Our coloring is the most prevalent found in Egypt. Some such as that, Sati, Hathor, Seb and Set are always the same colors, their coloring rever varies, whilst - Couris and Shoth are sometimes painted green sometimes black - Most of the balance are found sometimes one color sometimes another that is always and but varies in shade, if the brightest to the duriest and. Sati is always and of a warm flesh color (criental) tent. Amen is always a light blue.

The Judgment Hall osiris.

The Judgment Hall of Osiris.

The Great Ball of Truth.

In the Turen Papyus the scene is painted with numberes of details suited to its importance: the quardian aught natibles the scale which holds the heart (Soul); thorus watches the balance weight: anubis, quardian of the dead watches the mage of justice; while Thoth stile (pen) in hand, records the result on a tablet. The Sour is then conducted by Thoth, bearing the tablet, into an inner chamber, where Osiris is scated. Osiris pronounces judgment; and as according as the heart (Soul) which has been weighed in the balance is found true a wanting, it passes to the realises of the regions of purying fires

Explanation; Running along the top of the wall is at purps, representing twelve groups formed with the himoglophics of the truth (trailin) and fire (thame) and of an uracus (Septed). Retween the sinth and seventh groups the god Imer thusing stretches out his arms above the two sacred eyes symbolizing the North and the South; this is an allusion to the diamet moving of the Sour, are implicit promise of resurction, at the two ruds of this erublematical roos, a montey is posing a pair of Scales (Shown in Such No. 5 - Jurin Papyrus.)

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
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
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Then Thoth; — " the Lord of Hermopolis, the Lord of swine works and words, the Great God residing in the Steert (Thoth being coundend emblematical of these) writes this sentence and says; — " Let the heart be put back again in its place in the body of the deceard! — The putting back of the heart wite the breast is the sign of the Resurrection. Street of is the lower half of the Lower Papipus given to show the same work done by different artists during different periods.





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
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
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

By the side of five indications of nuplie topography. a bank is represented with this legard; "the Barmakhis Bank when he beards lowered the field of Claren." Another bank is shown, and is indicated to be reserved for the god beneferal. a strain of water which is called; "water from Beaver"—forms the boundaries of these three regions; — of the first it is said that; "That is the God who inhabite it." Quarter begind reads; — "Region of the opinits seven cubits high; there is wheat three cubits high for the minimises in a state of perfection who reap it." He record is called:—"Requireding place of the Gods". The third is inhabited by Shw, Defruit and Seb.


