
This book is the result of an exciting labor of love for the authors, who researched the history of the cameos and took over five hundred color photographs (many life size) of cameo jewelry, making this the first book of its kind with such a large number of color photographs. Over 1400 examples of cameo jewelry are depicted here, representing the span from the 1700s to the present. The range of subjects include mythological motifs of classical gods and goddesses, religious subjects and scenes, and the ever-present anonymous woman.

A history of the cameo is provided, followed by individual chapters focusing on each of the specific materials cameos were made from. Materials of the cameos photographed include amber, amethyst, glass, jasper ware, lava, mother-of-pearl, opal, the plastics, quartz, shell, topaz, and Wedgwood. These beautiful, detailed photographs show the unique artistry and design of the cameos and their various settings. *Cameos: Classical to Costume* is an extensive book and price guide for anyone who appreciates the timeless appeal of the cameo.

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

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Introduction

Cameos are a unique and always recognizable piece of jewelry. Their composition, subject, and history have provided collectors with many avenues of study. The cameo has endured from the days of stone, shell, and lava, and it continues to thrive in the present day.

In this book, we have presented a sampling of the endless variety of cameos that appeal to the collector. We have included a brief history to show the cameo's evolution from the Georgian period to the present day.

While we have attempted to group the cameos by material (i.e. stone, lava, shell, plastic, etc.) some cameos made of other materials may pop up in unexpected places. For example, a stone cameo may appear in the shell chapter. We have tried to keep this from happening as much as possible. Since many collectors we have met collect such an array of cameos, these pieces appear in the photographs. This variety makes the cameos more interesting to study.

The purpose of this book is not to set firm prices, but to be used as a guide. The prices of cameos reflect the combined experience of both authors in collecting and dealing in antique and collectible jewelry. The cameo prices are representative of the range of values observed throughout the United States and Europe.





Chapter One The History of the Cameo

The study of the cameo is the study of history. Cameos provide clues to the past. In them, we can see the changing times through the subjects depicted and materials used, and we find some remarkable examples of craftsmanship.

The carving of cameos signified a change in the way people viewed jewelry. The cameo had no apparent purpose other than as an ornament. For example, cameos served as a setting in jewelry (a brooch or ring), a decoration on objects, or as sculpture.

The cameo first appeared around the time of Alexander the Great. This distinctive piece of jewelry has enjoyed popularity throughout Classical times, the Renaissance, and the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. Even today, in the 1990s, there has been a resurgence of interest in the cameo.

Intaglios

Before the cameo, jewelry was functional. The intaglio, often used as a seal for documents or property, came before the cameo. The opposite of the cameo, the intaglio is a design carved below the surface. Common stones used for intaglios were beryl, onyx, and sardonyx.

Cameos

Unlike the intaglio, the cameo stands out in relief. Early cameo carvers utilized such stones as agate, onyx, and sardonyx for their creations. Carvers cut away the top layer in relief and exposed the darker layer as the background. Through the changes and periods jewelry has undergone, carvers have looked to other materials for cameos such as coral, ivory, jet, lava, and shell.

Cameos can be molded from synthetic materials such as plastic or glass. Gutta-percha, Bakelite, and celluloid are examples of materials jewelry manufacturers have used for their cameo designs. 


18th Century

Cameo Portraits in Wax

The practice of modeling wax portraits goes back to the fourth century B.C. This method of working with wax became popular with sculptors and artists as a way to perfect their work before the actual carving of stone or painting on canvas began. Cameo carvers employed wax in a similar way and produced model portraits before they began to fashion their designs in their chosen material.


For people who could not afford to buy a cameo, a wax portrait was the next best thing to collect and to study. At different times throughout the seventeenth and eighteenth century, these portraits enjoyed popularity. The art of wax portraiture died out in the nineteenth century.¹





Plaster Casts of Carved and Engraved Gems

Making plaster impressions of carved and engraved gems reached its peak in the eighteenth century. These durable plaster of paris impressions made up the important collections of churches and governments who studied the significance of the designs. Another purpose of the impressions was to provide a record of carved and engraved gems.² These casts offer an important link to the past. Examining them gives insight into the style and the variety of subjects past engravers and carvers chose. The designs show what appealed to the collectors of long ago. While such casts are rare, they can be found in museums or in private collections.

Artisans of the eighteenth century joined cameos together by gold chains forming panels. Bracelets with cameo clasps became fashionable, but the ring was considered most fashionable. Cameo rings from this period became popular.

Schools of engraving appeared as the result of an insatiable passion for engraved gems that swept Europe in the eighteenth century. With the rush to make cameos, many carvers did not exert the same care in craftsmanship. Less scrupulous carvers took the opportunity to create fraudulent pieces and forged signatures of well known carvers on the backs of cameos. Novice collectors could not differentiate between the real and the fake. Producing copies of older cameos became the livelihood of some carvers.

Glass

Glass cameos reached their zenith in the late eighteenth century. James Tassie (1735-1799), a Scotsman, developed a glass paste that he used with great success to imitate gems carved into intaglios and cameos. It was difficult to identify the real jewelry from the faux creations.

Tassie's castings were copies of ancient cameos and intaglios. The subjects ranged from a variety of mythological motifs to portraits of royals or wealthy figures of the day. His reproductions did not have a plaster look and mirrored "the transparency or opacity as well as the color and workmanship of the originals."³ With his ability to gain access to the great collections of Europe, his casts numbered 15,800.⁴

After Tassie's death, his nephew, William, took over the business of producing cameos from glass paste. This business continued into the 1800s, until William's death, when the production of Tassie cameos diminished. Through his work in offering an affordable cameo, Tassie changed jewelry forever as the masses could indulge in a pastime that was once reserved for the wealthy.



Like Tassie, Josiah Wedgwood (1730-1795) sold attractive, affordable cameos. In England, he produced beautiful ceramic cameos and sent many of his pieces to France for setting. These cameos retained a romantic charm that other cameos of the period lacked.

After developing the process for making the jaspar ware cameo, Wedgwood decided that this material was what he

preferred for his cameos. To create the jasper ware cameo, a white stoneware cameo was fashioned onto on a light blue ceramic background and then joined into one piece through a firing process. The blue color of his pieces has become known as Wedgwood blue. Wedgwood cameos come in a variety of colors, and their manufacture continues to the present.

19th Century

France

When Napoleon Bonaparte came to power in France in 1804, the members of his court enjoyed displaying and wearing engraved gems. Napoleon and the French loved cameos and did not care whether the pieces were old or new. The French emperor showed his admiration for the cameo when he commissioned furniture and other objects to be made and adorned with cameos. While this custom no doubt contributed to the opulent atmosphere, it gave the cameo a mass produced look.

Empress Josephine, Napoleon's wife, wore a crown studded with cameos at Napoleon's coronation. Josephine loved to wear engraved gems. Many women of the French court adorned themselves with similar cameo jewelry. Napoleon gave Empress Josephine a parure set described as having "eighty-two antique cameos surrounded by 275 pearls."⁵ Examples of the kind of jewelry Josephine made popular were cameos "linked by chains of gold or pearls to make necklaces, earrings, bracelets and set in tiaras and decorative combs."⁶

Shell

During the early nineteenth century, French and Italian carvers used shell to create cameos. Carvers discovered Black Helmet and Queen's Conch shells in abundance for their work. Shell was soft and could be carved quickly, so it became a favorite material for producing cameos to meet the high demand. Empress Josephine especially treasured cameos made of shell, and her favor made this type of cameo popular in France.



The Influence of Archaeological Discoveries

Excavations of ancient sites in the early nineteenth century renewed an interest in jewelry of the past. Findings at Pompeii in 1806 and an interest in such sites as Herculaneum fueled the enthusiasm. Discoveries in Etruscan tombs helped create a revival of ancient jewelry. A characteristic of this jewelry that appears on the frames of many cameos is the Etruscan style granulation or beading. Carvers looked to the archaeological jewelry for the subjects of their work. Cameo motifs of this period show the influence of Classical designs through the carved images of gods and goddesses from Classical mythology.

The interest in ancient history and the growth of tourism in Europe boosted the demand for cameos. As tourists traveled to Italy during the eighteenth century and nineteenth century, they found a wide selection of cameos from which to choose. The compact size of the cameo made it an ideal souvenir, and tourists could readily purchase carvings of shell, stone, or lava. Mythological motifs continued to be popular subjects, and personal portraits commissioned by travelers became the vogue.

Lava

Mt. Vesuvius was the source of lava that allowed carvers to produce an inexpensive and distinctive looking cameo for souvenir hunters during the nineteenth century. The lava cameos came in such colors as white, black, cream, and olive green. The softness of the lava gave artists a perfect medium to design intricate carvings in high relief.

While the lava cameo was an inexpensive souvenir for visitors to Italy, these detailed pieces of jewelry were a status symbol for women of the day. A lava cameo signified that a woman had traveled to Italy on the Grand Tour. Today, these carvings in lava continue to be collectible. Dating a cameo can be a challenge, but with a lava cameo, one can say with a great deal of certainty that it originated in the nineteenth century.

England

When Queen Victoria ascended the British throne in 1837, the Victorian Era, as we now call it, began. The queen enjoyed wearing jewelry and liked to give pieces of jewelry as gifts. Shell cameo brooches and earrings were favorites of Queen Victoria throughout her reign and thereby ensured their lasting popularity.

Women were not the only ones who enjoyed wearing cameos. Men wore rings set with cameos or intaglios. Pins with scarves and watch fobs that included cameos or intaglios were common accessories of the day.

Popular Motifs

Along with cameos depicting mythological figures, other designs embellished the cameo. Flowers were a popular subject for cameos of the 1800s. Victorians had a keen interest in horticulture. The many books and magazines of the period are indicative of this fact. The result of this interest appears in Victorian jewelry. Cameo designs depicted the floral motif through a variation on the bouquet or a hand holding a bouquet of flowers. Flowers continued to be a common subject for cameo brooches until the present day.

The subject of Rebecca at the Well grew into popularity in the 1860s. This design, taken from the Biblical reference, portrayed a scene including a well, a house, and a woman. The design of the cameo varied according to the carver. Some cameo artists created a detailed carving with trees or bushes in the background while other carvers preferred to create a light, dreamy scene with little depth to the carving. Cameo carvers depicted this motif on brooches, pendants, rings, and earrings.





Coral

The discovery of an abundance of coral near the seaside town of Torre del Greco, Italy, heralded the production of coral jewelry during the nineteenth century. Victorians believed in the power of coral and thought it could ward off evil. Coral jewelry was plentiful and flourished well into the 1860s. Children wore coral beads, and parures of coral were popular with Victorian ladies.

Mass Production

With the mass production of jewelry during the late nineteenth century, the demand for jewelry became strong. The cameo was more popular than ever. The effect of such demand resulted in the cameo portrait of generalized women. These cameo designs of women became common subjects that surpassed the mythological motifs.

The portrait of generalized women caused an augmentation in the features of women depicted in cameos. The silhouette of a Roman woman with a long, straight nose was typical of the early nineteenth century. Around 1850, women traveling to Italy desired a cameo with more modern features. Carvers began producing designs of women's portraits with an upturned nose, more elaborate hairstyles, and portraits that included women wearing jewelry.

Detractors have equated the appearance of the unknown women with a decline in craftsmanship and a loss of imagination by the cameo carvers. This criticism has not affected the popularity of this design. The unknown women have changed over the years, yet they have endured.

Cameo Habillé

Artisans of the nineteenth century created a slightly different look to the unknown woman's portrait with the cameo habillé. The woman herself was shown wearing a necklace and/or other jewelry such as earrings or a diadem of small diamonds. Throughout the years, the jewelry on this type of cameo has taken on different styles with a variation of the diamonds and their arrangement in the portrait. Like the portrait of the unknown woman, the cameo habillé is a design produced in the present day.

The work of cameo copiers in a broad range of new materials had an adverse effect on jewelry in the nineteenth century. The upper classes felt horrified that affordable fakes and copies allowed the masses to wear expensive looking jewelry. The stone and shell cameo industry diminished because their prices were too high for the growing market. Jewelry collectors who realized how they had been fooled by fakes and forgeries lost interest in collecting cameo jewelry.

20th Century

The original quality of master stone and shell carvers gave way to cameos that required little thought to design. The production of shell and stone cameos continued to a lesser degree after World War II. Inexpensive jewelry became popular with the use of synthetic materials and inexpensive metals. Celluloids, Bakelite, gutta-percha, jet, and amber were among the materials used in making cameos during the early years of the 20th century.



While the unknown woman continued to be a popular design for cameo artists, cameo portraits of the twentieth century took on a different look from the older pieces. Carvers modernized the features of the anonymous women. The noses in the designs now depicted a more upturned and sometimes pert look. The hairstyles changed with the times from long and flowing romantic look to a shorter style with waves or curls.


Late 20th Century

Cameo production changed in the mid-twentieth century. Shortages of materials and resources to produce jewelry drastically affected the making of shell cameos. Their production came to a virtual standstill in Italy while in the United States, renewed patriotism created an atmosphere of thrift that influenced fashion. Costume jewelry became the vogue, and manufacturers began to produce lovely costume jewelry, including cameo designs.

Jewelry manufacturers met the demand and offered attractive, affordable cameos. Plastic and clear glass jewelry of molded designs were plentiful. While these cameos did not have the same craftsmanship of the carved shell and stone cameos, they had their own style and enjoyed popularity.



> With a renewed interest in shell cameos, carvers work in the 1990s to create beautiful pieces with exquisite detail. The center of shell cameo production is the picturesque coastal town of Torre Del Greco, Italy. Here, carvers create shell cameos in a variety of different designs.

The proximity of Torre del Greco, located on the coast of Italy and at the foot of Mt. Vesuvius, caused the town to benefit from an abundance of lava, coral, and shell. It was inevitable that this seaside town would become the world center of cameo design. A carving school began in 1878, and the artisans of Torre del Greco embraced the art of producing cameos.

One example of a company that continues the art of cameo design is the Di Luca Brothers. This firm employs eighty-five carvers who follow the esteemed tradition which began with the early carvers. The beautiful designs of the shell cameos cover a wide variety of subjects from portraits of women to mythological scenes.

The work of the carvers at this company shows the modernization of cameos in the 1990s. An interesting aspect of the carvings is the change in the motif of the generalized woman. The designs now show women in motion or with long, flowing hair that blows in the breeze. When choosing subjects for their work, the carvers at Di Luca select designs that will appeal to their customers around the world.

A company once located in Torre del Greco, Tagliamonte now makes its home in Vicenza, Northern Italy. Tagliamonte brings a Classical yet modern look to their designs with colorful cameo and intaglio jewelry made of glass pastes. The lavastoneware cameos are reminiscent of the look and the designs of the Victorian era.

Tagliamonte has returned to the process began by early Romans as well as James Tassie in creating cameos and intaglios. The subjects for these cameos are Classical, yet this jewelry has a certain sophistication that makes it sought after by clients all over the world.

Studying Cameos

Studying cameos is especially rewarding for an individual with a keen interest in history and art. As one handles cameos, it becomes possible to identify the period and material of each cameo or intaglio. Discovering a cameo's material, how it looks, and how it feels is an important part of its history. The quality of the carving and its appeal will help determine whether it should become part of a collection.

Examining a cameo through magnification is vital for discerning the composition of the cameo and its setting or frame. The metal or other material used in the setting and the design are clues in dating a cameo. The metal alloy, pinchbeck, is a substance to look for, and search for the marks that identify gold or silver content. Sometimes, the metal work is exquisite and signed by the carver or manufacturer. Signatures on the backs of cameos may require some extra research, and the need to consult an expert may be indicated to identify one of the many forged signatures of expert cameo carvers.

Judging the cameo or intaglio by its quality, whether the piece is antique or contemporary, is important. Look at the carving carefully and handle many cameos to learn to identify a shell or stone cameo.


Cameos are interesting accents to clothing, and the plastic and glass cameos are fun to wear because they are durable and inexpensive. Found in antique shops and at estate sales, many old cameos are set in beautiful Victorian or Art Nouveau frames. More recent cameos are quite collectible and readily available.















































Glossary

- Agate A form of chalcedony with bands of color or irregular clouding.
- Amber A substance of brown, yellow, red, orange, gray, or green fossil resin that is translucent and commonly found along the Baltic Shores.
- **Amethyst** A type of quartz that is transparent; it is purple or violet in color.
- Art Deco Refers to the period from 1910 through 1930 when there was an interest centered around modern art movements. Angular lines in jewelry were popular at this time.
- Art Nouveau A period between 1890 to 1910 during which fluid lines were prominent in jewelry. Some popular motifs were dragonflies, mourning glories, and women depicted with long, flowing hair.
- **Bakelite** The trademark name of a group of thermosetting plastics that have a high resistance to heat. Formulated by Belgian chemist, L. H. Bakeland, in 1909.
- **Bezel** A groove or flange that encircles a gem to hold it in its setting.
- Book Chain A necklace made of square or rectangular links which was popular from the 1850s to the 1890s.
- Bracelet A piece of jewelry that encircles the wrist.
- Brooch A decorative pin.
- **Cameo** A portrait or scene that is carved in relief. Cameos have been molded from natural materials and synthetics.
- **Cameo Habillé** A cameo portrait adorned with jewelry such as a necklace and/or earrings and diadem that contained one or more diamonds.
- **Carnelian** A type of clear chalcedony that varies from pale to deep red or reddish brown.
- Cast A mold of an original piece done in plaster of paris.
- Celluloid Trademarked in 1869 by John Wesley Hyatt, this flammable material is colorless and made of nitrocellulose and camphor.
- **Chalcedony** A transparent quartz found in various colors, often in milky or gray.
- **Coral** Made by marine organisms called polyps which attach themselves to an object and eventually die, leaving thier skeletons behind. Over a period of years, the polyps form coral. Color ranges from pink to red as well as black and white.

- Costume jewelry Refers to popular jewelry made of nonprecious materials.
- Crystal A mineral that is clear and transparent and resembles ice.
- Cut Steel Beads resembling marcasites.
- Demi-Parure Consists of two or three matching pieces in a set.
- Depose French word meaning "patent" or "copyright."
- Diadem A decorated headband which resembles a tiara.
- Diamond Extremely hard and valuable gem made of pure carbon, usually clear, but can be found in yellow, blue, black, or green.
- Die Stamping A process used in mass production of jewelry in which a design is cut in metal.
- Engraving A method of cutting lines into metal.
- Etruscan Refers to jewelry a style of jewelry originated by the ancient Etruscans in Italy from the 6th and 7th centuries. The jewelry saw a revival in the 19th century. Patterns of small gold beads on a gold background characterize Etruscan jewelry. Fornutato Pio Castellani, an Italian 19th century jeweler, is given credit for reviving the Etruscan style of jewelry.
- Faux In French, this word means "false."
- Filigree A procedure in which fine wire has been twisted into a lace or web like pattern.
- Fob Attached to a watch chain, this ornament was popular from the 1890s through the 1930s. Fobs experienced a revival with the renewed popularity of the pocket. Some fobs were set with intaglios or cameos.
- French Jet Refers to jewelry made of black glass.
- Georgian Refers to the period from 1714 to 1830 during which England was ruled by four of the Georges.
- Gold-Filled Comprised of a base metal with an outer layer of gold.
- **Granulation** Decoration of a metal surface using tiny grains or gold beads. This process is a characteristic of Etruscan jewelry, revived in the nineteenth century.
- Gutta-percha Made from the latex of tropical trees and used frequently during the nineteenth century.
- Hallmark A mark incised, stamped, or punched on silver or gold to show sterling or "carat" according to standards set by country of origin. Some require other information such as manufacturer, patent, and origin.

- Hematite An iron ore which can be red or brown. The crystals are found mostly in men's jewelry.
- High Relief Used to describe a cameo in which the carving rises up from the background and creates a three dimensional look.
- Intaglio A process opposite of cameo in which the artist carves into the stone below the surface.
- **Ivory** The yellowish, white, smooth substance that is hard and comes from the tusks of elephants. Often used to describe tusks from other animals or bone.
- Jet Used commonly in the nineteenth century, this substance was mined in Whitby, England, and was a type of fossilized coal.
- Karat (Carat) The weight of gems and gemstones or gold as set by a standard scale.
- Lapis A gemstone of deep blue that sometimes has small iron pyrite flecks.
- Lava A common substance for cameos in the early to late 1800s, lava from Pompeii ranged from a cream color, dark greens, dark brown, black, and white. The softness of the material allowed carvers to create beautiful high relief carvings.
- Locket A piece of jewelry that functions as a pendant and/ or a brooch and contains a compartment for a photograph or hair and a cover.
- Lyre Most closely associated with Apollo, this musical instrument resembles a harp.
- Marcasite A hard, white iron pyrite that is cut and set into sterling silver.
- Moonstone A feldspar known for its pearly translucent color.
- Mother-of-Pearl The internal layer of mollusk shells that is iridescent in color.
- Mounting A backing or a setting for a cameo or other piece of jewelry.
- **Opal** A translucent and sometimes iridescent gem composed of hydrated silicon dioxide.
- Parure A set which commonly includes a matching necklace, earrings, brooch, and bracelet.
- Pate-de-Verre Heavy paste glass in muted colors; produced from crystal and lead ground into paste, molded, and fired in a kiln.

- Pendant A suspended piece of jewelry attached to a necklace or bracelet.
- **Pinchbeck** A substance is made from an alloy of zinc to imitate gold. Created by Christopher Pinchbeck (1670-1732), a London alchemist, jeweler, and watchmaker.
- **Plastic** Synthetic products made from chemicals which could be molded or carved into shapes and fashioned into jewelry. Early plastics proved impractical because of flammability, but celluloid was used during the Victorian era, and Bakelite followed in the early 1900s.

Relief The projection of a figure from a flat background.

- **Repoussé** A method of decorating metal where a design is pushed out from the back to stand out in relief on the front.
- Rhinestone A clear, imitation stone that has the sparkle of a diamond and is made of paste or glass.
- Seed Pearl A small pearl often used on frames of cameos.
- Setting A mounting for a cameo or other piece of jewelry.
- Stick Pin Pin popular with men from around 1870 to the early 1900s. The pin was worn on a tie and had a small decorative piece at the top.
- **Topaz** An aluminum silicate mineral prized as a gemstone that varies in color from light yellow to deep orange.
- Tortoiseshell The covering of a sea turtle which is brown and translucent; used to make combs and jewelry.
- Vermeil Bronze copper or silver gilded and varnished to give a piece high luster. Usually a gold wash over silver.
- Victorian Era The years of Queen Victoria's reign (1837-1901). Queen Victoria's love of jewelry made it popular during her reign.
- Wedgwood English firm began by Josiah Wedgwood. Through the production of jaspar ware in blues and whites or greens and whites, the firm made hundreds of cameos as well as cuff links, rings, tie pins, and pendants. The motifs most often used were mythological.

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
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
