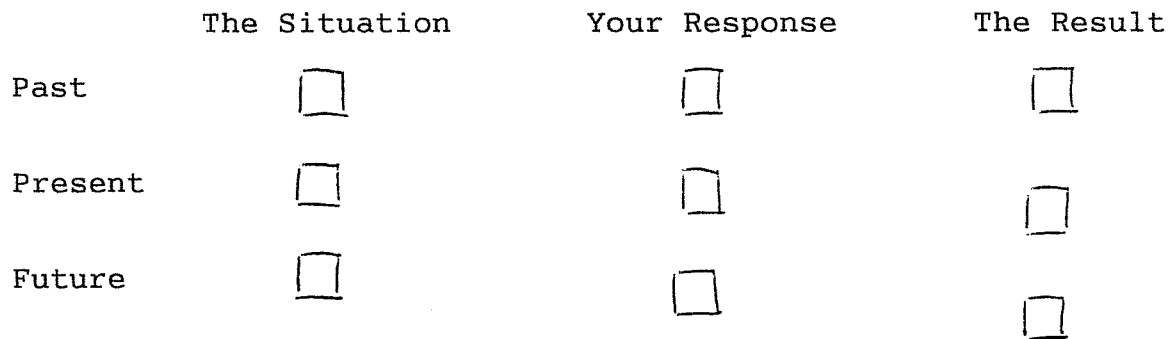

Tarot Patterns --- Past, Present, Future

1. Simple



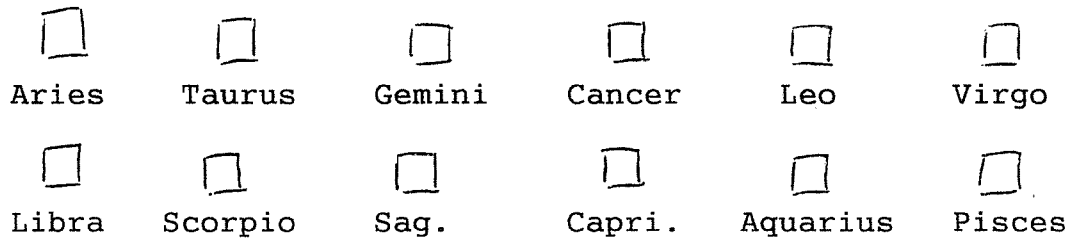
2. More complex



3. Calendrical: the Week Reading



4. Zodiacal



(These cards are normally laid out in a circle, like an astrological chart, but any agreeable pattern will work so long as the correct order of signs is retained.)

5. Three-Ace

Shuffle the cards three times, keeping the question in mind. Starting with the top card of the deck, deal the cards into a pile until you reach an ace or reach thirteen cards. The next card after the ace, or the fourteenth card, begins a new pile to the right of the first. Repeat the process from the first pile. The next card after that ace, or the twenty-seventh card, begins a new pile to the right of the first two. When you reach an ace in this pile, or reach thirteen cards, stop. You should now have the following piles:

Only aces are interpreted; the card or cards on top of the non-ace piles are not read.
