



# **ROOM SERVICE**

Slumber under frescoes in a 16th-century palazzo, kick back in a converted candle-lit convent or dream sweetly in an architect's style-savvy pad.

From five-star hotels to cheerful hostels, Naples isn't short on sleeping options. Particularly hot right now are the city's B&Bs – far from dowdy and constraining, many newer B&Bs are run by young professionals who'll happily give you your room key and let you come and go as you please.

Hostels are another solid budget option, with several funky privately owned newcomers hitting the scene in the last few years.

If you're after a cheap hotel, the area around Stazione Centrale is your best bet although

the area is noisy, dirty and seedy at night. The places listed, however, were clean and safe at the time of research.

For maximum atmosphere, hit the centro storico (historic centre). Here, charming places lie hidden behind heavy doors and, if you're lucky, you could score yourself a baroque boudoir. Best of all, many of the city's sights are within walking distance.

Seaside Santa Lucia is home to some of the city's most prestigious hotels, Chiaia is cool and chic, and Mergellina is handy for popping out to the bay islands on a hydrofoil. For lofty views, grand hotels and a chilled-out vibe, hit Vomero; for thermal-

spa hotels and crater-based farmhouses, head west to Campi Flegrei.

The Stazione Centrale **tourist office** (Map pp280–1; 0 081 26 87 79; Stazione Centrale, Piazza Garibaldi; 0 Stazione Centrale) can book accommodation. Alternatively, **Rent A Bed** (Map pp280–1; 0 081 41 77 21; www.rentabed.com; Vico D'Afflitto 16; per night from €35; 0 R2 to Piazza Trieste e Trento), has an extensive selection of B&Bs and apartments covering Naples, the bay islands and the Amalfi Coast.

Check-in at the hostels listed below is 24 hours and checkout is at 10am. All hostels have mixed dorms and can be booked online at www.hostelspoint.com. There are no hard-and-fast rules with hotel check-in times, but if you plan on arriving in the late afternoon or evening it's best to mention this when booking. Hotel checkout is usually between 10am and noon – if you leave later than this you risk being charged an extra night.

Book ahead if you're coming in May as Maggio dei Monumenti (p18) draws huge crowds. Other peak seasons are April to mid-June, Christmas and New Year. Many hotels request a faxed confirmation of your reservation and a credit-card number as a deposit. This doesn't guarantee that the hotel accepts credit-card payment, so check ahead. Without a credit card, you may need to send a money order to cover the first night's stay. Increasingly, hotels encourage booking online to save you this hassle.

Ask for a *camera matrimoniale* if you want a double bed; ask for a *camera doppia* (double room) and you'll get twin beds.

# **CENTRO STORICO & MERCATO**

For a high-voltage shot of pure Naples, you can't beat the centro storico, with its wealth of historical sites, buzzing squares and grinding street-life. This is the place for secret B&Bs, homely hostels and artcrammed converted palazzi.

Mercato is the place for budget hotels; the options we've listed were clean and reliable at the time of writing, but be warned that the area is bedlam by day and dodgy by night.

On the top floor of a dusty old building, this happy little hostel features bright, spacious dorms, two private rooms, funky wall murals, shabby but chic furnishings and a huge communal kitchen. The little room downstairs has aircon and private bathroom. BYO lock for the lockers.

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Close to the cathedral, this former pink pad is now a cooler shade of cream. Brightly coloured bedspreads add a little spice, and rooms are comfy and airy, if a little anonymous. But the price is right so book ahead as rooms go quickly.

Don't let the dingy staircase scare you off; B&B Costantinopoli is a fabulous place to stay. The family of artists who own this large and exuberantly decorated 3rd-floor pad are warm, engaging and a mine of local knowledge. The two rooms are bright, comfy and clean.

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Part gallery, part family home, this place is a heaving treasure trove of art, books and anecdotes. Four spacious bedrooms boast individual designs, original artwork, ensuite bathrooms and satellite TVs. The garrulous artist-owner cooks breakfast, which is served at a huge old wooden table. Pride of place is given to his organic pancetta.

This isn't a brothel, just a charming family hotel with a flower-fringed roof terrace and excellent-value rooms with modern, functional furniture and gleaming bathrooms. Use the safer Corso G Garibaldi entrance rather than the main one located on Via Venezia. Breakfast is an optional €4.

# HOTEL LUNA ROSSA MAP PP280-1 HOTEL €€

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The Luna Rossa is a quiet place run by the daughter of a Neapolitan musician. Each room is named after a Neapolitan song, the lyrics of which are framed and hung in the rooms. The pink-hued rooms are comfy, if plain, and the large bathrooms are perfect for towel-clad tenors.

The Esedra stands tall on a tiny square just off car-choked Corso Umberto I, halfway between Stazione Centrale and the centro storico. The snug rooms are decorated with Neapolitan paintings, and you might even find a porthole or two in your bathroom. Suites boast private terrace Jacuzzis.

### HOTEL ZARA MAP PP278-9

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Recently renovated and run by the same family as Hotel Casanova (left), this spotless bolt hole is a world away from the grungy street below. Rooms are spartan but clean, with modern furniture, satellite TVs and double-glazed windows. There's a book exchange and breakfast is an optional  $\in 4$ .

This funky B&B is pure offbeat cool. Three gorgeously comfy rooms feature everything from antique rocking horses and fake-fur bedspreads to leopard-print underlays and baby blue walls. There is even a weights machine for your morning workout.

At Piazza San Domenico Maggiore 9 you'll find the Palazzo dei Di Sangrio, home of the Soggiorno Sansevero hotel (below) and the setting for a gruesome tale of love and betrayal. Here, on the night of 17 October 1590, the famous Neapolitan musician Carlo Gesualdo murdered his wife, Maria d'Avalos, and her lover, Don Fabrizio Carafa, in a fit of jealous rage. The suspicious Gesualdo had tricked Maria into thinking that he was away on a hunting trip, when in fact he was waiting to catch her with her lover. He did and both Maria and Don Fabrizio paid the ultimate price. According to legend, the bloodied lovers died in each others' arms. Gesualdo's jealousy was hardly surprising - so good-looking was the younger nobleman that he was nicknamed 'the Angel'. Yet the Angel's death wasn't enough for the betrayed husband, who ordered the killing of his own son, suspecting him of being the fruit of his wife's adulterous tryst. According to local lore, poor Maria's ghost still roams the streets at night, searching for her slaughtered son and sweetheart.

Hidden away on the 1st floor of a famous 18th-century palazzo (see Scandalous Slumber, above) that once belonged to the creepy prince of Sansevero, this is one of several stylish Sansevero hotels. You'll find it just around the corner from the Cappella Sansevero on the eastern side of lively – read noisy at night – Piazza San Domenico Maggiore.

Fit for a spread in *Wallpaper* magazine (unlike the shabby square outside), this squeaky-new hotel is a design buff's paradise – MoMAworthy light sculptures, exposed tufa walls, a minimalist rooftop restaurant-bar and 89 soothing Zenlike rooms with clean lines and flat-screen TVs. Wheelchair accessible.

# TOLEDO & QUARTIERI SPAGNOLI

Via Toledo is the city's major retail strip. To the west, the earthy Quartieri Spagnoli's reputation for crime has been somewhat exaggerated.

Expect everything from humble flats to chic converted convents. The hotels listed were friendly, comfortable and safe at the time of research.

Taking its name from the neighbouring convent, the Convento is a soothing blend of antique Tuscan furniture, erudite book-shelves and candle-lit stairs. Rooms are cosy and elegant, combining creamy tones and dark woods with patches of 16th-century brickwork. For €110 to €210 you get a room with a private roof garden. The hotel is wheelchair accessible.

# HOTEL TOLEDO MAP PP280-1 HOTEL €€

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Snugly situated in an old three-storey building, this homely hotel has comfy, smallish rooms with terracotta tiles and mod cons; the rooms are a little on the dark side, however. Suites feature a stovetop, and breakfast is served on the rooftop terrace.

Escape the common hordes and live like nobility in the 16th-century Palazzo Tocco di Montemiletto. Although it's admittedly a little tired in places, there are still enough gilded mirrors and lofty ceilings to satisfy the snob within.

# SANSEVERO D'ANGRI MAP PP280-1 HOTEL €€

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This is a gilded wonderland of baroque salons, 17th-century parquet and palatial rooms, some with frescoed ceilings. The regal vibe is not surprising given that Vanvitelli, the original architect, also designed the royal palace at Caserta.

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Right on the city's major shopping strip, these two miniapartments each accommodate five people. Although they're not luxurious or particularly smart, they're clean and the communal sundeck has awesome rooftop views. It's ideal for a group of friends who want somewhere cheap and central. You'll need €0.10 for the lift.

# SANTA LUCIA & CHIAIA

With lavish seaside hotels and sparkling island vistas, Santa Lucia is where presidents and pop stars say goodnight. However, there are still affordable options, some with stunning bay and castle vistas. As a general rule, rooms with water views cost a little more.

A-list Chiaia is *the* place for trendy shopping, bar-hopping

and chichi dolce vita, so accommodation is chic rather than cheap. Your best bets for budget beds are the two funky B&Bs.

Run by a superhelpful young couple, this B&B is a first-rate choice. Six chic and witty rooms feature different Neapolitan themes, from *mal'occhio* (evil eye) to *peperoncino* (chilli). There's a spacious communal area for breakfast, and free internet available 24/7.

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This gay-friendly B&B offers guests their own self-contained apartment, with a small double room on a mezzanine floor and a sofa bed in the living area. Divided from the family home, you get your own key to come and go as you please, although you'll probably end up reclining on the rooftop terrace. Bring  $\in$ 0.20 for the lift.

Middle-class Vomero is a world apart from the seething sprawl below. It's not exactly bursting with sights, but the views are divine, the streets are leafy and the heady Neapolitan chaos is just a funicular ride away.

Slumberwise, expect old-school glamour at new-school prices, with a touch of cheap chic further down the hill.

# **MERGELLINA & POSILLIPO**

With Liberty palazzi, anchored yachts and a buzzing seafront scene, Mergellina is well connected to the city centre and ideal for an early-morning hydrofoil out to the bay islands.

This modest and friendly hotel sits opposite the Mergellina marina, a fact not played down in the décor – think portholes, barometers and bed heads in the shape of ships' steering wheels. Corny? Yes, but rooms are clean and comfy, and the few that face the sea don't cost extra.

To the west of Naples, the Campi Flegrei offers a somewhat slower pace than the central-city neighbourhoods, and Pozzuoli has a number of reasonably priced hotels and *pensioni* (guesthouses). Ask at a tourist office (p259) for details.

This grand old hotel in Pozzuoli is frequented as much for its sulphurous airs and thermal treatments as for its large and airy rooms. Between April and December you can complete a course of 12 thermal baths for  $\in$ 103, or for  $\in$ 155 you get 12 thermal baths and the opportunity to wallow in glorious gloopy mud.

Il Casolare di Tobia is closed for one week in late August and one week in late December or early January.
