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## Sleeping

Seoul is bursting with accommodation - backpacker guesthouses, budget motels under W50,000, homestays and a stack of midrange and top-end hotels and serviced apartments. Accommodation is invariably charged per room, with little or no discount for singles, although homestays and guesthouses can be a little more generous. Hotel rooms with Western-style beds are most common, but for the same price you can often opt for a Korean-style room where you sleep on a yo (padded quilt) on the ondol (heated) floor. Gwanghwamun, Insadong and Myeong-dong are central, but it doesn't matter too much where you stay as long as it is near a subway station as although the palaces are downtown, many other tourist sights are scattered further afield and have to be visited by subway. A handful of top-end hotels are not near a subway station so guests there rely on hotel shuttle buses and the city's reasonably priced taxis.

#### **Accommodation Styles GUESTHOUSES & YOUTH HOSTELS**

Seoul has a handful of small, friendly guesthouses/backpackers that cater specifically for budget-conscious foreigners. Dorms are around W15,000 a night, single rooms around W27,000 and double rooms around W37,000. Rooms tend to be small, but the staff speak English and facilities usually include a TV and video lounge, a kitchen, a free washing machine, a free breakfast and free Internet access. Toilets and showers are usually shared. The two youth hostels, Olympic Parktel and Dreamtel, are far from the city centre.

#### **MOTELS & LOVE MOTELS**

Motels (yeogwan) are small, family-run budget hotels and there are thousands scattered throughout Seoul. Don't be put off by dimly lit corridors and the proprietor napping in a cubicle at the entrance. The rooms are always a bit small but offer a good deal as they are packed with facilities - en suite toilet and shower, TV, video, telephone, fridge, drinking water, aircon and heating, even toothbrushes, lotions and hairdryers. Nearly all the rooms have beds, but some also offer Korean-style rooms with a yo on the floor. The staff rarely speak any English so expect to be greeted with a look of alarm rather than a warm welcome.

The motels have no communal facilities – you just get a room, which is why prices are low. Room prices start at W30,000 for a room and those in the upper range (W45,000) are smarter and merge into the love-motel category. Sometimes looking like fairyland castles, love motels cater for daytime, pay-by-the-hour couples, but also accept conventional overnight guests. They provide a good option, especially if you fancy a round bed, satin sheets and a boudoir décor with stars painted on the ceiling.

#### **HOTELS & SERVICED APARTMENTS**

There is no shortage of midrange and luxury hotels, and new serviced apartments are springing up everywhere and providing tough competition, as they provide more home conveniences such as kitchen and laundry facilities. They all add 21% to their rates for

service and tax, but the trend is to include this in the quoted prices. Unless tourist numbers zoom upwards, hotel prices will remain soft, so rack rates are normally heavily discounted, particularly at slack periods (eg August). Luxury hotel rooms often go for around W200,000 or up to W250,000 for the best ones. Broadband Internet connection is always available as is air-con. Rooms can lack character, but the gym/sauna/spa

facilities and restaurants are often excellent. Hotels and apartments with character and style are rare but Seoul's top hotels rate with the best anywhere in terms of facilities and services. See p162 for online discount booking services.

#### **HOMESTAYS**

Some Korean families in Seoul offer minbak (homestay) to foreign visitors who can experience Korean food, customs and family life at close quarters. The cost for bed and breakfast is W30,000 a night for a single person and W50,000 for a couple. Some offer pick-ups and dinner, and rates are greatly reduced if you stay long-term. Book online at least two weeks before your arrival date.

#### **LONG-TERM ACCOMMODATION**

Renting an apartment can be tricky because of the traditional payment system. Jeonse is when you loan W30 million to W500 million to the landlord and get it all back at the end of the rental period. Weolse is when you pay a smaller returnable deposit of W3 million to W10 million (usually referred to as 'key money') plus a monthly rental fee. However, some accommodation in Seoul is available to foreigners on the Western system with a small returnable deposit and a monthly rent. Other options include the increasing numbers of modern serviced-apartments (from W75,000 to W230,000 a day). Browse some real estate websites for what's on offer - try www.nicerent .com and www.ace-realty.co.kr. In Seoul real estate is measured in pyeong (1 pyeong is 3.3 sg m).

Apartment sharing is another option, although spare rooms can be hard to find – view www.english spectrum.com or click on 'Community' at http://eng lish.seoul.go.kr or try the newspaper websites (p169).

## **Price Ranges**

Top luxury hotels are coy about their discount rates, which often depend on the occupancy rate, but you can generally ignore the rack rates, and discount rates range from under W200,000 to W250,000. Some offer special deals if you book through their website or at slack times. Midrange hotels are often discounted to around W100,000. Plenty of hotels under W100,000 offer a good deal, while the ones over that figure offer more facilities restaurants, bars, health clubs and the like – rather than better rooms. New serviced apartments range from good-value modern studios that can be discounted to W60,000 a night up ments range from good-value modern studios that can be discounted to W60,000 a night up to large and luxurious apartments at W200,000. Motels provide excellent-value rooms for

#### INCHEON INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT ACCOMMODATION

A cluster of new hotels and restaurants has been built in Airport Town Sq, less than 10 minutes by taxi or bus northeast of the airport. A transit hotel is inside the airport terminal.

Air Garden Transit Hotel (Map p150; a 032-743 3000; www.airgardenhotel.com; 6hr s/d incl tax & service from W49,500/61,500; (a) On the departure side of immigration, the small but smart modern rooms are perfect for a stopover snooze, although ones with a view are generally snapped up by airlines. A minimum 12-hour stay is required after 6pm and an American breakfast costs W14,000. Up on the 4th floor, the hotel is in two parts at both the east and west ends of the terminal. Rejuvenate after your flight with a massage ( 3032-743 3004; W50,000-W120.000; ( 8am-7pm).

Guesthouse Korea (Map p150; a 032-747 1872; www.questhousekorea.co.kr; Airport Town Square; d & tw W45,000; (a) This guite luxurious questhouse has large, light, modern motel-style rooms with their own fully equipped kitchens. It's on the 10th floor of a high-rise building opposite New Airport Hotel. Free Internet and a free pick-up from the airport are available.

New Airport Hotel (Map p150; a 032-752 2066; www.hotelnewairport.co.kr; Airport Town Sq; r regular/deluxe incl tax & service W90,000/99,000; (a) ) Smart new regular rooms have Internet access while deluxe rooms have a computer, and a discount should be possible as a bunch of similar hotels are nearby. A golf driving range is on the roof. See p151 for accommodation on the beach just a few kilometres from the airport. Take bus No 202 (W900, 20 minutes, half-hourly) or a taxi to Eurwangni Beach.

around W35,000, which lack only space, while guesthouses provide not such good rooms but a priceless friendly ambience with communal facilities and free services at a similar price. Guesthouses also have dorm beds that range from W11,000 to W19,000, while the two youth hostels charge W22,000. For something different, *hanok* (traditional Korean house) guesthouses and homestays are available for W50,000. Half the listings are midrange, 20% are in the top-end bracket and the Cheap Sleeps are all under W50,000.

#### **BUKCHON HANOK EXPERIENCE**

Anguk Guesthouse (Map pp202–3; 736 8304; www.angukhouse.com; off Byeolgunggil; s/d/tw/f W40,000/50,000/60,000/70,000; subway Line 3 to Anguk, Exit 1; 5 Soak up the historical atmosphere in this hanok with gorgeous varnished wood that nevertheless has all mod cons — every room has its own toilet and shower as well as a computer. This excellent choice has a young owner who speaks English, and beds rather than yo mattresses are supplied. Guests can use the kitchen and washing machine, and the simple self-serve breakfast is free. The owner also has dormitory accommodation (only W11,000) in a modern house nearby.

**Bukchon Guesthouse** (Map pp202–3; **a** 743 8530; bukchon72@yahoo.co.kr; s/d W35,000/50,000; subway Line 3 to Anguk, Exit 3; **a**) Experience a vanished age of unostentatious elegance in this fine *hanok* built around a courtyard with wooden ceiling beams and paper windows. The communal bathrooms are modern and tiled, and guests can relax in the TV lounge, log onto the Internet, and use the small kitchen and washing machine.

Guesthouse Woorijip (Map pp202–3; 744 0536; woorijip@hanmail.net; d incl breakfast W50,000; subway Line 3 to Anguk, Exit 3; (a) This hanok is more like a homestay where you share the ups and downs of family life with the Parks, their two young children and a Jindo dog. Sleep as the yangban (aristocrats) did on a yo (padded quilt) in ondol (underfloor-heated) rooms with sliding paper-screen doors that are furnished with authentic traditional wooden chests and paintings.

Seoul Guesthouse (Map pp202–3; 745 0057; www.seoul110.com; s/d/f W35,000/50,000/100,000; subway Line 3 to Anguk, Exit 3; 10 wner Mrs Lee is very kind, speaks English well and was the first person to open her hanok to foreign guests. It's a delightful one down a quiet alley and built around a peaceful garden, with other more modern hanok-style buildings dotted around. Guests sleep on a yo on an ondol floor in a bare room with shared facilities (except in the more expensive rooms), and share a TV lounge, kitchen, free Internet and washing machine.

## **GWANGHWAMUN**

The downtown area has budget motels and guesthouses as well as hotels and *hanok* guesthouses. Other downtown hotels are listed under the Myeong-dong & Namsan section.

**HOTEL LEES** Map pp202-3

The smart rooms in this modern and clean hotel usually go for as little as W65,000, which makes them a deal worth grabbing. The immediate area is nothing special, but the subway is just a short stroll away. Rooms are fine except for a chair shortage and the receptionist is welcoming and helpful. The bar/restaurant/coffee shop is subterranean, but stay here if you want something fairly central, better than a motel but budget-priced. Free Internet is available on the 11th floor.

The recently renovated and well-kept rooms are comfortable enough but nothing special and are usually discounted to W170,000. A handful of restaurants offer global grazing, and male guests can de-stress body and mind in the luxury sauna and exercise room. The main attraction though is location. location. location. location.

NEW KUKJE HOTEL Map pp202-3

The size of the rooms is okay although they are beginning to look slightly tired and the business centre is just a cubicle under the stairs. The cheerful restaurant serves appealing buffet spreads (W11,000 to W16,500) and you can relax those sightsee-

ing and shopping muscles in the 24-hour sauna (non-guest W11,000, closed Sunday). The hotel is within shouting distance of City Hall and this is reflected in the price.

Rooms have light-coloured décor and aren't large but the absolute downtown location more than makes up for that.

This new budget option is located in an orange-tiled building down a street behind the GS gas station, opposite Changdeok palace. It sets new standards combining motel-style rooms with guesthouse-style communal facilities. The owner keeps it clean and works hard to please her guests. Rooms have air-con, satellite TV and video, fridge, hairdryer, towels and toiletries. Breakfast, Internet and the washing machine are free and discounts are given for longer stays. Dorms contain only one double bunk, the kitchen is large and the lobby has greenery and a mini chandelier.

The kitchen has a one-ring cooker and a microwave. The management is (like their dog Kuma) friendly.

White and pine-effect décor make for pleasant, clean rooms (a few have Seoul Tower views) and the hotel has a twodesk business corner, bar, restaurant and coffee shop. Twins are bigger than doubles and are variously shaped, so look at more than one. This friendly hotel is just outside Myeong-dong, but near Korea House and Namsangol Hanok Village where you can see, hear and taste traditional Korean culture.

Everything impresses, from the vast lobby to the free use of a mobile phone (Samsung of course), from the sculpture garden and duty-free shop to the restaurants and the lift with CNN on a small screen. The Shilla retains a Korean flavour with local artworks, blind masseurs and a traditional building in front of the hotel. Staff pride themselves on catering to guests' every whim. Clever technology means that incoming room calls cause the TV volume to decrease and can be transferred to the mobile phone. The discount price hovers around W230,000.

The giant hotel has 1318 rooms and as many staff, but new manager Mr Lee is vowing to improve the personal touch as well as keeping all the facilities up to scratch. Rooms in the new wing have a laptop, mobile phone and walk-in shower and are worth paying more for if you can find a room with a clean carpet. In an enviable location and surrounded by upscale fashion shops, expect 50% discounts and look out for special deals that can start at W190,000.

It's a climb up from the subway station, but nearby Namsan (262m) is perfect for serious joggers, with uphill paths and traffic-free roads around the green hillside.

Set back from the main road, the hotel lacks a bar (maybe that's why the atmosphere is subdued) but the greenery, artworks and small circular glass business centre combine to create a stylish ambience.

This university-owned luxury hotel near the subway in Myeong-dong boasts 20 types of rooms. Namsan-facing rooms are on the small side but those facing the city are bigger. New room décor is pastel shades, the staff are helpful and the general impression is plush and elegant. The fitness centre and men's sauna are great but closed on Sunday. See p92 for their Eunhasu buffet. Prices are usually discounted to W180.000.

As central as a bullseye, the Plaza matches other top hotels with its facilities and service. Staff make a special effort to greet you and remember your name and a posse of them in the lobby are primed to aid new arrivals. Some rooms are on the small side and not as perfect as they should be. Prices are usually discounted to around W200,000.

Seoul's first hotel (the original building opened in 1914) keeps up with the times and so every guest receives free use of a mobile phone and a few rooms have their own gym equipment. Choose your room style after seeing the options on a screen. It's not the most luxurious hotel in Seoul but it has the best location, good atmosphere and well-trained staff. All this means the discount price might stick higher than elsewhere.

The Compass Rose lounge (beers W10,000) is has live jazz at 8pm every evening except Saturday. It has a quality business centre, laptops in the rooms and a lap pool but no lap dancers. The traditional-style barber is a memorable experience. In the garden outside is a pavilion built for King Gojong when he proclaimed himself an emperor and had an altar built to give thanks to heaven. See p104 for O'Kim's bar.

Popular with American soldiers and expat English teachers, the mix of stalls, shops, pubs, gay bars, nightclubs and ethnic restaurants gives lively Itaewon a different atmosphere to the rest of the city. Stay here and you can party late without having to get a taxi home. Locals here are more likely to speak English, but a few parts are seedy.

Though far from the subway, there are shuttle buses (10am to 9pm).

The new, lighter, green-themed décor has freshened up the rooms, although some bathrooms are on the small side. The deli and the nightclub (p110) are excellent as are the sports facilities – an indoor and outside pool, masses of high-tech exercise equipment, plus squash, tennis, yoga and aerobics classes. In winter you can ice-skate on the pool. Exact prices depend on the occupancy rate.
