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SLEEPING

Sydney has a huge quantity and variety of accommodation - from backpackers' hostels to waterside palaces. If you've got limited time and an unlimited budget, the big-ticket hotels around Circular Quay may be the go. If you're hoping to squeeze some pleasure out of a business trip, pick from the numerous city hotels. For a taste of real Sydney life, choose one of the residential suburbs in the city fringes. If you want to fit a little sightseeing around some serious beaching, head for the eastern beaches or Manly. If budget's the driving factor, investigate the hostels around Potts Point/Kings Cross, the beaches or the inner west.

Accommodation listings in this chapter are ordered by neighbourhood, then in price order from most to least expensive based on the price of a standard double in high (but not peak) season. The average double room with bathroom costs about \$150, with seasonal variations (lowest in winter and highest around Christmas, New Year's Eve and Mardi Gras). Rooms are also more expensive from Monday to Friday, when business travel is at its peak (outside Sydney, though, weekend rates are often higher because Sydneysiders flee their homes for mini vacations). Generally, we've quoted rack rates for hotels, which tend to be higher than the specials and discounted packages that are often on offer. Always ask a hotel for its 'best rate'. If you're looking for last-minute discounts at higher-end hotels, try www.lastminute .com.au.

THE ROCKS & CIRCULAR QUAY

This neighbourhood ticks a number of boxes: the most attractive part of central Sydney; the most likely to have a harbour view; the most vibrant after dark; the closest to the most sights; the best base for exploring the city by ferry. It should come as no surprise then that this glamorous precinct is also the priciest.

This area is tourist central - you won't find much in the way of neighbourhood cafés, affordable restaurants or supermarkets. Yet there is a quiet residential pocket in the Millers Point part of The Rocks, sheltered enough from the hurly-burly of the Quay to be completely charming.

the Park Hyatt boasts the best location in Sydney. The graciously low-rise building matches the opulence of its position with sandstone, marble and contemporary design including a particularly groovy mother-of-pearl wall. Absolutely decadent views of the harbour. Around-the-clock butler service. Superluxurious. What more is there to say?

When the owners' other properties include the Orient Express, you expect opulence. That said, the Observatory is remarkably restrained, eschewing excessive gilt in favour of an elegant antique ambience. The building is only 15 years old but in keeping with the surrounding terraced houses in this astoundingly guiet central city nook. The rooms are large with equally spacious marble bathrooms. Some have views and four-poster beds, and bowls of goldfish are available on request for children or lonely executives.

There's an intimate, rambling feel to the turreted 1887 building and plenty of narrow staircases (no elevator).

Surrounded by high-rise hotels, this smallscale B&B still manages to squeeze some Opera House views from its superb location on the upper slopes of The Rocks. Each of the nine rooms is charmingly unique, and all come with soft sheets and a hot breakfast, although some share bathrooms.

LORD NELSON BREWERY HOTEL Map p54

Built in 1836 and housing Sydney's oldest continuously licensed pub, the Lord Nelson is well located in the quiet heights of The Rocks. Despite its historic status the friendly owners have resisted the urge to vomit flowers over the walls and drapes, opting instead to highlight the thick sandstone walls with simple, comfortable furnishings. Most of the nine rooms are spacious and have their own bathroom, or you can opt for a cheaper, smaller room with shared facilities.

Standing sentinel-like at peaceful Millers Point, the Palisade Hotel has nine basic rooms with well-kept shared bathrooms. The front rooms open on to a shared balcony with breathtaking views of the Harbour Bridge, while others have windows looking over Walsh Bay. It's a lovely old building with a decent neighbourhood pub downstairs that generally shuts at sleep-friendly hours.

CITY CENTRE

Most hotels here cater to the business brigade it's easy to splash the cash if the shareholders are picking up the tab. This is not a residential area, so don't expect to gain much insight into how locals live if you base yourself here. Once the hordes vacate the office towers for their commute to the suburbs, this part of the city can be a ghost town. However a train or taxi (hell, chuck that on the charge account as well) will get you to neighbouring suburbs in a jiffy.

SThe comfortable rooms have silky bedspreads and fine linen, although some of the bathrooms are tiny. Breakfast and a daily tipple are complimentary.

DARLING HARBOUR & CHINATOWN

This end of town is livelier and the prices cheaper, but it's not the most attractive place to stay - there's little in the way of views or green space. On the upside, this neighbourhood positively sparks with energy and there are plenty of midnight feast or binge options. The area around Central Station has turned into backpacker city.

The rooms are beautifully designed, with king-size beds, Bose stereos, DVD players, marble bathrooms with tiny Italian tiles and glitzy fixtures. There are some two-bedroom suites available, including one with a courtyard.

The kids will love it, but bring earplugs. Private ensuite rooms are available.

DARLINGHURST TO POTTS POINT

This first belt of eastern suburbs should suit nightclub junkies, gay guys and boozed-up

backpackers just fine. The leafy backstreets hide a smattering of boutique hotels and the buzziest backpacker strip in the city (Victoria St). Excellent public transport makes for quick access to the city sights and Bondi.
