Gwanghwamun	119
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Seoulites love shopping and although the ever-rising won has increased prices for foreigners, there is something for everyone in the traditional markets, electronics emporiums, underground arcades, upmarket department stores and glitzy malls full of fashion boutiques and brand-name goods. Three of the best general malls are at COEX (p128), Central City (p127) and the World Cup Stadium (p64). Lotte, Hyundai, Shinsegae and Galleria are classy department stores but have regular sales when prices are heavily discounted.

For leather jackets, clothing, shoes, accessories, sports equipment or a flea market head to Dongdaemun market; while ginseng, children's clothes, spectacles and contact lenses are available at Namdaemun market. Larger sizes in clothes and shoes, souvenir T-shirts, leather jackets and hip-hop gear together with custom-made tailors can be found in Itaewon, where English is widely understood. For electronic gizmos drop into Yongsan Electronics Market or Techno Mart. For red ginseng, food and Asian medicines go to Gyeongdong market. Antique-lovers can browse Insadong, Itaewon and Janganpyeong markets. For brand-name boutiques head to Myeong-dong or south of the river to upmarket Apgujeong, but Westerners can struggle to find their size and fit.

Colourful macramé and embroidery, boxes made of handmade paper (hanji), wooden masks, fans, lacquerware boxes inlaid with mother-of-pearl or ox horn and painted wooden wedding ducks can be found in the handicraft and souvenir shops of Insadong. More expensive items include pale-green celadon pottery, reproduction Joseon-dynasty furniture and elegant hanbok (p16). Shirts or blouses made of lightweight, see-through ramie (cloth made from pounded bark) material make an unusual fashion gift.

Ginseng, the wonder root, turns up in all sorts of products. You can chew it, eat it, drink it, clean yourself with it or bath in it. Ginseng chewing gum, ginseng chocolate, ginseng tea, ginseng wine, ginseng soup, ginseng soap and ginseng bath salts are all ways of benefiting from its world-famous health-giving properties. The many types of tea are another popular buy.

Opening Hours

Most shops open every day from 10am to around 9pm, but an increasing number are closed on Sunday. Opening hours for department stores are from 10am to 7.30pm daily, although some close one day a week or two days a month. Market opening times vary, but even on days when a market is closed, some stalls are normally open. The listings in this chapter give the opening hours.

Bargaining

Before venturing into the markets or buying from street stalls in and around Seoul, get a handle on approximate prices by looking in a department store or regular fixed-price shops. Some market stallholders start off with a very inflated price whereas others may

quote only a slightly inflated figure. You can expect a discount of around 30%, but this is an average figure only and varies case by case. Walking away is the best way of achieving a lower price. Bargaining is part of the way of life in Seoul, so even when shopping in boutiques and opticians you can always request a discount if you feel it is justified or if you are buying more than one item.

INSADONG

Seoul's most fascinating shopping street, Insadong-gil is traffic-free on Saturday from 2pm until 10pm and on Sunday from 10am until 10pm, a scheme that is likely to be extended to other days. It's worth visiting more than once. Over 50 small art galleries display and sell the work of Seoul's top artists, potters and designers among rural-themed restaurants and atmospheric teashops. Stacks of shops sell pottery, antiques, calligraphy brushes, hanji, embroidery and souvenir knick-knacks. Look out for special snacks. Buddhist items, such as cassettes of monks chanting, incense sticks, and monk's and nun's clothing can be bought in shops near the Buddhist temple Jogyesa (p53) the Buddhist temple, Jogyesa (p53).

MYEONG-DONG & NAMSAN

The traffic-quiet narrow streets of Myeongdong are a leading youth-fashion centre. The customers here are becoming younger and younger - some malls and shops now cater specifically for free-spending middleschool students. Every evening mainly female crowds flock here to shop for local and imported clothes, shoes, bags, accessories, cosmetics and CDs. Cafés, restaurants, department stores and high-rise shopping malls with food courts and cinema multiplexes have made this area mega-popular with young people and Japanese visitors. Seoul railway station is also becoming a retail hotspot.

Always teeming with teenage-looking trendsetters, this high-rise Myeong-dong mall is packed with fashion shops, has a food court on the 7th floor and an outdoor stage by the entrance.

subway Line 1 or 2 to City Hall, Exit 6 Shops in this upmarket underground arcade sell ginseng, stationery, antiques, handicrafts, clothing and accessories, and it joins

up with Myeong-dong underground arcade.

ITAEWON

This 1km shopping street caters to American soldiers stationed at the nearby Yongsan base, so most retailers speak a bit of English. Tailor-made suits and shirts are a speciality as are custom-made shoes in leather or ostrich skin. Shops will embroider any garment with any design for around W3000. Spectacles (W50,000) and contact lenses are good quality and reasonably priced.

Such disparate items as leather jackets, antique furniture (sold in shops that line Bogwangdong-gil), second-hand books, hip-hop clothing and purple amethyst jewellery are on sale along with piles of souvenir T-shirts and handicrafts sold from market stalls. Don't believe what some shopkeepers say - eel-skin handbags can cost around W35,000 not W70,000 and 50 red-ginseng tea bags cost around W9000, not W44,000.

TAXES & REFUNDS

Global Refund (776 2170; www.globalrefund .com) and Korea Refund (537 1755) offer a partial refund of the 10% VAT. Spend more than W30,000 or W50,000 in any participating shop and you can later claim a refund. The retailer gives you a special receipt, which you must show to a customs officer at Incheon International Airport. Go to a Customs Declaration Desk (near check-in counters D and J) before checking in your luggage, as the customs officer will want to see the items before stamping your receipt. After you go through immigration, show your stamped receipt at the relevant refund desk, next to the duty-free shops, to receive your won refund in cash or by cheque. But don't get too excited - the refunds range from 5% to 7%.

MARKET BUZZ

You could disappear for a week in Seoul's mind-boggling markets and still not see everything. Whether it's fresh fish, antiques, Asian medicines or the latest electronic gadgets, you can find them here in the sprawling markets of Seoul.

Dongdaemun Market

Inside a stadium is the undercover **Pungmul flea market** (793 6908; 9am-7pm). Hunt for new and used bargains among the piles of car-boot-sale stuff, everything from *dojang* name stamps, handicrafts and army surplus to CDs, musical instruments and collectables. Around both stadiums are shops selling sports clothing and equipment as well as food stalls. Shop 45 on the outside of Pyeonghwa market has second-hand books in English.

Different sections have different closing times but while many close on Sunday, the four big malls stay open.

Gyeongdong Market

Walk straight ahead from the subway exit and you'll soon be struck by the aromatic odours of the traditional Asian herbal remedies that the **Gyeongdong market** (Map pp200-1; 8am-6.30pm, partly closed 1st & 3rd Sun each month; subway Line 1 to Jegi-dong, Exit 2) specialises in. The leaves, herbs, roots, flowers and mushrooms piled up in the shops and stalls are all medicinal. Bark is sold to be made into soup, while *jine* is a long millipede that is boiled to make a soup or eaten dry. It is said to be good for backache and a handful costs W6000.

Cross the road, turn left at Chohung Bank and then first right, and on the left are 2nd-floor arcades piled high with ginseng and honey products. Don't pay more than W9000 for 50 red-ginseng tea bags.



Janganpyeong Antiques Market

Namdaemun Market

This huge night-and-day market (Map p123; subway Line 4 to Hoehyeon, Exit 5) dates back to the 15th century and has thousands of shops and stalls selling food, ginseng, dried seaweed, clothes, shoes, hiking gear, watches, handicrafts, spectacles and contact lenses. Different sections have different opening hours — wholesalers are open all night and many shops are open on Sunday. Alpha (& 8am-7pm Mon-Sat, noon-6pm Sun) has two floors of toys and two floors of stationery. Shops in Hoehyeon underground arcade sell stamps, second-hand cameras, LPs, CDs and DVDs.

Shinsegae department store (a 310 1234; 10.30am-7.30pm, closed 1st & 3rd Mon) is spread over two buildings with a supermarket in the basement. Mesa family fashion mall (2128 5000; 10am-5am, closed 1st & 3rd Mon) has a food court on the 9th floor, opticians on the 6th floor, sports gear on the 4th floor.

Food stalls offer cheap meals for the adventurous, including octopus and *tteokbokki* (pressed rice cakes and vegies in a spicy sauce). Other food choices include a duck restaurant **Tobang** (p92) or Shinsegae department store food court.

Yongsan Electronics Market

If you can plug it in, you can find it here at this **electronics market** (Map pp198-9; **3** 701 8200; **9**,30am-7.30pm, partly closed 1st & 3rd Sun each month; subway Line 1 Yongsan, Exit 3). Prices are lower than elsewhere but are not generally marked on the products. Leave the station plaza by Exit 3, turn right, then right again and walk through the pedestrian overpass to enter the first building of Yongsan Electronics Town on the 3rd floor. Go down a floor to another pedestrian overpass to the shops that line both sides of the main street. Head to Najin Mall for computer parts.

All kinds of marine life swim around in tanks and bowls in this covered market it's an aquarium show that is well worth a visit. Large crabs, rays, tuna and shellfish are on display along with more exotic species such as sea cucumbers and sea squirts - the orange one is called meonage. Take-away platters of raw fish sell for W10,000 to W20,000, much cheaper than the restaurants on the 2nd floor (p96). Fresh prawns cost around W12,000kg, while lobsters are around W30,000kg. To make this a popular tourist attraction all that is needed are some stalls that will grill or steam what you buy fresh from the market. To get there, take the exit from the subway station, cross the bridge over the train tracks and go down the stairs into the market.

GANGNAM

Appujeong is a haughty haute couture shopping area most famous for its designer boutiques, cat-walk clothing and dizzying prices. Here, a second-hand pair of designer shoes can cost W480,000 or, for the same price, you can buy junior a cutelooking BMW pedal car. The most extravagance must be the Rolls Royce Phantom, which will dig a noticeable W650m hole in your credit card account.

In Gangnam, the young women wear Westwood and are as wafer thin as their mobile phones, which they use to ring their cosmetic surgeons while nibbling a tiny slice of green-tea cheesecake in an all-white well-being café.
