there was undoubtedly much more contact in the ancient world than is now generally recognized. Famous guest lecturers such as Mark Twain and psychologist Alfred Adler taught courses there. Interpretive dance inspired by Isadora Duncan was taught, and Institute students danced with the Boyntons at the Temple of Wings and with Duncan colleague Vassos Kanellos at the Hearst Greek Theater. One of the students, Helen Bacon Hooper, went on to dance with Martha Graham. The Williams Institute's most celebrated alumnus was probably Irving Wallace (1916–1990), author of The Chapman Report. The school occupied the mansion for five decades. In 1975, the Spring estate was purchased by real-estate investor Larry Leon, who made the mansion his home for the next thirty years. He sold the property to a consortium of investors in 2005. The John Hopkins Spring Estate was designated a City of Berkeley Landmark on 3 July 2000. It is listed in the California State Historic Resources Inventory. This is a curious work, with esoteric chapters on the spiral shape, and ones justifying the Great War as a "triumph of Christianity".
