
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The Jungle in My Room

When I was growing up, Saturday mornings were paradise. As soon as I got my 25¢ allowance, I'd jump on my bike and head for the local drugstore. I had just two things on my mind: a Big Hunk candy bar and a Tarzan comic book.

If Tarzan wasn't available, I only had one backup choice: Turok, Son of Stone. Turok was about a couple of Indian braves trapped in this prehistoric valley, and they were constantly fighting off dinosaurs with their poison arrows. (Worked for me.)

That was it: Tarsan or Turok. (Candy bar-wise, I was more flexible.) Everything else was just taking up valuable shelf space. I mean, what was the deal with Archie? Give me a break! I never could figure out who could get their heart racing when they read about Archie and Jughead getting into "hot water" at Riverdale High School and—Oh, my God!—being sent to Mr. Weatherbee's office. (Alchough, I admit, Betty was sort of cute.)

There was this one issue of Tarzan that had a great impact on me—even more than the one where he battled the crocodile men. (That was pretty exciting, though: Archie, for the record, would have gotten his ass kicked by the crocodile men.) The Tarzan issue that I coveted was this one that had a dictionary in the back containing the entire wearbulary of the great apes!

This was a gold mine. Edgar Rice Burroughs, for those of you who haven't read the books, had created an actual language for the great apes. If you really wanted to be "inside" this world when you read about Tarzan's various adventures, you had to know Ape. Oddly enough, the apes themselves always mixed a little English in with their own language, but I never thought about that a whole lot.

I memorized that entire dictionary. (Well, it was only one or two pages long; they were apex, you know.) But today there are just a few words I still recall, especially kreegah and bundolo. English translation: "beware" and "kill," respectively. Kreegah and bundolo seemed to come up a lot in the jungle.

Note: Tarzan, for the record, never uttered "cowabunga" or "oongowa." They're Hollywood inventions, as far as I know. And the same goes for "Cheetah." Tarzan never had a sidekick chimpanzee named Cheetah. Sheetah, on the other hand, was the Ape word for leopard. So, theoretically, if a leopand ever got inside his treehouse, Tarzan might say something like, "Jane! Kreegah! ... Sheetah! ... Tarzan bundolo!" Now you're talking Ape.

However, if there was ever a reason to cry "foul" on the subject of Tarzan, it was what the movie makers did to his famous Tarzan yell. What in the hell was that? Were we all supposed to recoil in fear at the sound of someone yodeling in a tree! Even as a little kid, I never could believe that someone

had done that to Tarzan's "victory cry," a sound that Burroughs described as "shrill and horrible ... an awful cry ... a roaring shriek ... fearsome ... blood-curdling ... inhuman." He did not say "a sort of yodeling sound ... like someone being goosed while singing. ..."

But my growing interest in Nature began to conflict with my zeal for Tarzan. I remember being especially troubled by the countless varieties of tropical insects and parasites he would have been exposed to. Raised by apes, maybe, but still basically a half-naked Brit. And Tarzan, equipped with two standard-issue opposable thumbs, was described as being able to "fly" through the forest canopy like a monkey. This was getting tough to take, but I was still hanging in there. (As Judy Tenuta might say, "It could happen.")

And then there was this: Where did Tarzan get his hair cut? And his shave? Did you ever see any image of him with a beard? It seems to me, if you were (1) raised by apes, and (2) lived in the jungle, you'd sort of look like this:

My final problem, which perhaps made me have to part ways with The Lord of the Jungle, was this: What kind of appes did Tarran ger raised by? Mr. Burroughs never comes right out and says "chimpanzees"—he just says "apes." Their physical description is something more akin to a gorilla, but they weren't gorillas, because the author

distinguishes them from Tarzan's apes. In Africa, ape-wise, there's nothing left. (Yes, I know about bonobos; he wasn't Tarzan of the bonobos.) So he was Tarzan of what apes? This has driven me crazy all my life. (I had to share.)

I have no clear idea why I've written this essay on the subject of Tarzan. (You may be wondering the same thing.) I guess this ape-man has been such a frequent subject of mine, and such an enduring, pop-cultural icon, that I just had to go back. In particular, I recognize today, the artistic style of those comic books had an influence on the way I drew vines, ferns, trees, lions, buffaloes, spears, huts, and a lot of other jungle "stuff"—especially gorillas. The eyes of gorillas were almost never revealed in those early comics; they were only implied by the dark shadow created from an overhanging browridge. I loved that. I stole that.

Still, Tarzan was a great yarn for a kid like me, who could spend hours in his room and yet be somewhere far, far away. I suppose if I had built more model airplanes and cars. I would be a little more mechanically inclined than I am today. Edgar Rice Burroughs, however, stoked my imagination. His ape-man creation fed my interests in wild animals, Africa, and Nature as a whole—even if Tarzan eventually posed a few problems in logic for me.

The thing is, Gladys Wetch was our favorite baby-sitter.

And then one day something happened. I think my mom somehow found out about Mrs. Wetch and the things she was telling us, and I believe she and my mom must have had a "conversation." Anyway, I don't remember Mrs. Wetch coming around anymore. More recently, in writing this little essay, I asked my mom what she remembered about the woman. My mom suddenly seemed a little anxious. "Oh, she told you boys very strange stories! And once she even threatened to throw you both in the fireplace!" There was a pause, and then she quickly added, "But she meant it in a nice way, I'm sure."

I honestly don't remember the fireplace episode. But boy, do I remember those stories,

Yeah, Gladys Wetch was cool. She's passed on, no doubt, but believe me, she still haunts these pages. In a nice way, I'm sure.





The Second-Most Asked Question

Before I get into this, I first must divulge what I, personally, consider to be the single-most penetrating and important question to ask any cartoonist. And no one has ever once asked me this. Get ready: So, [name of cartoonist], tell me—what kind of pen do you use?

Thrilling, isn't it? You can use it, if you wish, the next time you cross paths with someone who draws for a living. But I'm serious—it's the one thing I wondered about when I started out as a cartoniist. I may even ask it now. (Obviously, I never have very long conversations with other extraoriist.)

For me, everything else relates to the creative process, and I have never been able to deconstruct that invisible beast without ultimately being devoured by it.

So, please, let's move on from any exploration of that most-asked question regarding my cartoons, Where do pug get your ideat? Not that I have ever begrudged anyone for asking it. (Hell, I guess no one's going to ask what kind of pen I use.) It's just that it's beyond my own understanding.

The second-place contender is an entirely different question, and one that has always fascinated me because I'm intrigued with why so many people have asked it: How long does it take you to draw a cartoon?

My initial response: Well, which cartoon are we talking about here? Does it involve amoebas or an anthill? A family of stick people or an army of Vikings? A lone vulture soaring overhead or a traffic jam in midtown? Just point the cartoon out to me and I'll scratch my head and come up with some lie.

I've suspected an ulterior motive from some people who ask me this question. I think they want to check to see if I'm really working. In other words, is carrooning a real job! If that's the hidden question, the answer is casy. No—it's not a real job. The guy laying asphalt in mid-July on a Louisiana highway has a real job. And I've had real jobs in my past. This was not one of them. What I did for a living was try to make that guy laying asphalt crack up once in a while so he didn't look around and notice I wasn't out there alongside him.

But I'm working on an additional theory: that this kind of question is an outgrowth of American culture. We just seem to want to quantify everything. How much borsepower does that buly have? ... How much did they soak you for that? ... How much does that sucker weigh? ... How much imme elapton before the female east the male? (Actually, it may not be just an American thing; I once read that some forest dwellers in Brazil distinguish between several kinds of venomous anakes based on the number of steps a bitten person can take before dropping dead. A

hundred-stepper, therefore, is clearly preferred over a ten-stepper, and a one-stepper is apparently just enough time to say, "Ow! ... Hey, was that a one-steppertrirronm? ...")

So (I'm back), how long did it take for me to draw an average cartoon? Honestly, I can't compute that with any real certainty. (See why I like that pen question so much?) First of all, I enjoyed what I did. And when you enjoy doing something, time is a disconnect. Not that you can afford to ignore the clock entirely: if you're a syndicated cartoonist under contract, you have deadlines. Mine were weekly, and the lag time between the time I submitted something and when it showed up in a newspaper was about three weeks. But I'll never complain about deadlines to that guy laying asphalt. I would lose that whining context.

There's also a critical part of the equation that has nothing to do with the physical execution of the carnoon, and that's the time invested in just sitting, staring, and thinking. And it's difficult to know if you're not, in truth, just doing the first two. (Sometimes I think it wouldn't have been a bad thing if a Lou Grant-type person burst into my office once in a while and said, "Larson! Draw!")

Finally, on to the "Looks Are Deceiving" category, and for that I've included an example, "Houdini's final undoing," I remember all too well my long

day in hell with this cartoon.

A simple concept, really: Houdini has apparently met his match in a pair of Chinese handcuffs, with tragic results for the famous escape artist. Now, if you will, please pretend that you are the Cartoon Coroner and take a closer look at the "deceased." What we have here is a decomposed body, with the main focus on the head. If it's too gruesome, it doesn't work.



If it's too corny, it doesn't work. The expression on that face has to simultaneously capture silliness and scariness, horror and hilatiny, sadness and stupidity. For me, this meant draw, erase, draw, erase, draw, erase. for hours. I couldn't get it, although I think in the end I got sort of close. (I now see that the head should have been tilted forward just a little, dammit, I fir hadn't been for my deadline, I might be sitting there to this very day, doomed to draw Houdini's skull for the rest of my life until I, too, am discovered one day looking much like this very drawing, only perhaps funnier.

How long does it take for me to draw a cartoon? Let it go. Ask me what kind of pen I use.

I certainly never brew ahead of time that virtually no one would "get" a particular cartoon of mine, but if I had known, would it have killed my desire to draw it? Hard to say. One person getting it? That's tough. Two persons? I'm in.

On the other hand, I never got bogged down thinking too much about what was going on "out there." Really, a cartoonist is largely blind to reader reaction. This is the big wall that separates us from our distant and hairer cousin, the stand-up comedian. (I actually don't know if the "hairier" part is true: I'm guessing.)

Compare and contrast these two branches of the humoroid tree. For starters, we cartoonists are in ignorant bliss when we "bomb." We don't see the frozen faces or hear the collective groans or the universal "HUH?" that our little opus generated. For a comedian, however, bombing is a very public, very humiliating experience. I prefer ignorant bliss.

But the enviable side of this same coin is that comedians, perhaps at the price of such humilating moments, are always learning from experience, throwing our jokes that didn't work, fine-tuning the ones that do. Small audiences become testing grounds for bigger audiences, and the comedians in turn are undoubtedly being shaped by the experience.

Cartoonists learn nothing from experience. There is no experience, really. At least none gained from "audience interaction." There is no audience. There's just an editor. And you, of course. There you are, probably sitting by yourself much like you are at this moment, reading your local newspaper or some other cartoon-accessorized publication. Maybe you're at home, sitting at the kitchen table, or on a bus, or in a diner, or on a park bench, or in a wairing room, or a prison cell. (I'm not joking; over my career, I've gotten more than a few fan letters from inmates, which won't surprise my derractors.)

In essence, I like to imagine you're as alone reading one of my cartoons as I was when I drew it. It's the only way I could bear it, I think. No "audience"—just you. Alone, Like me. (Now we're all depressed.)

If cartoonists do improve as the months and years go by, it's only because we're evolving from within, exploring ourselves, our characters. (There's editorial feedback, of course, but mostly at the beginning, after you've moved from your learner's permit to your license, editors make friendly, calm suggestions as you head down the road. It's only once in a while that they will actually scream and lunge for the wheel.) And there's one other evolution: We simply draw better

with time. My first cow would have made a bad cave painting; my last cow was up there with the best Neanderthal artist you could throw at me.

Actually. I think cartoonists have more in common with writers than we do with comedians. The following writer-cartoonist parallels come to mind: loners, quiet room, favorite chair, hand puppet (just me?), and our trusty writing/drawing tools. But there is also one huge difference: If are blow it, we lose a day. If a writer blows it, he or she loses, what—a year? Two years? Personally, I prefer a job where I might screw up my day, not my year. (I envision most writers finally finishing a body of work, shipping it off to their publisher, and then going out that evening to a five-star restaurant and having a great meal and a bottle of vintage wine; cartoonists finish a body of work, ship it off to their publisher, and fix themselves a really big bowl of their favorite cereal. It all equates.)

So how does a confusing cartoon even come into being? It's easy. Since I'm 'audience free,' I Just go where my mind takes me. Then my editor sees it, says to himself, 'Oh, well—I've seen him do stranger things,' and off it goes to your local newspaper, where you finally see it and go, "Huh?" Meanwhile, I'm back home having cereal.

For show 'n' tell, I've found a cartoon (oh, the choices) of what, in hindsight, I concede was just a little too cumbersome and obtuse. (Of course, the King of

My Cartoons That Confused Everybody was one entitled "Cow tools" [Vol. 1, p. 251], but I've discussed that in a previous book and prefer not to once again relive my day in hell when that little gem was published.)

Let me be the first to acknowledge that even if you were to understand this thing, it's not exactly going to send you into gales of laughter. (Let's just call it "quiet humor." okay?) Here's the cartoon decoded: If you've managed to escape some disastrous event at sea, and then found safety on a small rock island, you would be well-advised to note where the various crustaceans and mollusks are making their little homes. Because "home" to those creatures is anywhere that is comfortably below high tide. (It knew I was in trouble when


a marine biologist friend called me and asked me to explain this one.)

Even now, years after my retirement. I'm reminded of my reputation as The Great Confuser. One afternoon not long ago, a repair guy was at our house, trying to fix a problem with our electrical system. He tracked me down in the kitchen and started to explain to me in technical Jargon what was wrong. I didn't have a clue what he was talking about, and at the end of his discourse I just looked at him and said. "Sorry, I'm confused." I didn't think he knew anything about me, but he suddenly narrowed his eyes and replied in an even tone, "Just consider it parback."

Fair enough.

The Minefields of Mirth

Having started this essay several times, I realize this subject could easily have required a third volume for this collection, which is already approaching critical mass. But maybe I can touch on just a few examples of how, in my experience, the simple formula:

drawing (d) + words (w) = cartoon (c) can turn into: d + w = π in my face.

First, there is the offensive variable: Inadvertently offending people (speaking for myself, I swear it was always inadvertent, although I admit to sometimes holding my breath when certain cartoons went "out the door") and reading their angry letters is a tough experience when you're first starting out young and enthusiastic, with visions of sugar cows in your head. Sometime after you receive your second or third "How DARE you!" letter, it begins to dawn on you that your own mother may not be the best gauge of how the rest of the world will always respond to you.

But eventually you learn the Big Truth: There's no avoiding this variable. You learn pretty fast in the humor business that offending some people is simply inevitable. (Unless I'm mistaken, even Dean Martin sang. "Everybody offends somebody sometime.") I suppose you could step around this particular land mine by drawing a strip like Nancy, although I'd be willing to bet that in his lifetime even Ernie Bushmiller got a letter or two suggesting that Sluggo was fostering some "social cancer."

How easy is it to offend someone? Try this: I once knew someone who expressed indignation over the cartoonist's universal symbol for cursing. You know, the "&t"#@\\$#\\$" you sometimes see when, say, a character hits his thumb with a hammer? Maybe just a simple "#@!" would have been okay with this person, but a full, in-your-face "&t"#@t\\$#\" was apparently too much to handle. For the record, I don't believe I ever said "&t"#@\\$#\" in any of my cartoons, except once when I made fun of the device.

Some land mines you unwittingly plant yourself, without a clue in the world of what you're doing. For example, the word "boink."

Warning to other cartoonists: Do not use "boink" as a sound effect for something smacking into something else. I didn't know this. I used it more than once. "Boink," as it turns out, can be considered a verb, (Especially by the Brits, who first brought the boink issue to my attention.) And as a verb, "boink" is a bad thing to say. Unless, of course, you meant to say "boink," Then I suppose "boink" is a beautiful thing, if perhaps not the most romantic way of expressing the thing that "boink" means, as a verb, you see. Whatever, Let's drop it.

Then there are the small, factual details that I sometimes overlooked. I suppose these are more equivalent to stumbling in a carroon rather than actually falling, but frankly it used to bug the hell out of me when I did it. Case in points Cassius Marcellus Coolidge.

It was a dark and stormy night. I was working on a cartoon based on that too use-for-being-kitschy painting, Dogs Playing Poker (Vol. 2, p. 423). I had to come up with a name for the artist. No use in checking the painting's history, I decided—Dogs Playing Poker is just one of those artifacts of American pop

culture that's always been around, right? It's just Dogs Playing Poker by the standard "artist unknown."

So I came up with the name "Gus Nickerson" for the long-forgotten artist. The actroom gets published, years go by, and one morning I'm having breakfast and reading the New York Timee, and wham—there it is, front page: a human interest story about the life and times of Cassius Marcellus Coolidge, creator of A Friend in Need, the painting's real title, based on the fact that one dog is helping another cheat. Artist known.

Why did (and does) this bug me so much? Because these are the sort of small, arcane insights I enjoy capturing, like getting the right genus name on some insect. It wouldn't matter if only a handful of people would have discovered the cartoon's small "bonus." For me, that's what makes it fun. And in truth, it bugged me for another reason. If you think about it, A Friend in Need is arguably as famous (in this country, at least) as the Mona Lina by what's-his-name, and I just didn't give Mr. Coolidee his proper due.

Then there's "Jimmy" Frankenstein (Vol. 1, p. 228). It jumped into my head that the mad scientist's name was "James Frankenstein." I have no explanation for this error. ("Jim Frankenstein" sounds more plausible as Victor's brother, who perhaps became a mad insurance salesman.)

Now allow me a brief excursion into the world of foreign translations. Here, the wheels can come off a cartoon completely and the whole shebang will plummet off a cliff in an entertaining ball of fire.

The translators usually are fairly successful at taking my sometimes very American cliches and expressions and finding their own native language equivalent. Of course, sometimes there's an impasse. And when a cultural gap opens up, well, that's when the fireball-over-the-cliff thing can happen. From Boot Hill to Eddie Haskell, some subjects just won't cut it in the Le Journal Officiel de la Republique Fannacis.

Consider a carroon I did on the subject of Babe the Blue Ox. (Vol. 1, p. 175). My German editors, naturally, had never heard of Paul Bunyan and his colorful sidekick. They took "blue" to mean "depressed." So in the German interpretation, hunters have mistaken the fabled animal for a big, "depressed" mule deer.

I'll simply show two other suggested translations below. These also are German, but I hasten to add that this problem wasn't unique to the Germans; I just liked these examples.

- ... the time a foreign publisher took my first book cover, which looked like this:




and made it look like this:

Final Thoughts

There's a little cartoon—a doodle, really—that I came across in one of my old sketchbooks while working on this two-volume, 18-pound hernia giver. And despite the fact that I believe there's a rule somewhere that you're not supposed to laugh at your own work, this one caught me off guard. I confess: I laughed.

What I was looking at was a tavern scene where the customers and staff are all praying mantises. One mantis dressed in a rumpled coar and tie is sitting by himself at the bar, clutching a stiff drink. He has no head. And, with a voice that emanates from somewhere down below his empty collar, he angrily blurts out just one word to the mantis bartender: "Women!"

It's a carroon that never got further than my sketchbook, and I'm not sure why. I admit, you would have to know something about the sex lives of mantises to recognize the thin slice of natural history buried in among all the other anthropomorphic silliness, but I doubt that would have stayed my hand. I do see a note to myself on the same page questioning whether this male mantis would most likely blurt out "Women!" or "Females!" and I bet that was my undoing. These sorts of decisions usually started off as minor details, grew in significance, and finally sent me into the Don't-Draw-This Abyas. (Actually, I could have just referred to Cartoon Rule #359), which clearly states that "... anything walking around with a missing head shall be deemed funny, with the exception of a puppy or the Pope.")

On another page. I found my half-doodled, half-described idea of a nightclub filled with assorted invertebrates. The dance floor is packed with creatures, all having a good time (I like the imagery already, complete with disco ball), but at a table in the foreground sits a slug couple, dressed to the nines, looking hip, but—as always—compelled to wait for a slow song.

And then I stumbled upon my crude little skerch of the astrophysicists' convention. The scene is an auditorium, and everyone is seated as one of the guest speakers begins his presentation. Only there's apparently been a mistake. The speaker is a farmer, in overalls and brim hat, and he is giving a talk on String Bean Theory.

I'll stop there, but this is just a way of divulging the one thing that haunts me now. Not every day, and sometimes not for weeks, but sooner of later it creeps into my brain, stays a while, and leaves a lingering sadness after it's gone. It is this: What else didn't I draw? What other ideas and characters are doomed to remain everlastingly in my inkwell, never to have The Far Side marquee hoisted over their heads, left to wander forever in the Land of the Undrawn?

C'est la vie, I suppose. If you were to ask me today if I miss cartooning (and I do hear it a lot), my answer is no, not really. As they say, been there done that. Plus, for me, there was always the unforescen nature of this

thing, which no doubt made it easier to eventually let it go. (When Career Day comes to your high school, you don't walk around looking for the Cartoon Guy.)

Do I think I might return to the drafting table one day? Well, they say never say never, so I'll take that advice. If that haunting problem I mentioned becomes more frequent, who knows—maybe I'll need to exorcise some ghosts. (At least I should work up that praying mantis cartoon; damn, I'm sorry I missed that one.)

Serendipity has handed me a way to wrap this up. I'm sitting here writing my final easay for this book, and every few minutes I lift my eyes from the computer monitor and stare out the window overlooking the garden. But I'm not looking at the garden. I'm watching the small spiders that have spun webs between the leaded panes and the brick frame. There are four of them, and they're catching gnats like they know it's the gnat warden's day off.

This is really a show. They're extremely small, these spiders, but the gnats—and they're as thick as, well, gnats—are considerably smaller. There are so many, the spiders arent even bothering to throw a few holding threads around their prey. They're just grabbing and sucking down gnats, one after the other. I can't help but imagine that somewhere within the primitive, ganglionic mass that serves as a spider's brain, these little guys are experiencing a sensation that equates to what my dad, an avid fisherman, feels when a salmon strikes his line: Hot damit Another one!

The parallels are interesting, now that I think about it: My dad's invisible fishing line/the spider's invisible web; my dad's net/the spider's holding threads; my dad sitting alone in his boat, patiently waiting for a strike/the spiders sitting alone in their webs, patiently waiting for the same signal. There's only one conclusion: My dad's really just like a big spider and all these little spiders are really just like my dad. (All we need now is for one of these little gnats to start screaming "Help mel" and this will get really weird.)

I'm telling you this because I'm guessing—or hoping—you may know me a little by now. My mind seems to wander. I started off wisfully describing a few cartoons I wish I had drawn, wondering about the ones yet to be imagined, and what happens?—I get cut off by some little spiders.

Here's where I think I must simply admit the truth: I want to stop writing about cartoons and thinking about cartoons. I just want to watch these little spiders. This is how I started as a cartoonist—drawn to the little story—and this is how I'll end.

And if you run into my dad, please don't squish him.
