There are **14 units** in each volume and each unit deals with a different vocabulary topic. There are about 20 illustrated words on the first page of each unit.

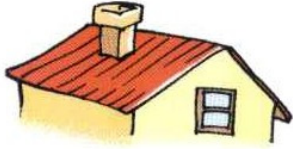
These words are then used on the following five pages in various **games and activities** such as crosswords, word searches, anagrams etc.

## The Simple Present tense

We use the simple present tense to describe habitual actions. The **affirmative** form of the simple present uses the **infinitive** of the verb, but an 's' is added to the third person singular:

I work.	We work.
You work.	You work.
He/she/it works.	They work.

In the **negative** and **interrogative** forms of the simple present, the auxiliary verb 'do' is added:

I don't work.	We don't work.
You don't work.	You don't work.
He/she/it doesn't work.	They don't work.

Do I work?	Do we work?
Do you work?	Do you work?
Does he work?	Do they work?

*Examples:*

Jonathon **goes** to work every day at 9 o'clock.

Susan **doesn't work** in an office.
