Jadeite is the only cryptocrystalline precious stone composed of numerous tiny crystals that interlock to a greater or lesser degree, absorbing light so that the stone becomes increasingly opaque as it grows in thickness. The production of the present jadeite hoop - which shows a high degree of translucency while retaining a very desirable thickness of 6.30 millimetres - requires the highest cutting skill. This excellent craftsmanship is observed in the excellent polish and fine lustre. The pendant also displays a vivid emerald green, the imperial colour that possesses an intense saturation and a vivacity that is unrivalled. The distinctive combination of such highlydesirable features, so typical of top-quality Burmese jadeite, renders this jewel important and rare. This supreme material is further represented by its form, a flattened disc with a hole in the centre, referred to as bi, 璧. In ancient Chinese cosmology, the bi mirrored the rounded arch of the sky across which the sun moved and the stars revolved. This outline also recalled the ancient Chinese pictograph for the sun, a circle with a dot within. The circle thus symbolised ultimate completeness and wholeness. Ownership of this jadeite pendant disc would define a taste not only for the ideal and pure, but for the highest perfection.







GLOWING RED

Named from the Latin word for its hue, *nubens*, meaning red, the gemstone ruby epitomises the boldest of colours, and has come to represent the values of desire, passion and power. For centuries, the ruby has been regarded as one of the most valuable gemstones. In ancient Sanskrit, the ruby is called 'Ratnaraj' or 'King of Precious Stones.' In the eleventh century, the Persian sage al-Biruni was only conveying the popular wisdom of the time when he wrote that the ruby has "the first place in colour, beauty and rank" among all gems.

The source of the world's finest rubies is Burma or present-day Myanmar, whose pure-red rubies are regarded as precious treasure. 












THE BELLE ÉPOQUE (1895-1914)

The Belle Époque was a long period of peace and prosperity that began at the close of the nineteenth-century until the declaration of World War I in 1914. This 'Beautiful Era,' dedicated to delicate femininity celebrated the most gracious and opulent living. Distinguished by an elegance and refinement that revived the French court splendour of Louis XVI and Queen Marie Antoinette, the age of the Belle Époque flowered the most romantic and lavish jewels, fittingly named the 'Garland Style' by the late Hans Nadelhoffer, author of Cartier: Jewelers Extraordinary (1984). Drawing inspiration from eighteenth-century pattern books and the decorative arts, the jewellers of that age also took to the streets of Paris for their architectural detail. From these sources, the Belle Époque jeweller's vocabulary was derived: of flower baskets and trelliswork, of bow knots and ribbons, of tassels and wheat ears, of palmettes and honeysuckle, and neoclassical festoons of laurels - all contained within well-defined symmetrical shapes. During this period, the increasing use of finely milled platinum that was strong and malleable, was successfully adapted to these lace-like designs while carrying the weight of many stones. And when seen under the blaze of gas and electric lighting, the platinum jewellery appeared glittering white.

The great jewellery houses blossomed during the era of the Belle Époque, with Cartier at the forefront. Lot 3106 is a flowerbasket pendant filled with diamond flowers and leaves, and represents a beautiful and evocative example of the period - such lyrical motifs recalling the grandeur of Versailles. Signed Cartier, this jewel of abundant foliage is well-enclosed within a circular disc like a medallion, a design that was considered novel and smart for the period. Cartier demonstrates a mastery of the use of platinum with the saw piercing of the finely-worked basket, the knife-edge triple wire border, and the threads of invisible wire between the motifs, so as to obtain an effect of grace and charm. With this pendant, Cartier also shows that the beauty of a jewel does not depend on the use of large gemstones but that the sparkle of smaller diamonds can be equally effective in a combination of good design and fine craftsmanship. Set with old European-cut diamonds of small tables and large culets, this elegant piece displays a soft radiance. The mille-grain setting, where the metal surface was punctured into tiny beads that caught light, ensures that not only the diamonds but the metal shimmers and glows, so increasing the hard refractive brilliance of the white stones. In good condition, the jewel's beauty is reminiscent of a refined age and style, its execution a testament to Cartier's brilliant skill and artistry.

An important detail that greatly nurtured the development of Belle Époque jewellery-making is the role of the coutouriers who created the wardrobe of the time. The silhouette of fashion, that was curved and hourglass in shape showed a distinctive serpentine 'S' that characterised the fin de siècle lady of society. The tightly corseted figure displayed a bosom thrust forward, round hips thrown back and trim waist. Dresses were made with 'leg of mutton' full sleeves and long trailing skirts. Foaming lace, organza and pale chiffons replaced cut velvets, satins and brocade. The languid lady of fashion rustled in silks of the palest hues of white and oyster, of eau de nil and lavender – all hand-stitched and lavishly embroidered. Jewellery was designed to complement these soft pastel fashions. Lot 3105 is a lovely pendent necklace set with 32 jelly opals that show phenomenal play-of-colour. Many artist-

jewellers working at the turn of the century, was attracted to atypical stones which featured uncommon colours or had unusual colouristic properties. The gemstone opal, known for its wide colour range – each bearing individual and particular properties – had the most enduring appeal. Opals display remarkable changing rainbow hues and sparkles that came as close as natural stones could to the shimmering iridescence similar to the favrile glass Tiffany popularised in the 1890s. The whole treatment of the necklace that includes the brilliant green of demantoid garnets and white diamonds is meant to accentuate the natural beauty and lustre of the opals. The entire ensemble is one of artistic grace and delicacy, complementing contemporary dresses.

Life at the height of the Belle Époque consisted of rounds of glittering balls. The wives and daughters of the old and new rich upper classes enjoyed lives of leisure filled with receptions, evenings at the opera, theatre and ballet, café-concerts and cabarets, as well as bridge and card parties. These endless social engagements required the best of the period's fashions and jewellery to match. The desire for display was such that jewels were now paraded at all hours, instead of being reserved for evening wear as in previous eras. Rising late after the parties of the night before, the lady of fashion would devote a large part of her day to her appearance. This included changing clothes several times, lengthy sessions with the lady's maid, fittings with the dressmaker or tailor, and an integral part of the routine - a visit to the jeweller. Indeed, for the society lady for whom dressing well was an art and an accomplishment, the elegant formality of social life necessitated a collection of statement jewels. In Discretions and Indiscretions (1932), Lady Duff Gordon, a leading fashion designer in the late nineteenth and early twentiethcenturies, remembered: "Women wore a great deal of jewellery and what would now be thought ostentatious was then thought merely fitting for the wearer's social position." Jewels designed for evening wear were no more than simple rows of diamonds. Lot 3108, an exquisite platinum diamond rivière serves as an excellent example. As in that luxurious age, rings provided the finishing touch to the Belle Époque lady's well thought out appearance, giving emphasis to her words and gestures. Lot 3109, a Kashmir sapphire and diamond ring is a superb jewel that epitomised the ideal of the era's gracious lifestyle

Today, very few jewellery from the Belle Époque has survived. The following jewels are thus rare examples representing the finest of that great age, where the design and make of jewellery, together with the style of wearing them, reached a pinnacle of beauty and excellence, that has never been equalled.
















RIVER OF LIGHT

This is a splendid diamond rivière necklace and represents a wonderful example of jewellery from the Belle Époque. The simple yet elegant setting is designed to display all 30 diamonds, set into individual collets, to their greatest effect without any distraction. As diamond cutting progressed with increasing sophistication at the turn of the twentieth-century, the brilliant-cut diamond achieved greater and better sparkle, releasing more light and fire than ever before. The row of diamonds in the present necklace comprises stones of just such refractive quality. Important for their sizes, each round diamond is filled with brightness and luminosity, reflecting a thousand tinted rays. The use of smaller stones to space and complement the larger diamonds provides the necklace with dimension and depth, adding to the jewel's glittering allure. Delicate yet strong, the necklace has been executed with great lightness and virtuosity, the platinum mounting wrought so fine so as to appear almost indiscernible, and the diamonds themselves seem to be held in place by magic. A jewel of such magnitude and graceful proportions could only have been created by the uncompromising, gifted jewellers of that era. Only the highest crafting-skills could have produced the right amount of flexibility that allows for subtle movement and comfortable fit – qualities that bespeak the 'feel' of a period jewel.

The diamond rivière possesses a regal grandeur, its beauty of form conceived for no other purpose but lavish adornment. Most were made for the upper classes of society or members of royalty. Four such jewels formed part of the Romanov treasure. In England, Queen Victoria wore a diamond rivière, assembled from other jewels, for her portrait by Winterhalter, the very same necklace later used by Queen Elizabeth at her Coronation in 1953. Tiffany's diamond display at the 1876 Philadelphia Centennial included a ravishing rivière necklace that dazzled all who came to see the exhibition. By the 1900s, diamond jewellery flourished with the new and abundant supply of stones arriving from the mines of South Africa. While once the prerogative of nobility and those at the very top of society, this large output made diamonds readily available, and catered to the burgeoning taste and capacity for opulent consumption. All who could afford to, bedecked themselves in white, with a diamond rivière – a resplendent river of light – encircling the throat. The present necklace is thus a classic jewel and heir to the great tradition of rivières, its shimmering beauty recalling all the refinement and elegance of the Belle Époque.

ARISTOCRATIC BLUE

"Gems in their appeal are like stars. They enchant the eye, they stir the imagination." H B Bridgman, 1916

Located high in the Himalayas, the mines of Kashmir are the source of the world's finest and most sought-after sapphires. Lying at an elevation of approximately 4,500 metres, they are located in the small Kudi (rock) Valley, near the hamlet of Sumjam, in the Padar region of Kashmir. Discovered in 1881 from the chance occurrence of a landslide, the sapphires from this area were immediately identified as gemstones of superior quality. Their mines, however, were exhausted by the early decades of the twentieth-century, making these sapphires exceedingly rare. But their foremost value has to be their colour. Kashmir sapphires are renowned for its aristocratic blue, often referred to as 'cornflower' blue. This highly-esteemed colour is also valued for its velvety appearance that results from the stone's typical silk inclusions. These appear as a "mass of slender, capillary-like rutile fragments" which lend a softer hue, tempering the sapphire's colder blue characteristics. Set into the present ring is an exemplary specimen of the fabled Kashmir sapphire. Featuring a finely-proportioned cut, the 9.23-carat stone displays a distinctive Kashmir blue, a sumptuous and unrivalled depth of colour that is maintained in both natural and artificial light.

This elegant vivid blue is further heightened by an icy white 'D Internally Flawless' diamond of 5.25 carats, that has been mounted next to it. Classified as Type IIa, the diamond is a chemically pure type of diamond that is completely free of

nitrogen (the trace element that gives diamonds a yellow tint). This exceptional material, which exhibits a rare diaphanous quality, successfully sets off the full-bodied hue of the magical Kashmir blue. With rounded corners, a high crown and a characteristically large culet, the cushion-shaped diamond recalls all the charms of its time, its romantic values the modern brilliant-cut diamond could never attain. During the Belle Époque, rich women began wearing important rings such as this example at all hours of the day and night. However, few would have possessed a ring of such measure, set with an exquisite Kashmir sapphire and a sparkling white diamond. Rare for their size and quality, both stones were considered so beautiful in themselves that they did not require a more elaborate setting. The present ring remains a jewel of unsurpassed beauty and incomparable value.

The great reputation of the Kashmir sapphire was reflected in a contemporary French novelette, *Gigi*, set in Paris. Following advice from Louis Cartier, the author - Colette, who loved jewellery, included a passage in which an older woman warns her young niece never to buy a sapphire except for one "from Kashmir."

Diamonds of this type and size, exhibiting a superior quality, are very rare. Such diamonds have been unearthed from only a limited number of sources around the world (e.g. South Africa, Brazil and India)



Diamonds are classified into two main types: Type I and Type II, based on the presence or absence of nitrogen. Type II diamonds are lacking in detectable nitrogen and they are subdivided into two groups – IIa and IIb – both of which are rare. Of significance, are Type IIa diamonds, which are the most chemically pure form of diamond and show exceptional optical transparency. They have a perfect internal crystal structure and tend to form large crystals, usually of exceptional limpidity and without any trace of colour. The pair of 16.11 and 16.08-carat round diamonds have all been determined as Type IIa. Perfectly crystallised, these white diamonds possess a material that is extremely consistent, displaying absolute purity and transparency. Such stones have been likened to the purest waters, for they bear that single rare quality that render a diamond supremely beautiful. Sparkling whiter-than-white diamonds give out "a clear ... radiance which has earned for it the first place among precious stones. It is a combination of icicle and dew drop, sparkling like frost on a cold winter night, and like raindrops caught by the rays of the sun." (H K Forbes, 1924) In beautiful, enduring form, the present diamonds, are each, in itself, a masterpiece and legacy of nature.

Biographies

AUDEMARS PIGUET

Audemars Piguet was founded in 1875 by Jules Audemars and Paul-Edouard Piguet in Le Brassus, Switzerland. Their first a chievement was the creation of the Grande Complication, a pocket watch comprising three complicated mechanisms. They went on to develop the thinnest manual winding and repeating watches ever made, the first skeleton watch and the ultra-thin automatic perpetual calendar watch. Since 1992, Mrs. Jamine Audemars descendant of the Audemars family, is Chair of the Board of Directors. The president of the company is Mr. Georges-Henri Meylan.

BOUCHERON

Frédéric Boucheron opened his first jewellery salon at the Palais Royal in 1858, and soon acquired firme as an expert in precious stones, a masterful technician and a creator of beautiful jewellery. In 1893, he was the first jeweller to set up shop at the Place Vendôme where he continued to serve the social telie, and from where the firm still operates successfully today. Over the years, the Maison Boucheron opened branches in Moscow and London, and also in Japan, the Middle and Far East. Boucheron exhibited in many international expositions including the 1876 Philadelphia Centennial, the 1889 and 1900 Expositions Universelles in Paris, the 1893 World's Colombian Exposition in Chicago and the 1925 Exposition des Arts Décoratifs in Paris. Boucheron was acquired, in May 2000, by the Gucci Group (PPR), one of the world's leading multi-brand luxury goods company.

BULGARI

The firm of Bvlgari was founded by Sotirio Bvlgari, who was born in 1857 in Greece and was a descendant of silversmiths. In 1879, he moved to Rome where he opened his first shop in the Via Sistina and then in 1905, he moved to the Via dei Condotti. Upon Sotirios death in 1932, his sons, fioregio and Costantino took over the business. They are credited with creating the highly distinctive "Bvlgari" style, inspired by Greek and Roman classicism, the Italian Renaissance, and the 19th century Roman school of goldsmiths. The 1970s marked the beginning of Bvlgari's international expansion with the opening of stores in New York (the first overseas), Paris, Geneva, and Monte Carlo, building towards the over 155 stores open today. It was also in this decade that Bvlgari introduced the Bvlgari-Bvlgari which was to become a successful watch classic. Bvlgari Time was established in the early 80s in Neuchâtel, Switzerland for the creation and production of all Bvlgari watch lines. In 1984 the sons of Giorgio, Paolo and Nicola, became respectively Chairman and Vice-Chairman. Their nephew, Francesco Trapani, was nominated Chief Executive Officer.

CARTIER

Cartier was founded in Paris in 1847 by Louis-François Cartier. It was his three grandsons, Louis, Pierre and Jacques, who were responsible for establishing the famous world-wide empire. Louis retained responsibility for the Paris branch, moving it to the rue de la Paix in 1899. Jacques took charge of the London operation and eventually moved to the current location in New Bond Street. Pierre established the New York branch in 1909, moving in 1917 to the current location at 653 Fifth Avenue. Prominent amongst Cartier's gifted team, were Charles Jacqueau who joined Louis Cartier in 1909 for a lifetime and Jeanne Toussaint who was appointed Director of Fine Jewellery from 1933. In the 1960s Cartier New York and Cartier Paris passed into outside hands. In 1972, a group of irwestors led by Joseph Kanoui bought Cartier Paris whose President became Robert Hocq. originator of the concept "Les Must de Cartier" in collaboration with Alain Dominique Perrin. In 1974, Cartier London was bought back and Cartier New York in 1976. In 1983, the "Art of Cartier New York in 1976. In 1983, the "Art of Cartier Collection" was initiated by the late Eric Nussbaum. Today, Cartier is part of the Richemont group.

WALLACE CHAN

Born in 1956, Hong Kong-based artist-jeweller Wallace Chan began his illustrious career as a sculptor, carving ivories, cameos, intaglios and faceting gems. In 1987, he established his own company and made an innovative wenture into the world of jewellery design. Chan is renowned for his sculptural jewels that display highly-developed concepts and ideas. These encompass studies of light and movement, as well as the field of metallurgs. In the latter, Chan's carving and casting of titanium reproduces the natural world, giving rise to bejewelled creatures. His dramatic interpretation breathes life into jewellery, fusing the real with the unreal, creating a fantastical world. Chan has won numerous awards for his achievements. He also lectures and exhibits internationally. His art jewels are highly sought-after by collectors as well as jewellery enthuasiasts, and can be found at selected venues across Europe and Asia.

EDMOND CHIN

Born in Singapore in 1964, Edmond Chin has had a lifetime passion for jewellery. At 16 he began to collect antique Southeast Asian jewellery. In 1991, his research in this area resulted in his appointment as a guest curator at the National Museum of Singapore for an exhibition of his collection entitled Gilding the Phoenix. This entire collection was later donated to the Asian Civilizations Museum in Singapore in 2003. Between 1994 and 2000, Chin worked at Christie's Hong Kong as the Head of the Jewellery and Jadeite department. During this time he was responsible for notable sales such as The Jewels of Tetesa Po-Lau and the record-breaking Doubly Fortunate jadeite bead necklace, which remains the highest price ever achieved at auction for jewellery in Asia. During his time at Christie's, Chin developed a strong interest in the design and manufacture of jewellery. In 2001, he established his own jewellery firm in Hong Kong, Etectera Ltd, which specialises in innovative, custom—made fine jewellery.

WILLIAM GOLDBERG

Legendary William Goldberg began his career as a diamond merchant in New York. In 1973, he opened his own jewely company as a De Beers sightholder. In 1988, he registered the motto The Magic is in the Make, which referred to Goldberg's preference to cutting down gems in order to achieve the perfect cut, where most would fear a loss of weight. TIFFANY & CO.

On September 21, 1837, Charles Lewis Tiffuny and John P.Young opened a stationery and fancy goods store known as Tiffany & Young at 250 Broadway in New York City. Within ten years, jewellery and silver items were added to their stock. By 1853, Mr. Tiffany had assumed complete ownership of the business and the name was changed to Tiffany & Co. During the 19th century, designers such as Edward C Moore and G. Paulding Farnham, as well as renowned gemologist George Frederick Kunz, propelled Tiffany & Co. to the forefront of the international jewellery world. Beginning in 1907, the firm manufactured and sold the jewellery designs of Louis Comfort Tiffany son of the founder. Upon taking over the management of Tiffany & Co. in 1955, Walter Hoving invited several talented designers to join the firm. Among them were Jean Schlumberger and Donald Claffin. In 1974, they added Elsa Peretti as an exclusive designer, followed by Paloma Picasso in 1980. In 1979, Avon Products purchased Tiffany & Co. After the management-led buyout of Tiffany in 1984, headed by current chairman William R. Chaney, and a successful public offering of stock in May, 1987, the company has successfully expanded into key domestic and international markets. Today they comprise more than 100 locations.

VAN CLEEF & ARPELS

Founded in 1906 by Alfred Van Cleef and his brothers-in-law Charles and Julien Arpels on the Place Vendôme in Paris, Van Cleef & Arpels is one of the world's most exquisite jewellers. The immediate success of the House prompted the founders to expand to important seaside resorts in France and well as abroad. New York City became the first location in the United States for Van Cleef & Arpels in 1939 and the House has since opened boutiques in five more U.S. cities. Van Cleef & Arpels is renowned for its innovative designs and techniques such as the Mysterious Setting, in which the prongs are hidden undermeath a gemstone. The designs include only the highest quality gemstones and pieces are often interchangeable – brooches can become pendants or hair clips, earrings have detachable drops and bracelets can be linked together to create necklaces. Van Cleef & Arpels is currently part of the Richemont Group.

HARRY WINSTON

At the age of 24, Harry Winston opened his first business in New York City, known as the Premier Diamond Company, Twelve years later, he established another company under his own name and began to manufacture jewellery. Winston was responsible for the cutting of such famous diamonds as the Jonker, the Taylor-Burton, the Star of Sierra Leone, and the Vargas. He donated three important diamonds to the Smithsonian: The Hope, the Portugese and the Oppenheimer. By the 1950s, Winston was acknowledged as the "King of Diamonds", owning at one time or another as many as one-third of all the famous diamonds in the world. In 1962 the company moved from 7 East Fifty-first Street to its present location at 718 Fifth Avenue. With his death in 1978, Winston was succeeded by his son, Ronald, now the chairman of the company, who continues his father's tradition of offering "Rare Jewels of the World", the firm's motto for many years. In an effort to address an ever expanding market for their jewellery, the firm opened a slot in Tokyo in 1889 and one on Rodeo Drive in Bewerly Hills the following year. They also created a watch department "The Ultimate Timepiece".
