Narrative of Offense:

At approximately 1:45 p.m., Monday, March 30, 1981, President Ronald W. Reagan departed the White House enroute to the Washington Hilton Hotel, 1919 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., where he was scheduled to deliver a speech to an assembly of AFL-CIO union members. The President arrived at the Hilton at 1:50 p.m., and began his speech to the union members at approximately 2:00 p.m. The President's speech concluded at approximately 2:20 p.m., and the President prepared to exit the hotel. Among others in his official party were Press Secretary James Brady and United States Secret Service Agent Timothy McCarthy, who was part of the Presidential Protective detail. Police Officer Thomas Delahanty was assigned outside of the hotel near the VIP entrance.

John Warnock Hinckley, Jr., date of birth May 29, 1955, at Ardmore, Oklahoma, home address of [REDACTED] Evergreen, Colorado, arrived in Washington via Greyhound Bus at 12:15 p.m., Sunday, March 29, 1981. He had purchased his bus ticket to Washington, D. C. on March 26, 1981, at Hollywood, California, paying \$117.80 in cash. (b)(7)(c)

After arriving in Washington, D. C., Hinckley registered at the Park Central Hotel, Washington, D. C., at 1:00 p.m. He paid \$47.00 in cash for one night. Later, Sunday afternoon, Hinckley was observed near the fence of the South Lawn of the White House. Hinckley was alone and asked several tourists if the President was in the White House that weekend and inquired where somebody could go to see the President. He was told that the front of the White House was possibly a better location to see the President.

On Monday morning, March 30, 1981, Hinckley, at approximately 8:00 a.m., had breakfast alone at a Washington, D. C. sandwich shop. The maid at the Park Central Hotel saw Hinckley in his hotel room at approximately 1:00 p.m.

At 1:50 p.m., Hinckley was observed standing in a crowd behind a rope barrier near a retaining wall a short distance from the VIP entrance to the Washington Hilton Hotel.

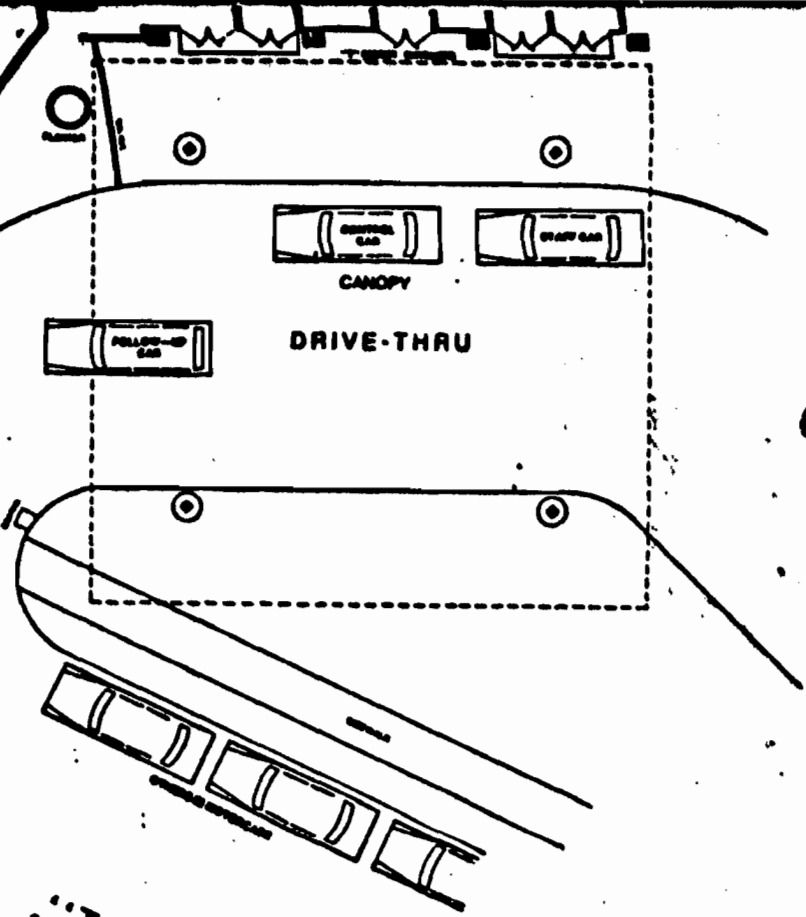
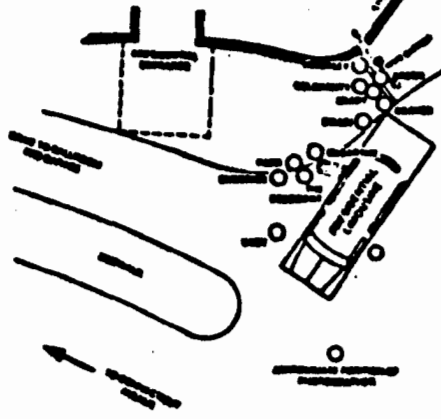
At 2:25 p.m., the President exited the Washington Hilton Hotel through the VIP entrance and walked to his limousine, which was parked approximately 50 feet from the entrance. Slightly ahead of the President and to his left, were, in addition to others, Secret Service Agent McCarthy, Press Secretary Brady, and Washington, D. C. Police Officer Delahanty. As the President approached the right front fender of his limousine, six shots from a handgun were fired in rapid succession from the area to the front and left of the President behind the rope barrier near the retaining wall. President Reagan was struck in the left chest area by a bullet that ricocheted off of the right rear quarter panel of his limousine. Press Secretary Brady was struck by a bullet that entered his brain above his left eye. Secret Service Agent McCarthy was hit in the abdomen by one round, and one round hit Officer Delahanty in the neck. One round passed over the limousine and through a glass window of a nearby building, and one round struck the right rear glass window of the limousine. The six shots were fired in 1.7 seconds at a distance of approximately 15 feet from the President.

John Hinckley was immediately subdued by Secret Service Agents and officers of the Metropolitan and Park Police Departments. A .22 caliber revolver with six spent casings was dropped to the ground by Hinckley. This weapon had been purchased by Hinckley October 13, 1980, in Dallas, Texas.

Following the shooting, President Reagan was taken by limousine to the George Washington University Hospital. Brady and McCarthy were transported by ambulance to George Washington University Hospital and Delahanty was taken by ambulance to the Washington Hospital Center.

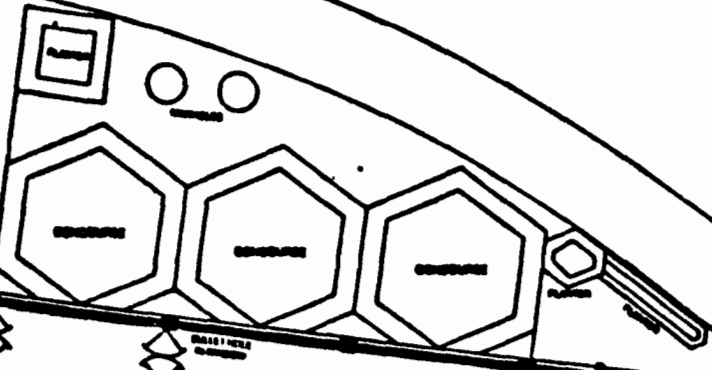
Hinckley was taken in a police cruiser to the Metropolitan Police Department, where he was turned over to the FBI and charged with the attempted assassination of the President (Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 1751 (c)) and assault on a Secret Service Agent (Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 111).

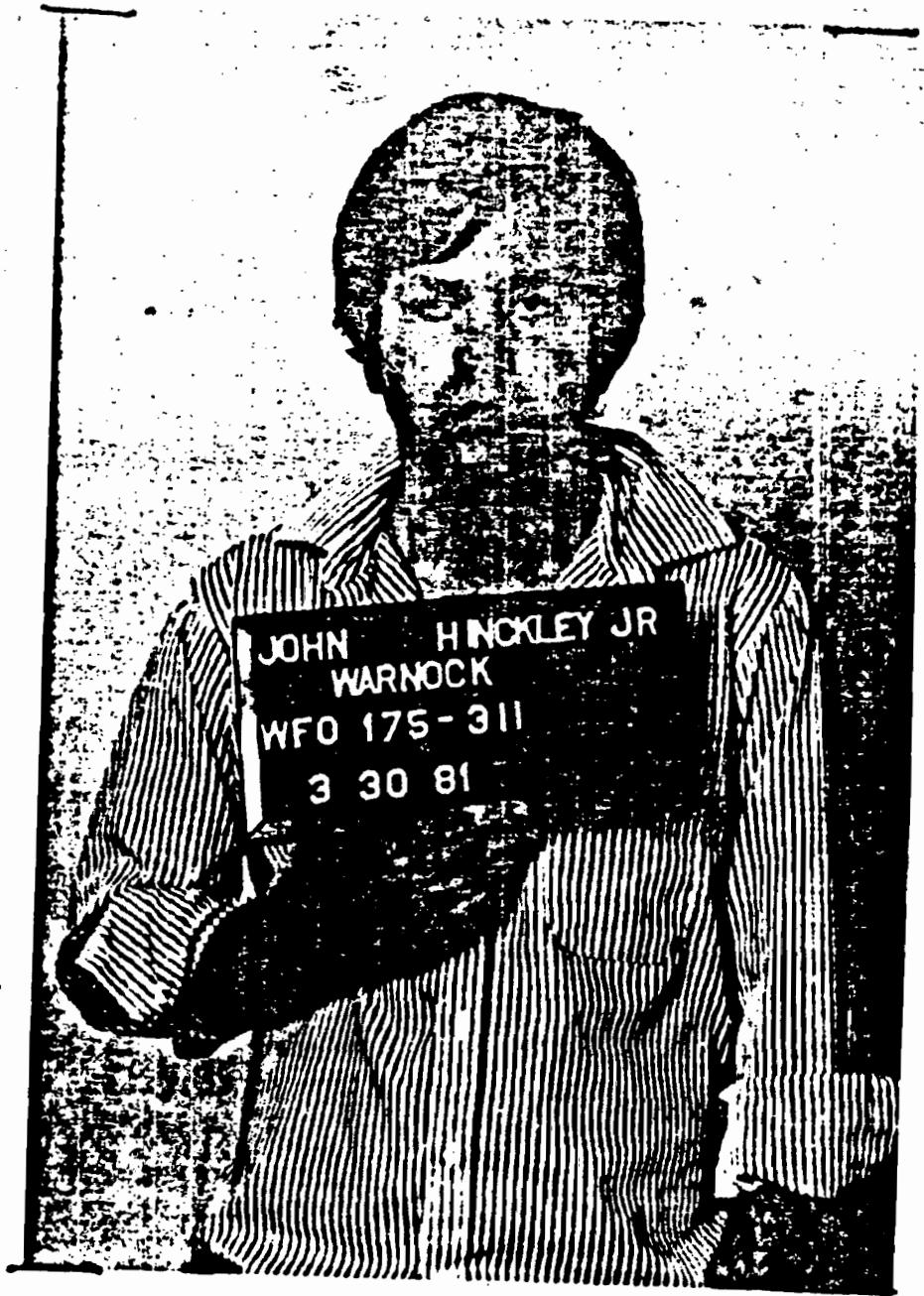

PROSECUTIVE ACTION

1. Contact with U.S. Attorney

a. United States Attorney contact regarding the arrest of John W. Hinckley, 3/30/81.

(b)(7)(c):(F)

Immediately following the attempted assassination of President Ronald Reagan at 2:25 p.m., 3/30/81, at the Washington Hilton Hotel, 1919 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. (WDC), John Warnock Hinckley, white male, date of birth 5/29/55, was subdued by agents of the U.S. Secret Service and officers of the WDC Metropolitan Police Department (MPD). He was transported in a MPD police cruiser to the MPD Headquarters, Central Cell Block, 300 Indiana Avenue, N.W., WDC. Present in the cruiser during trip to police headquarters were Hinckley, MPD Officer [REDACTED] and Secret Service (SS) Agents [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. At Central Cell Block, Hinckley was searched and verbally advised of his Constitutional Rights by Agents [REDACTED] and witnessed by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. After processing in Central Cell Block, Hinckley was taken upstairs to MPD Homicide Squad. He was advised of his rights by MPD Officer [REDACTED] and Hinckley signed an MPD Warning and Waiver Form at 3:10 p.m. Hinckley was not interviewed at this time but was placed in a holding cell. SS advised MPD not to talk to or touch subject.

At approximately 2:30 p.m., 3/30/81, Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) Roger Adelman and Thomas Roberts, U.S. Attorney's Office, WDC, arrived at MPD Headquarters. Adelman had been advised of the assassination attempt through a telephone call at approximately 2:30 p.m., from Detective [REDACTED] MPD. Shortly thereafter, AUSA Donald Campbell arrived at police headquarters. U.S. Attorney Charles F.C. Ruff upon being advised by MPD of the assassination attempt had dispatched these Assistant U.S. Attorneys to MPD Headquarters.

At 4:48 p.m., 3/30/81, Hinckley was turned over to custody of FBI, Washington Field Office (WFO) agents. At this time AUSAs Campbell and Adelman verbally authorized the FBI to formally arrest Hinckley for violation of Title 18, U.S. Code, Section 1751 (c), attempting to kill the President of the U.S. and for violation of Title 18, U.S. Code, Section 111, assault of Timothy McCarthy, Special Agent, USSS. At this time Hinckley was advised of these charges by Special Agents [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] WFO, FBI.

At 5:18 p.m., Hinckley was transported to WFO, FBI, where processing and interview took place. AUSAs Campbell, Adelman and Roberts accompanied Hinckley to FBI, WFO. During the time Hinckley was at WFO, AUSA Adelman arranged for Dr. [REDACTED] to come to WFO and examine Hinckley per Hinckley's request.

They also discussed with FBI agents Hinckley's request for a lawyer and telephonic contact was made with Attorney Joe Bates, Dallas, Texas, who recommended Attorney Vincent Fuller of the WDC law firm of Williams and Connley. AUSA Adelman also advised FBI that two court appointed attorneys, Edward Wilhite and Stewart Johnson had been appointed and would be arriving at WFO to consult with Hinckley. WFO interview with Hinckley terminated at 9:27 p.m. and Hinckley transported to U.S. Marshal, Central Cell Block at 10:28 p.m.

b. US Attorney Contact regarding search of Room 312, Park Central Hotel, Washington, D.C. (WDC), 3/10/81.

The following is a synopsis of the events that led to the request, procurement, service and return of a search warrant obtained from United States (US) Magistrate Arthur L. Burnett for Room 312 of the Park Central Hotel located at 705 18th Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. (WDC).

(b)(7)(c)

At approximately 5:45 p.m. on 3/30/81, SA [REDACTED] FBI, WFO, was advised by SA [REDACTED] that a search warrant would have to be obtained for Room 312 of the Park Central Hotel, the room occupied by Hinckley prior to his assault on the President. SA [REDACTED] advised that the preparation of the affidavit in support of the search warrant for Room 312 of the Park Central Hotel was to be coordinated with Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) E. Lawrence Barcella and other AUSA's of the US Attorney's Office, US District Court, WDC. SA [REDACTED] directed SA [REDACTED] to assist AUSA Barcella in obtaining information to establish probable cause for a search of the premises of Room 312 of the Park Central Hotel and to be prepared to be the affiant of the above mentioned warrant.

AUSA Barcella directed SA [REDACTED] to obtain eyewitness information regarding the assault on the President. This information was obtained by SA [REDACTED] from Officer [REDACTED] Third District, Metropolitan Police Department (MPD), WDC, in an interview that took place at Washington Field Office (WFO) with Officer [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised SA [REDACTED] that at approximately 2:25 p.m. on 3/30/81, while assisting in the President Protection detail at the Washington Hilton Hotel, located at 1919 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., WDC, he observed the subject, John W. Hinckley, Jr., fire shots in the direction of the President. [REDACTED] also provided information to SA [REDACTED] regarding the recovery of the Hotel Key to Room 312 of the Park Central Hotel.

SA [REDACTED] and SA [REDACTED] FBI, WFO, then departed WFO for the Office of AUSA Barcella. While at the AUSA's Office, additional information that was known by SA [REDACTED] or that had been provided to SA [REDACTED] by other law enforcement officers, including SA's of the FBI, SA's of the United States Secret Service (USSS) and Officers of the MPD, was incorporated into the affidavit in support of the search warrant for Room 312 of the Park Central Hotel. The affidavit was prepared by AUSA Barcella and approved by United States Attorney (USA) Charles F.C. Ruff.

At approximately 9:15 p.m., 3/30/81, SA [REDACTED] and AUSA Paul Murphy presented the above mentioned affidavit in support of the search warrant and the search warrant for Room 312 of the Park Central Hotel to US Magistrate Arthur L. Burnett.

It approximately 9:45 p.m., subsequent to a review of the above (b)(7)(c) mentioned documents by Magistrate Burnett, SA [redacted] swore to the facts presented in the affidavit. Magistrate Burnett signed the affidavit in support of the search warrant and the search warrant for Room 312 of the Park Central Hotel. V

AUSA Paul Murphy telephonically advised WFO of the signing of the search warrant by Magistrate Burnett at which time WFO contacted the Agents located at the Park Central Hotel. SA [redacted] and SA [redacted] then proceeded to the Park Central Hotel with the above mentioned documents.

At approximately 4:15 a.m., 3/31/81, at the conclusion of the search of Room 312, a copy of the above mentioned warrant and a copy of the inventory of items seized was left in Room 312. Later on 3/31/81, SA [redacted] returned the original warrant for Room 312 to Magistrate Burnett along with the original inventory of items seized during the search of Room 312 of the Park Central Hotel.

c. Contact with United States Attorney subsequent to 3/30/81

3/31/81

United States Attorney (USA) Charles F.C. Ruff, and Assistant USA's E. Lawrence Barcella and Roger Adelman, met with SA [REDACTED] at the USA's Office, Washington, D.C. (WDC), to discuss status of investigation. Immediate concern was to establish that John Hinckley acted alone in his attempt to assassinate President Reagan. Administrative procedures for issuing subpoenas and protection of evidence were discussed. General thrust of investigative procedure and direction was agreed upon.

4/1/81

USA Ruff and AUSA Robert Ogram, Reggie Walton, and Adelman met in USA's Office with FBI SA's [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and Secret Service Agent [REDACTED] and reviewed network video tapes of assassination attempt and discussed preliminary hearing to be held 4/2/81.

4/2/81

Prior to preliminary hearing USA Ruff and AUSA's Barcella and Adelman met with WFO ASAC Thomas Baker and SA's [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to discuss testimony at preliminary hearing.

4/4/81

At US Attorney's Office, USA Ruff and AUSA's Adelman and Barcella met with SA [REDACTED] and discussed investigative priorities and status of case to date. The importance of immediate interviews of Hinckley's family and associates was emphasized. SA [REDACTED] advised that day by day travel of Hinckley was being verified for the months immediately proceeding 3/30/81 and that all family members and associates, as they were developed were being interviewed.

4/7/81

AUSA Adelman and SA [REDACTED] met at FBI, WFO and discussed forthcoming psychiatric examinations of Hinckley and the fact that it would take ninety days to complete these examinations. Specific investigative results from Hilton Hotel, George Washington Hospital, Park Central Hotel was reviewed. Overview of investigation conducted by other FBI Field Officials was discussed.

4/8/81 US Attorney Ruff and AUSA Adelman met at WFO with SAC Theodore Gardner, ASAC Baker, and SA [REDACTED] to discuss status of investigation.

4/10/81 AUSA Adelman and SA [REDACTED] met at US Attorney's Office with witness [REDACTED] to discuss [REDACTED] recollection of his bus trip with Hinckley to WDC. Notes of [REDACTED] obtained.

4/11/81 AUSA Adelman met with SA's [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] at FBIHQ Laboratory to review evidence obtained from search at Hinckley's parent's residence in Evergreen, Colorado.

4/12/81 AUSA Adelman and SA [REDACTED] met at WFO to discuss additional witnesses that needed to be interviewed.

4/13/81 AUSA Adelman met with SA [REDACTED] at FBIHQ Laboratory and reviewed evidence obtained during search at Park Central Hotel, WDC.

4/14/81 AUSA Adelman met at Latent Fingerprint Section, FBIHQ, with SA [REDACTED] and reviewed fingerprint examination conducted on evidence.

4/17/81 USA Ruff, AUSA Adelman met at US Attorney's Office with SA [REDACTED] and discussed subpoenas that had been issued to date. Upcoming Grand Jury presentation was discussed.

4/20/81 SA [REDACTED] appeared before a Federal Grand Jury, WDC.

4/22/81 AUSA Adelman at WFO reviewed motion picture "Taxi."

4/24/81 AUSA Adelman met at WFO with SA [REDACTED] and discussed status of FBI Laboratory examinations. Need for additional witnesses for Grand Jury testimony was discussed.

2. Court Room Proceedings

On 3/30/81, at 10:55 p.m., before U.S. Magistrate Arthur Burnett, Special Agent (SA) [REDACTED] FBI, Washington Field Office (WFO), swore to facts and complaint charging Hinckley with violation Title 18, U.S. Code, Section 1751 (c), assaulting the President. Complaint attached. At the same time U.S. Secret Service (USSS) Agent [REDACTED] swore to facts and complaint charging Hinckley with violation Title 18, U.S. Code, Section 111, assaulting an officer of USSS. Complaint attached. Assistant U.S. Attorney (AUSA) E. Lawrence Barcella, coordinated filing of charges at U.S. District Court, Washington, D.C. (WDC).

At 11:52 p.m., 3/30/81, a hearing commenced before U.S. Magistrate Burnett at U.S. District Court, WDC. United States Attorney Charles F.C. Ruff represented the government and two court appointed attorneys Edward Wilhite and Stewart Johnson represented Hinckley. Hinckley was formerly charged with the attempted assassination of President Reagan and an assault on a Federal employee, SS Agent McCarthy. Magistrate Burnett, at the request of the government ordered Hinckley to undergo a psychiatric examination on 3/31/81, and to return for a preliminary hearing 4/2/81. Hinckley was held without bond. At 12:30 a.m., 3/31/81, this hearing was terminated. Hinckley was then transported by the FBI to the Marine Corp Base, Quantico, Virginia, where he was incarcerated.

Additionally, on 3/30/81, Magistrate Burnett issued a court order requiring that Hinckley submit to having blood, urine and hair samples taken and at a later time to produce handwriting samples and that they be delivered to the FBI. This order is attached.

Hair samples were obtained 8:10 p.m., 3/30/81, by Dr. [REDACTED] at WFO. Blood and urine samples obtained 10:37 p.m., 3/30/81, by Dr. [REDACTED] at U.S. Marshal's Office.

On 4/2/81; at 10:00 a.m., a preliminary hearing was held at U.S. District Court, WDC, before U.S. Magistrate Lawrence Margolis. Representing John W. Hinckley, Jr., was Vincent Fuller of the WDC law firm of Williams and Connely. U.S. Attorney Charles Ruff, Roger Adelman and E. Lawrence Barcella represented the government. SA [REDACTED] FBI, WFO, was prepared to testify for the government to establish probable cause that Hinckley did in fact shoot President Reagan and Secret Service (SS) Agent McCarthy. The government was also prepared to show major TV network videotapes of the attempted assassination.

The preliminary hearing was waived both orally and in written form by Hinckley.

In a report released by the court at this time, court (b)(7)(c) appointed psychiatrist Dr. [REDACTED] who had examined Hinckley, on 4/1/81, stated that Hinckley was mentally competent to stand trial.

Magistrate Margolis ruled favorably on the motion by the government to have Hinckley immediately committed to a Federal facility to undergo comprehensive mental examination. This order was appealed by the defense to U.S. District Court Judge William B. Bryant. Judge Bryant upheld the ruling by Magistrate Margolis allowing for a comprehensive mental examination and assured the defense attorneys that their psychiatric experts would have equal access to Hinckley.

By agreement with both prosecution and defense, due to security reasons, Hinckley was transported to Federal Correctional facilities, Butner, North Carolina.

**OVERVIEW OF INVESTIGATION
CONDUCTED TO DATE**

Investigation conducted to date by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) has established that beginning in September of 1980, John W. Hinckley, Jr. criss-crossed the United States on several occasions. His travels took him to the New York/New Haven area; Lubbock and Dallas, Texas; Lincoln, Nebraska; Columbus and Dayton, Ohio; Mexico; Los Angeles, California, and Washington, D.C. (WDC). The final phase of his travel which took him to WDC via Los Angeles began in Denver, Colorado, on March 25, 1981. Hinckley arrived in WDC on March 29, 1981.

The attempted assassination of the President of the United States took place on March 30, 1981, at approximately 2:25 p.m., outside the VIP entrance of the Washington Hilton Hotel, Connecticut and T Streets, N.W., WDC. There were approximately 285 people that were present at the scene of the crime, either viewing it from a window across the street or in the immediate area of the Presidential Party. Of these 285 interviewed, there were 29 that actually witnessed an individual fire the weapon at the President or saw the weapon in the hands of that same individual but some would not be able to identify him. There were 18 key witnesses.

The crime scene area was secured and manned by Metropolitan Police Department officers. A thorough search of the area was conducted, and all evidence was photographed, dated and initialed by the agent that recovered it. Of significance, the weapon used, .22 caliber revolver, Long Rifle, model RG 14, serial number L731332, with six spent cartridges intact; a bullet hole with residue on it from the right rear window of the Presidential limousine; the right rear quarter panel of Presidential limousine bearing possible bullet impact damage and a bullet hole in the window of the Universal Building located directly across the street.

President Ronald Reagan, Mr. James Brady, and Special Agent (SA) Timothy McCarthy, United States Secret Service (USSS), were transported from the Washington Hilton Hotel to the George Washington University Hospital, and Officer Thomas Delehanty, Metropolitan Police Department (MPD), to the Washington Hospital Center. All four victims were treated for gunshot wounds, and bullets or bullet fragments were recovered from each victim during surgery.

Obtained during a search, March 30-31, 1981, of Room 312, Park Central Hotel, WDC, rented by Hinckley, March 29, 1981, were numerous items of evidence which were turned over to FBI Laboratory for examination. Among numerous written items seized

was a letter written by Hinckley to Actress Jodie Foster, in which Hinckley expresses his love for Foster and states that he is going to kill President Reagan as an expression of love for Foster.

In the course of this investigation, items of evidentiary value were seized from the person of John Hinckley, the George Washington University Hospital, the Washington Hospital Center, the crime scene at the Washington Hilton, the Park Central Hotel, the Evergreen, Colorado residence, the Presidential limousine, the media, photographs taken by bystanders and other miscellaneous locations.

All items were examined for lead information and many items were then sent to the Federal Bureau of Investigation Laboratory Division and Identification Division, for proper investigative analysis. The results of such examinations are still pending in many instances and the reports of which will be set forth at a later date.

Analysis by the Laboratory Division and Identification Division concern the following areas: Signal Analysis Examinations, Document or Handwriting Examinations, Latent Fingerprint Examinations, and Scientific Analysis Examinations, which include such areas as Firearms Identification, Gunpowder and Primer Residue Examination, Point and Trajectory Examinations, Ammunition Component Examinations, Chemical Examinations, Blood Examinations, and Hair and Fiber Examinations.

Most of the evidence in this case has been stored and inventoried in a secure, safe and proper manner at the Washington Field Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, but some items do remain at the Federal Bureau of Investigation Laboratory and Identification Divisions, for further analysis and result.

Parents of Hinckley, his brother, and sister have been interviewed. Former associates and schoolmates of Hinckley, throughout the United States, have been located and interviewed. Jodie Foster, Actress, interviewed at Yale University. Efforts undertaken to establish subject's membership in any organizations.

WFO has gathered, and continues to gather, all available photographic evidence concerning the assault on the President. This material consists of television video tapes, motion picture film, and still photographs. FBI agent/photographers and MPD officers made numerous photographs of the crime scene as it existed immediately after the incident; of the crime scene area as the crime was reenacted on 3/30/81; of the crime scene as viewed from nearby rooftops and from a helicopter; and of the contents of Room 312, Park Central Hotel. WFO has subpoenaed witness photographs from all professional photographers identified as being at the scene. Some have been received; others remain outstanding. Some photographs have been received at WFO from witnesses to the incident who have voluntarily submitted their photos.

All photographic evidence is assigned a roll number when it arrives at WFO. This number is used to identify each roll. Within each roll each frame is assigned a unique number. Therefore, each picture has a totally unique number, and this number has been keyed and entered into the computer for purposes of organizing/sorting the photos by category.

One master set of photographs and the original negatives of those prints (if available) are stored in a combination safe at WFO. The master prints and negatives are afforded appropriate evidentiary security.

The photographic evidence listed hereafter is not inclusive. Other photographs are currently in processing at FBIHQ Laboratory Division or are otherwise not yet available to the FBI, WFO.



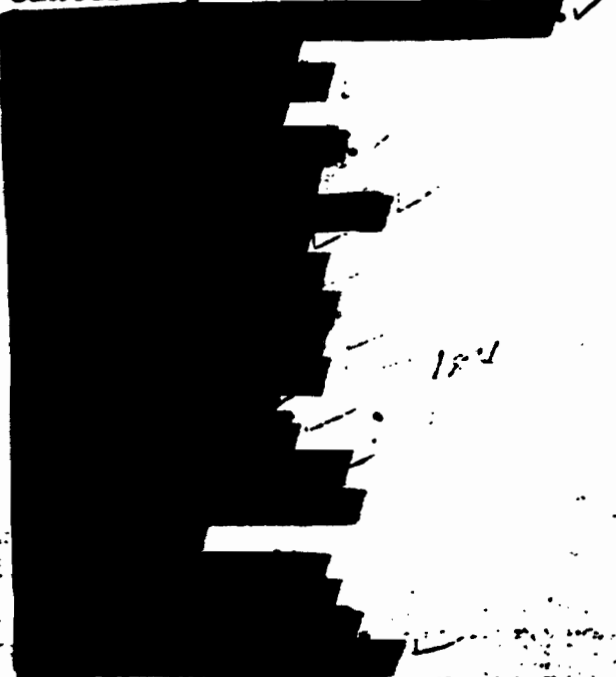

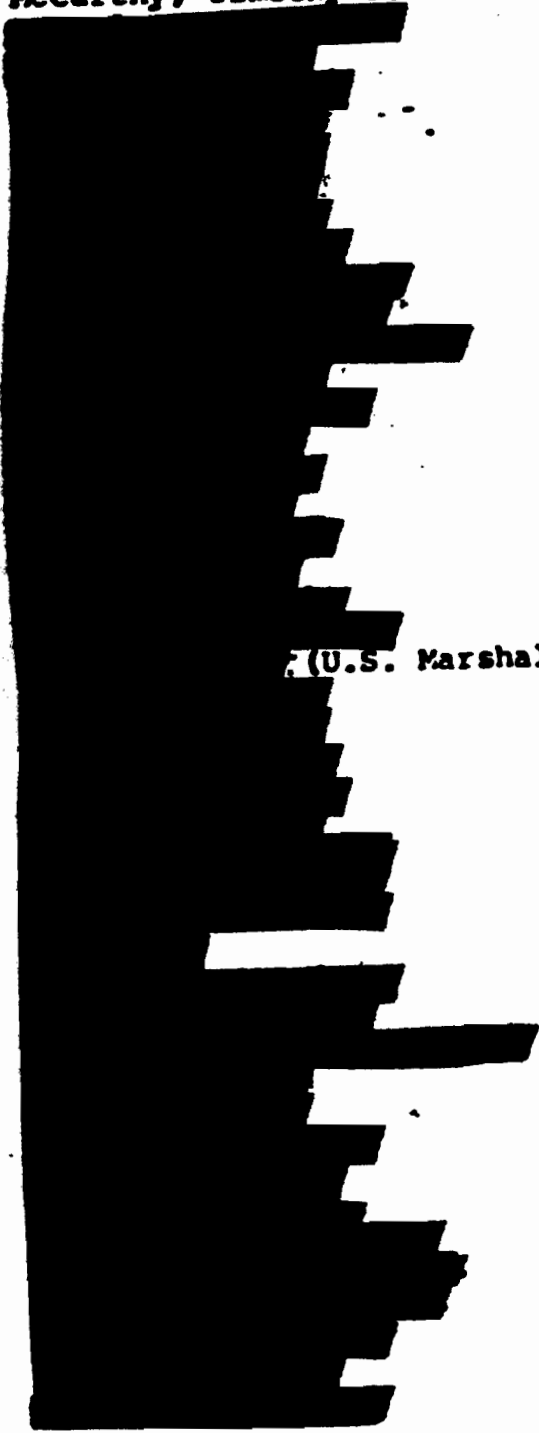
