


PREFACE

The present Volume, merely a descriptive Catalogue of the most prominent pieces of my collection of Chinese Jade carvings, does in no way pretend to be more, as the time at my disposal has prevented me so far, from making a more scientific study of the subject.

If this Catalogue, the aim of which is to illustrate as large and as comprehensive a series of Jade articles as possible, serves the serious collector as a guide, and shows him what can still be found in China, it's raison d' être is accomplished, and if by the help of this work, new views on sundry antique rites and practices are opened or suggested, instigating new research and enquiries, the publication of this Catalogue more than justifies the expectation of the compiler.

INTRODUCTION

The Collection, to which this Volume serves as a Catalogue, has been chiefly brought together in the port of Kiukiang during the years 1913 to 1919. The various articles were to a great extent purchased from dealers, coming from Hunan, Honan and Anhui, the ancestral homes of many prominent, old Chinese families, which had for centuries hoarded up ancient Jades, either presented to their ancestors while in office, or purchased by them at a later time.

The disturbed state of these provinces and the continuous exposure of the inhabitants and their belongings to lawless bands of soldiers and robbers, coupled with the dire necessity of obtaining ready money, forced these unfortunates to dispose finally of some of their old heirlooms, often for centuries preserved in their family coffers.

Having already here and there collected Jade carvings, mostly however of comparatively modern workmanship, quite a new vista was opened through the reading of Mr. Laufer's highly interesting book on Jade, as published by the Field Museum of Natural History, Chicago 1912.

Following the impetus given by this work, a wider circle was made in the trial to obtain some authentic specimens of "Han" and "burial Jades". This resulted in the forthcoming of some scanty pieces, until aggravated disturbances in the middle provinces of China caused people to dispose of their possessions. Offers became then more frequent and more voluminous and articles, hardly known before, passed often into my hands, and became valuable additions to my collection.

During the reign of the Manchu dynasty, when presents (Li Wu) had to be given on certain occasions to all officials by their underlings and subordinates, in accordance with the rank of the recipient, old Jades were preferably chosen for this purpose on account of their more intrinsic value.

It is not surprising therefore, to find quite large numbers of such presentation-Jades in the possession of many old families, who had moreover contrived in the course of years to enrich their holdings with purchases of their own.

Great reluctance to dispose of some of the rarer and more interesting specimens of sepulchral Jades was shown in many instances, and was only surmounted after prologued bargaining and liberally augmented offers.

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GENERAL REMARKS



ARRANGEMENT OF COLLECTION.

The present collection has for technical reasons been divided into 2 parts.

Part I comprises all articles exhibited on wooden trays, or containing, generally speaking, specimens of smaller size, or of sufficiently flat shapes, usually of not more than $1\frac{3}{4}$ " thickness.

Part II embraces, on the other hand, objects of a larger size and more bulky form, for which likewise to provide trays, would have been too cumbersome.

The Belt-hooks and Buckles depicted on the first three plates of Part II, as well as the carvings of Agate, Ametyst, etc., and the Jade Snuffbottles on the last five plates do not come within the range of this collection, but were inserted in the illustrations, in order to complete as much as possible the exhibition.

USE AND EMPLOYMENT.

The raison d'être of quite a large part of ancient Jade articles remains still apocryphic, though a good many specimens have been identified in recent years.

Following the classification of these objects as given in Mr. B. Laufer's book and the Ku-Yü-Tu with certain modifications, we recognize the following classes:

Jade and other stone implements,

Symbols of sovereign power, or of rank and power conferred by the sovereign,

Astronomical implements and instruments,

Writing materials,

Objects used in religious worship, symbols, images, etc.,

Coins, seals, etc.,

Personal ornaments, such as: girdle pendants, belthooks- and clasps, courtgirdles, Hair-, Ear- and Cap-ornaments, sword guards, knobs, scabbard ornaments, etc., etc.,

Armlets for the dead, and preservers for various parts of the corpse,

Various grave offerings: like animals, figures, various implements, insignia of rank, etc. etc.,

Vases, plates, cups, etc. and

Jade objects of the 18th century.

With exception of astronomical instruments and writing materials the collection represents all the other sections. Especially rich are the series of armlets and grave offerings which contain numerous objects never illustrated before.

Quite astonishing is the number, of variously shaped, resonant stones met with. They seem to have been employed in every household, but must have been also specially manufactured as grave afferings, though it is not easy, at first sight, to establish any connection between such ornaments and the cult of the dead, or to suggest any valid reason, why such resonant stones should have been placed in the coffin.

The explanation is however not difficult to find and the theory becomes quite acceptable that in placing, for instance a resonant stone of the shape of a Chinese lute or cithern with the dead, the idea was not to offer a resonant stone, but the gift of a lute, representing matrimonial harmony.

Thus through association of ideas we find good reasons for quite a number of these grave offerings, while many more remain uncertain and undefinable.

In the preparation of the corpse for the coffin the following objects (protectors or preservers) were evidently used:

I. a large ring as headrest, round inside, but often hexagonal or octagonal on the outside,

2. a plate for the forehead,

3. Eye protectors; eyeshaped discs (yen she),

4. Nose protectors: A. a half round bridgelike object and

B. pinlike articles for the nostrils, generally ending in a broad knob,

5. Ear protectors: (Erh shē),

6. Tongue protectors (ya shē),

7. Lip and teeth protectors,

8. Chin and beard protectors,

9. Breast protectors for men and women,

10. Chest protectors, mostly in heartshape, (Chi-Hsin-pei, or Chicken-heart-tablets)

11. Umbilic protectors,

12. Phallos protectors, (Yang Kai) in tube -, or vertically bisected tube shape

13. Womb protectors (Yin Kai),

14. Protectors for the back and posterior,

15. Protectors for the knees,

16. Protectors for the calves and

17. Protectors for the heels.

The forms and shapes of many of the above objects vary so considerably, that it becomes often exceedingly difficult to define what class they belong to.

It is thus quite possible that some specimens are erroneously denominated also in this Catalogue, but I have followed, in the absence of more reliable information, the opinion of several Chinese, interested in the subject, who had handled such old Jades since their infancy.

Quite a number of hitherto doubtful articles may be identified as belonging to sets of Insignia (I-Chang), of rank or authority, carried before the Emperor, princes and high officials when going in state.

It is highly probable that these insignia were not all of Jade, when in actual use, but that such Jade symbols were especially manufactured for the coffin, to allow the spirit of the deceased to arrive with a full display of rank and dignity in the next world.

A circumstance connected with these Insignia is the rule that they were always used in pairs or multiples of pairs.

The Ku-Yü-Tu illustrates only very few of them and I have unfortunately so far failed to find anywhere a complete list, for the various grades of official rank.

Some of the most noted of these Insignia are:

Pairs of suns, - in form of round discs, or of other shapes with the carving of a sun,

Pairs of moons in crescent shape, Pairs of large axes or Yueh (鉞), Pairs of long lances or So (架), Pairs of knives or Tao (刀), Pairs of bows or Kung (弓), Pairs of arrows or Chien (箭), Pairs of spears or Mao (矛), Pairs of halberds or Chi (戟).

A number of the above are illustrated on table 56 of Part I and on table No.46 of Part II, but there are unquestionably a good many more which can at present not be identified solely from their Chinese denominations.

INSCRIPTIONS.

While most of the oldest Jades found, are plain and devoid of any inscriptions, the later periods of the Han dynasty already, commence with more elaborate carvings. They often denote the reign, during which the article was manufactured, and allow frequently conclusions to be drawn from their style and decoration, with regard to their use and employment.

Welcome as even such circumstantial information is to the collector, - there exist, to his annoyance, a host of other inscriptions, made centuries after, on such old Jades, prompted by the desire to further corroborate their antiquity. But unfortunately after-generations did not confine themselves to additional inscriptions but also indulged in further ornamentation, as such old pieces in their unpresuming plainness did not satisfy the prevalent taste of the age.

Grotesquely crude designs and coarse workmanship were the results, often executed by illiterate hands, which accounts for the many inscriptions, faulty in style and composition with wrongly used or wrongly written characters, rendering a translation often well nigh impossible.

An amusing incident showing how easily such blunders were made is the following:



Numerous specimens in the collection bearing the characters of Hsuan Yuan's reign $(\stackrel{(=)}{\equiv} \overline{\pi})$, search was made in chronological tables and historical works in order to determine that period according to our western reckoning.

Our search proved however in vain, as nowhere a trace of a Hsuan Yuan period could be found.

As ultima ratio some Chinese works on numismatics were gone through and here a coin was found which seemed to shed light on the matter.

This coin, of which a facsimile is herewith given, should have it's legend read from the top round the right: "Hsuan-Ho-yuan-pao", contrary to the way such coins are usually read, viz. top, bottom, right and left.

The engraver, probably during Hsuan Ho's time, must have deciphered the legend in the wrong order, taking the characters for the reign as Hsuan Yuan instead of Hsuan Ho and gone on with his carving happy and with the best of conscience.

Inscriptions on all the specimens illustrated have as far as was feasible been transliterated and translated and are to be found in the special appendix to their respective Parts under the Heading of "Chinese Inscriptions".

Only a few had to be abandoned being too faulty to make any sense.

COLOURS.

Next to Inscriptions, employment and designs, the most interesting point in these old Jades are the colours of which there exist a great variety.

An attempt has been made in the appended comparative colour Plates to exhibit the most noteworthy shades, bringing as many interchanging colours as was possible within the range of the illustrations.

These comparative Plates will be found very useful for subsequent collectors to show them, on a broad line, what colours exist and can be found.

But also here there exist deceptive pieces in numbers, the Chinese being past masters in the production of imitations.

Report says that various acids are used to colour Jade, and also that new pieces are or were often buried in quicklime with dead animals, after which process and 3 years patience the Jades had changed their colour and were hardly detectable from genuine ancient pieces, unless the new with the old were seen together.

Generally it is the tout-ensemble, which allows a decision to be arrived at with regard to the genuineness of Jade-Articles or their imitations.

Colours help a great deal, but with colours, workmanship and general designs must go hand in hand, and where one of these is defective, the piece is not what it pretends to be.

Mention must be made however of another large class of Jades, to which the above suggested proofs of genuineness can only be applied to a limited extent, — I mean the carvings made in later times of genuine Han dynasty boulders or blocks.

Here we may have the identical old colours with exquisite Ming or Kang Hsi carving, making an article not less valuable than if emanating, as a whole, direct from Han times.

Modern Jades, unless tampered with, exhibit only a few colours. We have here:

White and milky, semitransparent or muttonfat,

White opaque,

Yellowish, very light semitransparent and muttonfat,

Green, from the very light applegreen to dark grassgreen,

Grey, milky, semitransparent,

Grey, opaque and

a mottled green and black-called "p'i yü".

Ancient Jades on the other hand show very many and variegated colours often 3 to 4 even 5 different ones, running or shading off into each other.

The more variety of distinct colours a piece has, the more valuable and appreciated it becomes.

With regard to ancient Jades, the Chinese differentiate between 3 classes according to the origin of these stones, namely the Tung-tu ($\bar{p} \pm$), Nan-tu ($\bar{p} \pm$), and Hsi-tu ($\bar{m} \pm$), meaning Jades, having been found in the East, the South, or the West respectively.

The following table, giving the Chinese denominations for the various colours and shades of ancient Jades, according to Chinese classification is here included for what it is worth.

Far from being exhaustive, the table is so vague in its denominations, and anything but precise in the Chinese terms of colours, that it fails to give us any tolerably correct impression as to what shades or colours are meant.

A far better idea with respect to the various colours existing, will be gained by the perusal of the appended seven Plates of Comparative colours, containing only specimens chosen from the present collection.

While great difficulties presented themselves in the printing of these plates in the precise colours as the originals, the illustrations are near enough, except in a few minor details, to convey a pretty correct idea.

Two or three specimens on these plates are not of jade, but were included as belonging to the collection.

CHINESE DENOMINATIONS AND CLASSIFICATION OF ANCIENT JADES ACCORDING TO COLOURS.

DESCRIPTIONS

The first four plates deal chiefly with articles of comparatively modern workmanship; the majority of the specimens do not date earlier than the Ming dynasty, and only a few go back to Sung times.

Plates 1 and 2 show carvings with a plain under cut, — without à jour work. Plate 1 depicts some pieces of exceedingly fine workmanship, as for instance No. 7, which is of Sung dynasty origin and Nos. 947 and 710, probably Ming dynasty specimens. Others like Nos. 36 and 31 are prominent on account of the difficulty the work has entailed, to carve in comparative high relief the very hard substance, without piercing the back ground. Plate 2 gives, besides the two very fine girdle pendants Nos. 1450 and 85, eight specimens of inlaid and incrustated work, very prettily and artistically executed in various coloured stones.

Plates Nos. 3 and 4 illustrate objects both pierced and carved and we have especially on plate No. 3 some really beautiful specimens of the Jade cutters art. There are pieces with a very fine, diaper-pierced, back ground, carved in two and even in three depths, one carved out layer, so to say, over and above the other, but both lower than the actual surface.

The most prominent numbers are 1014 and 18, also No. 137 and No. 1A, the last being of Sung dynasty date.

Plates 5, 6 and 7 contain illustrations of round discs of various sizes, with circular centre perforations, mostly of Han dynasty origin. Some of these are plain, some with carved and raised Hydras, grain pattern, or sleeping Silkworms, etc.

These round discs the Ku-yü-tu-pu (古玉圖及) divides into three classes namely the "Pi (璧)", the "Yuan (瑗)" and the "Huan (環)". The "Pi", with a breadth of approximately double the diameter of the centre perforation, were princispally used in religious worship, as they represented the deity of heaven; they were employed at sacrifices, were often presented to the emperor by feudal princes and finally frequently bestowed, as funeral gifts, by the emperor on deceased meritorious officials.

The "Yuan", with their centre perforations of approximately double the breadth of the surrounding part, served probably (see Laufer) as girdle pendants, a circumstance they had in common with the "Huan", though the perforations of the latter, had obligatory to be the same width as the surrounding substance. Besides being worn as girdle pendants, these "Huan" were given by the emperor as authority for commands or messages sent, and were also often presented as congratulatory offerings to friends, etc.

The "Yuans", on plates 5, 6 and 7 are probably Nos. 1092, 774, 939, 897, 1492 and 1537; most of the smaller discs, there exhibited, being "Huan", while those of larger sizes belong to the "Pi" class.

The majority of these discs "Pi, Yuan and Huang", as already mentioned, belong to the series of articles used for religious worship, others were attributes and insignia of rank and others again were merely used as girdle pendants or complimentary gifts. A very remarkable disc is No. 933 in the middle of table No. 5, being of a creamy white colour and showing red veins. With regard to this specimen I must refer here to the old Chinese report, that the blood of the corpse penetrates certain jade objects, burried with it, so that when excavated they show red veins.

No. 90 on plate No. 7 is another specimen of this kind. The so-called grain pattern, conssiting of raised dots placed in regular rows, is demonstrated by No. 877 of plate 5 and by Nos. 759 and 768 on plates 6 and 7 respectively. No. 888 on plate 5 shows the pattern called "Sleeping Silkworms", also brought to notice by No. 1431 and No. 1036 of plate No. 7.

Plate No. 8, after illustrating a few more of such round discs with centre holes, partly highly decorated and supported by pierced and carved Hydras, depicts a number of cicadas in various shapes used as girdle pendants, and also three specimens of the so styled Chüeh, (玞) worn, according to Laufer, by women as girdle ornaments.

These Chueh (玦), or broken rings, were chiefly used by the emperor when dismissing or renouncing the services of officials or banishing them from his presence.

People leaving a place for good, are also reported to have worn such a Chueh when departing, so it is not surprising in consequence that these Chueh were largely used as offerings to the dead, as they had severed their relation with this world for ever.

The designs given in this connection by Laufer were probably made exclusively for women on account, as he says, of the phallic traces in their decorations. I doubt however that they were used as "womb protectors", as I am in a position to illustrate some of these objects, obtained from certain old Hunan families and recognised by several independent authorities as the real "Yin-Kai" (see plate No. 56).

Several more Chüeh of other shapes and designs are shewn on plate No. 20.

The three following plates Nos. 9, 10 and 11 expose a large variety of suspension ornaments to the greater part of modern work manship.

With regard to the great number and variety of these so-called "suspension ornaments", which include also girdle pendants, etc., it must be noted that there is hardly a Chinese gentleman, or well-to-do person, up to the present day who does not carry a piece of jade on his body.

He will suspend it from a button of his waistcoat, or hang it on his belt below the long coat, but a piece of jade and preferably a piece of Han jade, he will have.

Many articles that were made and carved for quite other purposes have become thus, through usage, suspension ornaments and to these belong many of the already noted smaller discs, and the carved animals on the following tables.

A great interest is taken in the colour of these jades, the articles becoming more valuable with the variety and number of distinct colours they show - and those, havins clearly pronounced, or rare shades, command quite large prices.

Our Western eyes have to become more educated first before we are able to perceive and appreciate the points of beauty in shape or colour of these objects, especially if they go beyond the ordinary and are therefore so much thought of and loved by all Chinese.

Plate 9 gives pendants of Chinese lockshape, principally worn by children round their necks, the table showing both, upper surfaces and reverses in corresponding vertical rows.

Plate 10 has suspension ornaments of various shapes, some of exceedingly fine workmanship and a great variety of colours.

Plate 11 after continuing such pendants of jade, exhibits some more of crystal, Agate and Amethyst, mostly carved in a way to bring the different colours of the material into the best prominence, like No. 1057 where a bunch of white grapes is held up by a brown squirrel.

A further variety of suspension ornaments and girdle pendants are seen on plates 12 and 13 but these depicted here are all in the shape of animals and mythological monsters.

We have here tigers, lions, turtles, frogs, dogs, cows, goats, monkeys and mythological Chan (the 3 legged frogs) etc., etc. Notable is the tiger tablet No. 1143 on plate 12, which has evidently been used as an imperial authority given to the General in Chief.

Of rather a comical effect are some of the monkeys on the same plate, as for instance No. 244 a monkey with a horse, No. 322 the playing monkeys, or Nos. 998 and 329.

On plate 13 we find amongst Elephants, Ponies, Deer, Cows and Lions, also tigers playing with their cubs and again, a subject of frequent recrudescence, the monkey and the horse.

Plate 14 displays a collection of ornaments in fruit or flower shapes.

We notice here Gourds, Citrons, Mushrooms, Pomegranates, Cherries, Plums, Peaches, etc., etc.

These fruit-carvings are, however, not excluisvely of jade, as quite a number, made of agate, amethyst and other stones have also been included in this plate as for instance Nos. 317, 368, 1581, 424, 433, etc.

Plate 15, after disposing of suspension ornaments and pendants shows a variety of articles of triangular form, which have very likely been used, suspended in wood frames as resonant stones.

Next in the order come belt ornaments; some with carved grain pattern, some with Hydras and some with a loop below, evidently for the purpose of hanging or hooking other ornaments to them.

The scabbard ornaments following, are all flat below and rounded above, showing the usual ornamentation of Hydras, grain pattern, etc., etc.

The next objects claiming our attention, are "Cap ornaments"; these are supposed to have been fixed at the back of the ancient official hat, the perforations below having served for the insertion of various tassel decorations.

These hat ornaments are generally quite plain, without any engraving or carving.

To this Class possibly belongs also No. 1005 which terminates on both sides in a bird's head, ornamented on the body with three arrow heads.

The rest of the specimens, classed as various carvings, are to all intents and purposes also suspension ornaments.

Amongst these we have No. 449, a figure of Liu Hai and his 3 legged mythological frog, called "Chan"; we have No.807 a group of two laughing Hsien (immortals) and No. 418 a very curious vertical section of a bamboo with a carved bird above.

Plates 16 and 17 exhibit tablets of rank and religious worship. The first commences with a row of pointed tablets plain or carved, some like Nos. 1881, 1622, or 1884, undoubtedly with later carving and inscriptions.

No. 1954, with it's reverse given on Plate No. 17, is according to the inscription an imperial tablet, but it may have served also as an emblem of rank or authority, conferred by the Emperor on subordinate high officials; No. 1990 belongs probably to the same series.

A further selection of such tablets is displayed on plate No. 17; where the most prominent are No. 1764 a Hydra and a fish emerging from the waves of the sea-, and Nos. 2106 and 2050, the former with a rectangular base-line, the latter with a slanting base.

The next objects claiming attention are the so-called "Kuei-pi", a combination of a round disc and pointed tablet.

The plate figures five of these; one decorated with sleeping worms, one with two Hydras and constellation, two with tigerfaces and Hydras and finally one with the usual grain pattern.

Plate No. 18 illustrates various other tablets; No. 2209, with the inscription "Lung Men" was customarily suspended on or about the door of a successful candidate, after his state examination. No. 2108 depicts the Chinese Adam, the first man, holding a triangular flag, an ancient presentation tablet, being shewn in No. 2120 with the small side inscription doubtlessly added later.

The same plate acquaints us with five circular mirrors, all ornamented with carvings of tiger faces or Hydras, two having straight handles in addition.

The flying Hydras on plate No. 19 have probably all seen their service as resonant stones; interesting are the various types of these Hydras!

Plate No. 20 continues to show Hydras in various forms. We find here curled Hydras, sitting Hydras and Hydras in pairs of an interesting variety, having been presumably worn as suspension ornaments, or belt-pendants.

No. 1224, a Hydra head with a loop below belongs probably to the class of belt-hooks.

Further suspension ornaments are the specimens with carved phenixes and the very curious Nos. 1034 and 1155, the former with a pair of Hydras facing each other, the latter, it's counterpart, with two phenixes. The series of resonant stones and suspension ornaments is continued on plates No. 21 and 22, showing Fishes, single and double, with or without lotus leaves etc. The bigger size specimens served unquestionably as musical or resonant ornaments, while the carved fishes of lesser dimensions were suspension ornaments or girdle pendants.

A very fine specimen of ancient art is No. 1362 on plate No. 21.

No. 1732 the pair of fishes on plate 22 is of a softer material, probably a kind of white marble.

The following four plates Nos. 23 to 26 illustrate a lot, of axe shaped, suspension ornaments, or ceremonial axes in extremely varying shapes, each with a suspension hole above.

Some of these were undoubtedly symbols of authority and power bestowed by the Emperor on Generals and other high officials, some were pure and simple resonant stones, while others again were evidently manufactured for the purpose of being placed as insignia of rank and power in the coffin with the dead.

The two very peculiar round axes with hydra-heads Nos. 1684 and 1515 on plate 23 are presumably girdle pendants they are both of a light brownish-yellow colour resembling sandalwood.

No. 2089 on the same plate is a decidedly later production, the carving being coarser and the inscription faulty.

Plate No. 24 has some very fine samples of these axes the foremost of which being No. 1687 a very artistically executed specimen of splendid colour.

No. 1548 is without doubt, a girdle-pendant; originally pure white it is now shading off into rose, yellow and dark red brown.

Both Nos. 1687 and 1548 are to be found also on the plates of comparative colours, where No. 1763, an ancient stone axe of grey, brown and black mottled mineral, has also been included.

Plate No. 25 continues ornamental axes and demonstrates amongst others a very fine one, especially as to colouring, in No. 1972 B, also to be found on the plate of comparative colours.

Plate No. 26 has amongst other axeshaped objects, some of smaller dimensions which undoubtedly served as suspension ornaments for the girdle or belt.

Plate No. 27, after showing some more axes and hatchetshaped articles, like Nos. 2127 and 2151, both with later inscriptions, —illustrates some interesting spear heads. Nos. 2132 and 2137 were probably insignia of rank, as carried before officials in their cortege, while Nos. 2091 and 2145, both in knife shape, were made to resemble the coins of the Wang Mang period.

A further display of axes, spearheads and daggers is shewn on plate 28, all of them belonging to the class of insignia of rank, or presented to officials as special imperial favour.

No. 2232 is a curious sample of a spearhead having the wheel of law surrounded by flames on the lower part. Nos. 1373, 1321 and 2109 are supposed to be, cap ornaments, followed by three specimens of circular coins.

Plate No. 29 opens with a variety of human figures, the majority representing the Hsien of old Age with either a long staff or a peach branch. Another figure frequently met with is the standing Wēng-Tsung, the so-called "ancestor", especially. made to be placed, according to Chinese reports, in the hands of the corpse.

The smaller figures on plate 29 belong chiefly to a comparative late date and are pure and simple belt-and suspension ornaments.

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Quite a number of "Weng-Tsung figures," similar to the ones just remarked upon, are further illustrated on plate 30. The objects in tube shape, Nos. 1857, 1978a, 1372, etc. are supposed to have been used to encase some of the leather parts of bridles and harness and might thus be styled as "Harness ornaments".

On the same plate we notice a selection of small Seals, square, rectangular and round together with their impressions, but refer here the reader at the same time to the larger specimens depicted on plates Nos. 38 to 40 of Part II.

On plate No. 31 appear some very interesting objects which, as far as I am aware, have never before been illustrated. We have here first of all various shapes of "Yin-Kai" or womb-preservers for the female corpse, viz. Nos. 3222 and 2318, each with a small hole at one end.

Then follow 3 Phallos preservers, of which both sections are exhibited.

These are like vertically bisected tubes, and have evidently been employed in pairs.

On plate No. 46 of Part II some more of these objects will be found, there however not in two parts but in full tube form.

The next objects on the same plate are hair pins and hair ornaments, Nos. 1561 and 1566 being modern. These are followed by some smaller tubes and beads in various shapes probably used as harness and hat ornaments.

Plate No. 32 has a variety of "Erh-Shē" and "Ya-Shē", Ear and Tongue protectors respectively, and a further number of hair pins and ornaments mostly of round shapes with carved hydras.

No. 2081, A and B, also supposed to be ear protectors, are so different in shape from the ordinary ones, already mentioned, that it would not be surprising if they had really served quite another purpose, possibly as nose-protectors, for insertion into the nostrils.

Of the two undefined articles Nos. 769 and 919, the former was probably an instrument used to untie knots with having become blunted in the course of centuries, while the second in nail shape with a round head may have been a nose protector for insertion into the nostrils.

Plate No. 33 begins with a number of round discs, used as umbilic protectors for the dead.

Some of these are plain, the majority however exhibit carved hydras or tiger heads and some even human faces. No. 2084 and 2083 are undoubtedly nose protectors.

The four following specimens of concavely cut, round articles, with centre perforation, are breast protectors for women. Six specimens of beard protectors all in crescent shape conclude the plate.

The collection of heartshaped objects on plate No. 34, commonly called "Chicken heart tablets" (Chi-Hsin-pei), served according to Chinese reports, as chest protectors.

Those with a round centre perforations viz Nos. 1503, 1382, 1215, 1841 and 1765 may have seen their use as girdle pendants but No. 1841 seems rather too heavy an object to have been carried about by anyone with any comfort.

No. 1382 is carved from bone-white jade with a yellow strata above which latter has been utilized for a raised hydra.

Plate No. 35 reverts again to Hatchets and Knives, in all probability, insignia of rank and authority, some especially manufactured for the Coffin.

We have here three axeshaped hatchets with handles and three others of halberd form, while Nos. 1956 and 1967, are much enlarged facsimiles of coins issued by the rebel Wang Mang and called after him.

No. 1956 bears rather a curious inscription: "one knife is equal to 5,000" the meaning of which, as given in the "translation of Inscriptions", strengthens the opinion that this class of knifeshaped objects was specially conferred on some dignitaries as power and authority to deal out capital punishment.

Plate No. 36 continues Hatchets and Knives and shows some very interesting specimens, like No. 1935, with a human head on the handle and No. 1797 with the same inscription just remarked upon for No. 1956.

Amongst the following specimens classified as "Sword knobs" and "Sheath points", we find some quite plain, others with carved hydras and No. 1411 and 649 in the form of a swan or cockerel respectively.

Plate No. 37 shows further additions to the hatchet- and knife-division depicting yet more varieties, with other inscriptions, bringing like No. 2328 (see Ch. Inscriptions) further proof for the raison d'être of these implements.

Under various carvings we find No. 2153, a chessboard, while a curiously shaped plain tablet with a centre hole and a tooth-like projection on one side, remains undefined with regard to its employment. No. 2300 judging from its inscription, is merely a presentation tablet, wishing the recipient long life and happiness, joined in this respect by No. 2282, a heartshape tablet, with a carved tiger above, bearing the twelve cycle characters for the 24 hours of the day and night.

Tablets Nos. 2163 and 2239 on plate No. 38 have identical inscriptions and were evidently presents from the Emperor. Nos. 2058, 2034, 2200, 2036 and 2208 A, styled "Hu t'ou pai" (虎 頭 牌), are evidently door or gate tablets and as such probably the forerunners of the "Tiger-head boards" exhibited during the Manchu dynasty at the entrance of all Yamens or official residences.

The lockshaped tablet No. 2240 is possibly also a door ornament, the same as Nos. 2078 a and b, the circular Tiger heads with moveable rings in their mouths, and their rather odd inscription on the reverses, possibly added during a later period.

Plate No. 39 brings further specimens of door tablets, like Nos. 2299 and 2272, and the two rectangular, probably imperial plaques, with suspension holes above.

The rest of the articles displayed on this table are presumably presentation tablets, the two in fancy scroll shape, carved probably during a later period.

Six baskets with flowers, reported to be also door ornaments, are exhibited on plate No. 40; No. 2115 being an ordinary suspension ornament for belt or girdle.

The two semi circular segments, one with a carved hydra the other with a tiger and sun may possibly have seen their use as beard protectors, though there are reasons against this supposition.

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The two tiger heads given under Nos. 1742 and 1746 are undoubtedly door or gate ornaments, while the purport of the last two specimens on the plate of spoon-shape, both with carved and raised hydras, No. 1846 with an inscription, evidently added at a later time, can not be established at present.

The birds on plate No. 41 augment the series of suspension ornaments; we have here swans, ducks, mandarin ducks, etc., some of genuine Han Jade, and others of Sung and Ming dynasty origin.

The same plate displays a collection of variously shaped "Mushrooms of longevity". The two large ones Nos. 1998 and 1716 have probably been presentation Ju-i, while the smaller ones may have been employed as suspension ornaments or girdle pendants.

Various facsimiles of ancient coins are the subject of plate No. 42; the four specimens Nos. 1918, 1927, 1920 and 1929 are of the so-called Wang Mang variety in knife form with a round disc at one end.

On plate 43 appears a variety of large and small sword-and dagger guards in many contrasting designs.

Doubtful as to their classification are however Nos. 1859 and 1531, both with circular perforations, and No. 1677, with rather too large an aperture for the insertion of a sword.

A number of citherns or lute-shaped objects of varying sizes are given on plate No. 44 and judging from the inscription on several of these instruments, it is pretty sure, that these articles were used chiefly as wedding presents and ultimately as grave offerings, the blending of the sound of lute and harp (Cithern) being accepted as the idea of matrimonial harmony.

Plate No. 45 contains a number of large and small, spatula-shaped, implements, the actual use of which we have to leave for the present undefined.

Some of these have been employed no doubt as spatulae, to mix and stir medicines and ointments, while some of the smaller ones are classed by the Chinese as Cithern Keys, meaning implements used in strumming the chords.

Nos. 530, 529, 1038 and 68 were presumably mere suspension ornaments.

Plate No. 46 depicts various animals, vertically bisected and used as tallies for agreements or contracts.

Imperial commands and verbal orders were often thus transmitted to persons possessing one of these halves, by messengers carrying the corresponding other half, as proof of their good faith.

Most of these objects are in tiger form, only No. 1147 shows the shape of a fish.

The plate illustrates both sides of these tallies one convex and the other concave, fitting closely together, nearly all bearing the character "tung", the equivalent of "Contract" or "agreement".

Amongst the various unclassed carvings on the same plate we have No. 2003 a fish emerging from waves, and No. 1850 a wither's head, the latter possibly a door ornament; we notice further a heartshaped piece No. 2111 and an implement of crescent-shape with a hole below evidently intended for the insertion of a staff, belonging probably to a set of (I-Chang) insignia of rank, as carried in procession before high officiales.

Plate No. 47 starts with a number of rings of various sizes generally styled "Coffin rings" though there is no explanation

as to their actual use or meaning. Amongst these we have two, Nos. 1543 and 2293 with four projections, transforming the simple ring into the "Symbol of the Deity of the Earth".

The same symbol is represented by the small tubes on the same plate with exception of No. 1169 which is round both in- and outside and not square outside, the obligatory form of those objects.

The small rings which follow represent to a great extent the samee Symbol whenever they happen to be of the prescribed form.

The next specimens in pin shape are cap and ear ornaments.

Nos. 1590 and 1592, b are reported to be stands for the insertion of joss sticks in the coffin; No. 1538 is undoubtedly an instrument to untie knots with and No. 1665 probably an implement to wind up thread.

A plume holder of modern date is shown by No. 44 but Nos. 950, 927 and 698 have to remain undefined.

The last row on the plate represents archers' rings of varying dates and workmanship, some quite plain others carved. On plate No. 48 appear again specimens of resonant stones, further a memorial tablet No. 2097 and an article, probably a beard protector No. 2113.

No. 419, a carved shell is a suspension ornament, while Nos. 1944 and 1310 remain unidentified.

The two following plates Nos. 49 and 50 deal with bell-shaped suspension ornaments, in all probability used as resonant stones with the exception of the smaller ones which evidently served as girdle pendants.

Plate No. 49 shows some very fine specimens; No. 1735 is a very rare piece on account of its colour and No. 2301, another prominent bell, indicates by its inscription "Golden bell" clearly that it is another resonant stone.

Plate No. 50 continues large and small bells of various shapes, No. 708 being of especially fine bone-brown colour.

The axeshaped implement No. 1704 is erroneously given on this plate and should have more correctly been classified with the other axes on plates Nos. 24, 25 or 26. The smaller bells at the end of the plate are probably also girdle pendants and should have been classed with them. The bell series is continued on the next plate No. 51, and here we have in addition to various bells some cap ornaments Nos. 816 and 1027, a few small Snuffbottles and various other carvings amongst which No. 2292, a ring with a carved lion above, one of a pair, reported to have been made for the hands of the corpse.

The following Nos. 2317 and 2290 are further additions to the list of resonant stones, while No. 2307, an object in gate form served probably as an arm rest when writing.

No. 2324 is undoubtedly a pencil rest and Nos. 1610 and 1938 both presumably girdle pendants.

A very curious specimen on this plate is No. 2196, unquestionably of Han origin, a beautifully carved Hydra biting in it's own tail.

This is presumably another specimen of the "Chüch" – or broken ring class, some samples of which have already been given on plate 8 and plate No. 20.

The leaf- and fruitcarvings on plate No. 52 represent further forms of resonant stones and suspension ornaments.

No. 2216, a leaf with a carved tiger, eating an insect, is rather a curious subject while No. 2091 a section of a bamboo, with a carved heron was evidently intended as an object of presentation to an aged person, the heron being a symbol of longevity.

Very interesting is also the implement with a monsters head given under No. 1965, which owing to it's perforation may have been employed as a resonant stone or as a girdle pendant, though the tail end of it, finishing in a kind of handle, would rather oppose this assumption.

The two small specimens Nos. 1480 and 1506, the former with carved bats and the latter with raised insects are suspension ornaments, probably of a later date.

Amongst the various carvings shown on plate 53 are two fans, meant as attributes of some of the eight Hsien, standing thus for their personification; we notice further No. 1524 a carving of a fish, with a small figure above, and another archaic tiger No. 1979, evidently intended also as a sonorous stone.

Interesting is the cangue-shaped implement No. 1882, with a tiger face above; this was most probably a symbol of authority to punish people and presumably used as a door tablet, like the ordinary "Hu tou pai" or tiger head boards, to signify the residence or office of an official with powers to punish.

No. 2228, a tablet in scroll shape, depicts five old men, looking at an open painting, bearing the diagram of the male and female principle, most likely made and presented to some person who attained high age.

No. 1942 and the two discs Nos. 2165 and 2202 are left unclassed.

Plate No. 54 contains some more tiger-head door tablets viz. Nos. 2344 and 2391, the latter having been bestowed by Imperial decree, as it's inscription tells us, on a General of great power and merit.

No. 2406 is another of those curious tablets with a toothlike projection on one side like the specimen already illustrated on table No. 37.

These tablets were undoubtedly conferred as authority on certain officials, but this is all that is known about them up to the present.

No. 2434 has the inscription: "State Jewel of the Han Country", presumably added in after times.

The rest of the articles on the plate must be considered as presentation tablets, of which.

No. 2427 was, according to it's inscription conferred, by an Imperial decree.

On plate No. 55 appear some more Hatchets and axeshaped implements, Nos. 2487 and 2432 having been unquestionably used as resonant stones.

The two hatchets Nos. 2476 and 1409 are remarkable on account o thier curious shapes, while No. 2483 is a specimen of most lovely colouring.

Plate No. 56 displays various insignia of rank and power as carried, always in pairs, before high officials in procession.

We find here No. 2467, b a crescent held up by a fish, probably representing the moon and a round disc, likewise borne by a fish as symbol of the sun.

Continuing these insignia we notice further two Halberd-heads Nos. 2405 a and b, a knife shaped instrument with a tooth like projection No. 1412b; and three more halberd heads of different shapes.

The two numbers 2405, d - and 2405, e belonging to the same set, are undefined but they may possibly have been substitutes for the crescent and disc, representing moon and sun respectively, an idea their carving would lead us to adopt.

Reference is made here to plate No. 46 of Part II which exhibits some more of these "I Chang" Insignia.

Nos. 2387 and 2380, on the same plate are reported to be womb protectors, of which several other specimens have already been illustrated on plate 31.

The two depicted here, have the form of a chinese cithern, and symbolize as usual – matrimonial felicity.

Plate No. 57 exhibits three additional objects of heart shape, two with a round centre perforation, belonging to the so called "Chicken hearts", were probably chest protectors for the corpse.

No. 2389 and 2492 are figures of the Female Fairy, the Ho-Hsien-Ku, the former carrying a lotus flower the latter having a bird (phoenix) at her side.

No. 2382 belongs probably to the Huan class already remarked upon in table No. 7, while the wither's head No. 2489 was according to it's inscription, a "State Jewel of the Han dynasty".

The two small pin-shaped specimens are hair ornaments.

Plate No. 58 illustrates some additional forms of spearheads viz. Nos. 2466 and 2444, belonging to the section of insignia of rank and authority already dealt with on plate 56.

No. 2436 — styled here "a black dog halberd", "given as an imperial present", is a very curious object no reference having been found so far, for its peculiar designation as "black dog".

Figures Nos. 2422 and 2465 two carved Hydras, the latter in fish shape are undoubtedly resonant stones and have been used as such.

Next follows another specimen of the "Yin-Kai" (womb protector), the remaining objects, consisting of variously shaped Fungi, or "Mushrooms of longevity". The two smaller ones, are unquestionably – suspension ornaments, whereas the two larger ones must have been presentation Ju-i, expressing the good wishes of the donors.

Plate No. 59 contains amongst others, several unidentified articles, possibly all intended as presentation offerings, like No. 2448, the human head, Nos. 2429 or 2428, quite evident is that intention in No. 2428, where the inscription wishes "10,000 per cent, on the original capital", - an offering presumably made to a merchant.

No. 2443, designed probably as a mirror, had the ornamentation added at a later date.

No. 2374 is a tiger-head tablet and belongs to the category of Door-plates, already mentioned in the remarks on plates Nos. 38 and 54.

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Nos. 2378, a and b are identified by the Chinese as "Hand rings", to be placed into the hands of the dead. On plate No. 60 appear some more resonant stones. — No. 2366 in the shape of a bat with spread wings; Nos. 2361, 2358 and 2334 are seemingly beard preservers.

No. 2447 claims to be, as the inscription says, a mirror, made to resemble the magical mirror of Yün-Chung-Tzu.

No. 2367 is a suspension ornament or girdle pendant and No. 2475 a spatula with a later added inscription.

Both Nos. 2499 and 2353 are attributes of two of the eight Immortals, standing here as their personification, namely the bamboo tube for "Tsao-Kuo-Chiu", the gourd and staff as prerogatives of Tieh-Kuei-Li.

Plate No. 61 exhibits a small array of musical instruments of various shapes and denominations.

No. 2560 is probably a beard preserver while the two discs Nos. 2553 a and b are very likely, knee preservers, both being slightly hollowed out on the reverses.

Nos. 2557 and 2561 are presumably only other forms of the tablets shown on plates 35, 37 and 54 or on the following plate No. 62. All these have that peculiar toothlike projection, the two illustrated here, bearing besides a curious inscription saying, that after the decapitation of the rebel Wang Mang, "the Han country was extinguished".

With regard to these implements, it must be noted that they very likely were symbols of Imperial authority to punish or even to execute and may have been the forerunners of the large, wooden sword painted with two dragons, which was always stuck into the ground at the place of an execution, during the Manchu reign, as Imperial authority, the official in charge kneeling before it and giving by his K'o-Tou, (knocking the forehead on the ground) the sign for the executioner to strike.

Plate 62 has various facsimiles of old coins both of round an square shapes No. 2519 with four curious projections.

Two more mirrors, Nos. 2580 and 2549 with later carved inscriptions, follow next, succeeded by No. 2554, presumably a spearhead, from a set of insignia of rank.

Further additions to these Insignia (I-chang) are given on the following plate No. 63 under Nos. 2505 a and 1501.

Nos. 2513, a and b and also Nos. 2510, a and b are meant as side ornaments for the back of an ancient official hat. Both objects Nos. 2526 and 2522, the Chinese report as preservers of the posterior, while, No. 2532 a and b, of which both sides are shewn, are supposed to have been heelprotectors.

On the last plate No. 64 we find two axes, as insignia of rank, followed by Nos. 2576, a and b, supposed to be knee preservers, like Nos. 2553, a and b on plate 61.

No. 2509 probably intended as a decoration for the back of an official hat, bears the curious inscription: "red gold" on one side and "decoration to be unfurled by an official" on the other.

No. 2581 is according to its inscription a resonant stone, the rest on the plate being probably objects of presentation, with the exception of No. 2574 which is presumably a hand rest when writing.

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
